From the President

Another season of tournament archery has come to a close and most of us are out bow hunting. I hope all members have fond memories of shoots past and good luck in the hunting season.

Looking back at the tournament season, the numbers of shooters seems to have dropped off again. This is especially true at state tournaments. There was a very dismal showing of only 41 shooters at the State Closed and only slightly more at the State Open. The numbers were also down at the 3D tournaments. Even local shoots and annuals seem to have had lower numbers of attendees this year. Most clubs do a lot of work to get and keep their ranges in shape for every shoot they hold. There are usually only a few members who do the bulk of the work. I can tell you from experience that it is very disheartening when only a few souls show up to shoot. A state tournament requires a lot more effort and expense to make sure the range is in top shape, as the host club wants to present themselves as best they can. When only a small number of shooters take the time to participate, this can be very disappointing to those who spent so much time and effort preparing for the tournament.

So what can we do to increase the number of shooters? Those clubs who have recently hosted these shoots are at a loss to know what to do about this. We need suggestions from you, the archers. One suggestion that was made at the Closed was to hold the shoots on weekends that are not 3-day holiday weekends. This has been brought up and discussed in the past, but may need to be reexamined. There were many activities planned to be held after the State Closed tournament (novelty shoots, horseshoe tournament, coon shoot) but not enough shooters stayed at the range to participate. What can a hosting club do to attract more shooters? Please let your local clubs and the VBA know your thoughts on this matter.

In closing, I hope everyone has a successful hunting season and I look forward to seeing you on the range next year.

From the NBEF/IBEP Director

On 25 June I had the opportunity to join Mr. Mike Norkus in providing an IBEP course to 13 Hunter Safety Instructors who were attending the Advanced Training Workshop sponsored by the Virginia Department of Game and Inland Fisheries (VDGIF) at Holiday Lake. The following day we were joined by Mr. Ken Sorrels, Master IBEP Instructor, and provided an IBEP Instructor's Training to this same group. As a result, our number of IBEP instructors around the Commonwealth of Virginia continues to grow. More importantly, these new instructors come from areas where bowhunters had little opportunity to take this valuable safety course locally, thus allowing the VDGIF to continue to reach out to bowhunters across Virginia.

During this same workshop, Mr. Sorrels recognized both myself and Mike Norkus as having fulfilled the experience, knowledge and training required to reach the Master Instructor level, and awarded both of us that status. This means that Mike and I now join Ken in being able to conduct training and certify new IBEP instructors, so we can continue growing our numbers and making classes readily accessible for bowhunters across Virginia.

As we move forward down this path, we don't want to lose any of our existing IBEP instructors. We are trying to put together a database of all our instructors, both those that have and those may not have attended the VDGIF Basic Instructor's Course. I would like to ask for help from all of you to identify all active IBEP instructors. If you know of one, please ask them to contact me at my email: rrfoster@verizon.net. I'll get their basic contact information and enter them into our database. I'll also work with those that have not attended the VDGIF Basic Hunter Safety Education Course to get them certified as VDGIF instructors. That will allow them to create classes in the VDGIF on-line Hunter Education web site (http://my.register-ed.com) so their students get entered into the VDGIF database when they successfully complete the IBEP instructor. Finally, this will allow us to assist our member clubs and other groups that are interested in finding an IBEP instructor in their local area to offer an IBEP course. Your help in finding these folks and helping me to reach out to them is greatly appreciated!

Venison Jerky

Wally says this is the best way to use all that extra deer meat you have. Enjoy!

Ingredients:

3 pounds venison, frozen 1 hour, cut into extremely thin strips

1/2 cup Worcestershire sauce

1/2 cup soy sauce

1/4 cup brown sugar

1 teaspoon ground black pepper

1/2 teaspoon cinnamon

Directions:

1) Combine all ingredients in a large plastic bag; mix well and seal. Refrigerate 6 to 8 hours, or overnight.

