I applaud Jerry Wenzel for undertaking the After School Archery Program (ASAP) in Virginia that is managed by the VBA. This is a great opportunity for folks to get involved in the sport of archery and to further their bowhunting skills. I would like to thank those clubs that have mentioned this program in their newsletter, website and/or have simply spread the word about it. Jerry has received several inquiries about ASAP as a result of folks seeing the article in either the VBA or on the NADA website. As a result of my association with the editors of Woods & Waters, the VDGIF Outdoor Report and the Sportsman Magazine, Jerry's article and photos will be published in a later issue of Virginia Wildlife.

Others that I would like recognize are folks that have offered their time, talents and experiences by volunteering to teach archery (beginning and advanced) and IBEP classes or to talk about archery in the Archery Chapter at Hunter Education classes as well as those who have offered to help the VDGIF with their volunteer programs.

<u>VBA News</u>. Marie Bell's Third Quarter report shows that our overall membership is growing. Membership for that quarter was up by 71 members over 2006 and new membership was up by 85, with a total of 1,166 members. We can only do this with your help, and we thank you!

The VBA March Awards Banquet and meeting on March 15th & 16th will soon be here. Dave Burpee, on behalf of the Bowhunting Committee, has asked for donations, gift cards and certi.cates from clubs, businesses and/or individuals for the banquet. Let's make this awards banquet another great success!

From the Hunting Vice-President

My column in this issue of FLIGHT will update you on three topics previously discussed.

First, the Virginia Department of Game and Inland Fisheries (VDGIF) adopted all the proposed archery-related hunting changes that were put before them at the last meeting. Many of these were very favorable for bowhunters, and we don't want to lose sight of the fact that extended seasons and other positive changes were passed with support from the VBA. This continues our long history of successfully representing bowhunters and their special interests. We also need to be mindful of the fact that we did lose one week of archery season west of the Blue Ridge to the blackpowder season. I urge