2) Preheat oven to lowest temperature possible, around 200°F. Remove meat from marinade; drain well. Place strips directly on oven racks. Prop oven door ajar with balled up aluminum foil. Cook until venison strips are sufficiently dried, from 12 to 24 hours.



From the Publicity Director

As the year ends we conclude the 70th Anniversary of the VBA, which has successfully and effectively represented its members and tens of thousands of individuals who have an interest in archery and bowhunting in Virginia. The organization has also effectively represented bowhunting issues to the Virginia Department of Game and Inland Fisheries(VDGIF).

Some of you will ask "What's New for 2012?" That folks is up to you. Only you can answer questions such as: how can we improve on getting more clubs to charter or re-charter with the VBA; how can we increase membership, whether it be within our own club or Associate or Bowhunter memberships; and, how can we increase participation at State Tournament and club shoots. As members, you need to let your county schools, parks and recreational centers, Boy & Girl Scout clubs, neighborhood resources, government facilities and libraries and other organizations know about the VBA, what it has to offer and its educational programs. Invite your community non-profit organizations such as the VFW, Moose, Elks, American Legion, or your county fire & rescue and law enforcement agencies to come out to your club meetings and shoots.

At the September's meeting, Marie Bell, Executive State Secretary, reported for the Third Quarter membership was 1220. This was up by 21 members over 2010 and new membership was up by 3.

Aubrey Self, Field Vice-President, reported that participation at State Tournaments was down from 434 to 342 over last year. Aubrey mentioned that Augusta Archers, Bowhunters of Rockingham, Buggs Island Archers and Walton Park Bowhunters outdoor ranges needed to be inspected by the end of the year and he solicited names of range inspectors from each club. He also mentioned that for the State 3-D Fall, John Hoffman, Jr's record for 2010 was listed incorrectly as SMBHFS/F and that Dallas Hoover will be reinstated with his 2009 record as SMBHFS/R.

Rob Pecora announced the following clubs that will be hosting the VBA State Tournaments for 2012: State Indoor Sectional – Augusta Archers, Belvoir Bowhunters, Kingsboro Bowmen and Sherwood Archers; Spring 3-D Classic is Singers Glen; the State Open is Sherwood Archers; Fall 3-D Classic is Augusta Archers and the State Closed is Two Rivers Archery Club.

This past June Bob Foster, Rick Atchison and I attended the VDGIF Advance Hunter Education Training workshop at the Holiday Lake 4-H Center in Appomattox, VA. While Rick was attending his classes, I was completing my required classes to get my Master. And where was Bob? He was busy teaching archery classes the entire weekend. On Saturday evening, Bob Foster was recognized and designated as Master IBEP Instructor for the Virginia Department of Game and Inland Fisheries by Sgt. David Dodson. The VBA is proud to have one of members and officer to be recognized by the VDGIF. Congratulations Bob!

As a note, these training classes are offered to Hunter Ed & IBEP instructors. Please contact Bob for further information.

Over the past year, I have been involved with a lot of volunteer services for the VDGIF Complimentary Work Force program. CWF folks are always looking for volunteers to help with their Fish for Kids, VOSS, NASP, Virginia State Fair events, permit inspections & issuance, trout stocking, wildlife damage inspections, exhibits, programs, presentations, waterway marker inspections, region office assistance, equipment repair and maintenances research assistance, yearly awards program and much more! I've been doing this for the past five years and would like to see more of you participate in this program. Rick Atchison from BBH is another volunteer who finds time to help out. If you are interested in joining the CWF, go to www.dgif. virginia.gov/volunteer and sign up. Oh, and don't forget to sign-up to receive their bi-weekly "Outdoor Report."

Remember: Since September 1st it has been illegal to feed deer statewide in Virginia through the first Saturday in January.

There have been a few developments in the hunting arena since the last *FLIGHT*. Most notable is that Clint Keller, a member of Two Rivers Archery Club in Front Royal, has agreed to be the Hunting Committee Chairman. This is a terrific plus for the VBA because it fills a key position that has been vacant for a long time and also because it brings such a quality individual to the VBA leadership. Clint has already attended VDGIF meetings in Richmond and has met the leadership of that organization. He also has a great deal of enthusiasm to revitalize the Hunting Committee Chairman position. Please welcome Clint when you see him at meetings or at the ranges.

The second development is VBA participation in the VDGIF-sponsored study to develop a policy related to kill permits. The process to develop a kill permit policy was near its end when this edition of *FLIGHT* went to press. Clint or I (or both) attended all the meetings this summer and were able to express the opinions of bow hunters. The study was commissioned by the State Legislature and the final result will be provided to them for their use next year. The VDGIF will also use the study results to change their operational procedures. Clint will keep you informed and will let you know how you can view a copy of the study when it is completed.

A third development is the untimely illness of Dave Proctor. He underwent an operation this summer and will continue to visit the hospital for follow-up procedures. Dave is a member of the VBA Order of the Golden Feather, a past-editor of *FLIGHT* for nearly 20 years and a long-time advocate of bowhunting in Virginia. He will continue to work at Good Printers and hopefully get into the woods this fall. We will keep him and his family in our prayers.

As a final note, always remember to be safe in the woods. This includes a long list of things to do, but at the top of the list is to check your treestand before each use and always wear (and attach to your tree!) a harness whenever you are off the ground. Among the items not usually considered are to be safe with fires and gas BBQ grills when you camp. Nothing like starting a forest fire to ruin your day.....

AGENDA ITEMS

ITEMS VOTED AT SEPTEMBER MEETING:

1. The VBA should increase the fees for a regular Field/Hunter Shoot to \$10.00 per round.; Effective January 2012.

2. Shooting Styles, Sect. 1, Item 2, pg. 10; An adjustable arrow plate or any part of the arrow rest may not extend over 1/4" above the arrow : [add] with the exception of a full containment rest.; Effective January 2012.

AGENDA ITEM FOR JANUARY MEETING:

1. Shooting Rules, Traditional Style, Sec. 7, Item 6, pg. 11; Allow clickers on Trad. bows as long as it does not attach or is visible through the site window.; Effective January 2012.

Justification:

Shooter can come to a consistant anchor - won't lose as many traditional shooters from these classes because of target panic.

VDGIF FALL MESSAGE

Another September is quickly upon us and it will not be long before the woods are turning to a crisp fall color and the excitement of another hunting season enters our daily thoughts. With every hunting season changes abound in habitat conditions, population levels and to be sure regulations! The Department of Game and Inland Fisheries promulgated regulatory changes last spring that encompasses the next two hunting seasons. Although not all of them have an impact on your upcoming archery hunting experiences a quick rundown of some the changes will be worth looking over as you take up your hunting experiences this season. For all the changes and season and bag limits for the 2011-2012 season please refer to the Hunting and Trapping in Virginia digest or go to <u>www.HuntFishVA.com</u> for more information. Have a great and safe hunting season.

URBAN ARCHERY

• There are now 34 cities, towns, and counties across the Commonwealth that participate in the urban archery season. Only antlerless deer may be taken during this season, which is open September 3-30, 2011 and January 9-March 31, 2012 in localities that have opted in. New participants for the 2011-2012 season include the cities of Hopewell, Lexington, and Suffolk and the counties of Chesterfield and York. All cities and towns in the Commonwealth are eligible to participate, along with every *county* with a human population density of 300 persons per square mile. DEER HUNTING

- The youth deer hunting day on September 24, 2011 is now statewide. The counties of Fairfax, Loudon and Prince William were initially excluded from the one day youth deer hunting day because of the overlap a day of the early anterless–only archery season in those areas. Hunter support for expanding youth hunting opportunities outweighed the concerns some expressed with the blaze orange requirement. Because this is a firearms deer hunting season/day, all hunters (e.g. archery and squirrel) will be required to wear blaze orange unless otherwise exempted.
- All deer killed after the first Saturday in January must be checked by telephone or internet checking systems.
- Language regarding the transportation of processed deer carcass parts has been updated to allow deer hunters to possess unmarked parts of a deer carcass after it has been processed (cutup) provided that they can provide sufficient verbal or written information which establishes legal possession. This will help many hunters who participate in club hunts where meat is often dispersed to individuals and in the past each individual part had to be identified.
- The daily bag limit for deer in Fairfax, Loudoun, and Prince William counties has been made unlimited. Hunters are still restricted to three antlered bucks in a license year. The purpose of this regulation change was to continue to address increasing deer populations beyond the deer objective for these counties.
- The Chronic Wasting Disease (CWD) carcass transportation regulations were changed to apply only to deer carcasses that originate from any area designated by the department as a carcass restriction zone in or adjacent to a state or Canadian province in which CWD has been found in

free ranging or captive cervids. More information on this change and a listing of the identified restricted zones can be found in the Hunting Digest or on line at http://www.dgif.virginia.gov/wildlife/diseases/cwd/

TRACKING AND RECOVERING DEER AND BEAR

• Legislation passed in the 2011 General Assembly provided for the use of tracking dogs to retrieve bear and deer. Tracking dogs maintained and controlled on a lead may be used to find a wounded or dead bear or deer statewide during the archery, muzzleloader, or firearms bear or deer hunting seasons or within 24 hours of the end of such season, provided that those who are involved in the retrieval effort have permission to hunt or to access the land being searched and do not have any weapons in their possession. Archery hunters have requested over the years a regulation or law that would aid in their retrieval of deer that may have traveled a distance or into difficult cover by using a dog. Hunters exercising this privilege need to be mindful of the fact that permission by the landowner must be granted and that no weapons can be in possession.

FALL TURKEY SEASON

There are a number of changes in the fall turkey season, some result in longer fall seasons and others shorten the length of the fall seasons.

- The length of the fall season was adjusted in several counties. The adjustments were made based on the status of turkey populations. The status assessment was based on current turkey population density estimates and long-term population growth rates. The season was extended in a number of counties in eastern Virginia where good population growth rates have created high turkey population densities that can withstand higher fall hunting pressure. On the other side of the state, the season was reduced because of concern for declining population trends and low densities. The cause of low population densities and declining trends in these mid-western counties is unknown, but the Department believes lower fall harvest rates may result in a more rapid recovery of these populations.
- Of particular note, is the addition of two weeks of turkey hunting in January in counties that have the full six week fall season. This season expansion was done with the intent of recruiting and retaining fall turkey hunters. This is a new hunting opportunity that has never been offered to Virginia hunters before. The Department will be monitoring the January harvest, but we believe the harvest will not impact turkey populations.

ELK

• Elk season will be closed in the counties of Buchanan, Dickenson and Wise.

BOWHUNTERS NEEDED FOR SURVEY

• The Department has an ongoing statewide bowhunter survey to obtain information on bear, deer, turkey, small game, and furbearer populations. The Department would like to increase the number and distribution of cooperators across the Commonwealth.

Participants will receive an annual survey form to complete during the early archery deer season and a copy of the results after they are compiled.

TOP TEN NEW HUNTING REGULATIONS AND OPPORTUNITIES FOR 2011-2012

- 1. License fees for hunting and trapping have increased slightly only the second increase in 24 years... License fees for youth, crossbow, archery and muzzleloader did not increase
- 2. **Partially disabled veterans shall pay half of the resident or nonresident hunting license fee,** Veterans must have at least 70 percent service-connected disability
- 3. **Tracking dogs maintained and controlled on a lead may be used to find a wounded or dead bear or deer statewide** during any archery, muzzleloader, or firearm bear or deer hunting season, the retrieval participants must have permission to hunt on or to access the land being searched and cannot have any weapons in their possession.
- 4. **The Special Muzzleloader Season for bears will be a uniform 1- week statewide season.** Firearms Bear Season dates have changed for many areas of the state.
- 5. The Youth Deer Hunting Day will be open statewide September 24, 2011.
- 6. Urban Archery Season has been expanded to include new areas.
- 7. Beginning fall 2011-2012, all deer killed after the first Saturday in January must be checked by the telephone or Internet checking systems.
- 8. Changes in the length of the fall turkey season in many counties- most new seasons are longer, some are shorter. Turkeys killed in the fall *may be checked* using the telephone or Internet.
- **9.** Turkey hunting in January is provided in many counties for the first time. Turkeys killed in January *must be checked* using the telephone or Internet.
- 10. A Facility Use Permit has been established, effective January 1, 2012. Users with a valid hunting, trapping or fishing license, boat registration, 16 years old or younger, or hiking the Appalachian Trail are exempt and will not have to pay the Use Fee. The fee will provide the means by which outdoor enthusiasts who use the VDGIF Wildlife Management Areas and state fishing lakes can contribute, on either a daily or annual basis, to the stewardship, maintenance and management of these facilities and their natural resources.

Crossbows - Should VBA Recognize Them?

Odds are that if you want to start a heated discussion in any of your clubs these days, all you have to say is one word: Crossbows. There are those that are passionate about them in every club and want to allow their use; and also those that are equally passionate about keeping them out. Both sides have legitimate points, so most of the time there never is a clear winner.

This isn't anything new to our sport. At the risk of giving away my age, let me say that compound bows didn't exist when I first took up archery and the sport of bowhunting; and I heard many of the same arguments that I'm hearing with the crossbow controversy today. Compounds were dangerous; they were too powerful for the target butts we were using and shouldn't be permitted on the ranges; they shouldn't be allowed to be used during the regular archery season (which was intended to be for primitive weapons) and would make it too easy to harvest deer, reducing their numbers. Nevertheless, compound bows didn't go away and eventually became accepted (albeit grudgingly). At that time compound bows were only capable of 30% reduction in draw weight, so when archery manufacturers introduced bows with 50% let off, the controversy started again. When manufacturers pushed the envelope to 80% let off, Pope and Young refused to allow animals taken with bows that offered that much let off. We've had arguments about mechanical releases, lighted sight pins, expandable broadheads, and the list goes on. More often than not, when innovation comes to our sport, there are those that love it, those that hate it, and a new round of controversy starts anew.

So now we find ourselves discussing the merits and evils of crossbows. Let me say upfront that I don't own a crossbow; in fact, I've never fired one, so I'm not a zealous advocate. However, it isn't hard for a non-user like me to see that crossbow users are quickly becoming the fastest growing segment of new archers joining our ranks. This fact hasn't been lost on the Virginia Department of Game and Inland Fisheries, who have made crossbows legal equipment for use during archery season. Neither has it been lost on the National Bowhunter Education Foundation, who has added teaching materials for crossbows to the International Bowhunter Education Program so that instructors can add them to the course curriculum. Having lived through many other such controversies in our sport, my assessment is that new innovations like those mentioned above never go away. It may take time, but eventually they do become accepted into our sport and life goes on. So, like them or not, crossbows are here to stay and will continue to grow in popularity and use over the next several years.

This has led the Executive Board to open a dialog with our affiliated clubs - do you want the VBA to lead the way to accepting these new archers into our mist by creating shooting rules and styles for crossbows, so our clubs can welcome them as members? This is certainly within our Constitution, which calls on the VBA to "....foster, expand and perpetuate the use of the bow in hunting all legal game." Moreover, if the VBA doesn't accept this new generation of archers, will our rejection cause them to organize on their own, leading to a Virginia Crossbow Archers Association in the near future? In an era when our numbers are declining, the last thing we need is to alienate fellow archers and drive them from our ranks.

So, have your debates, form your club positions, and send your representative to the January VBA meeting with your club's views. As always, the Executive Board looks forward to using your views to shape your Virginia Bowhunters Association.
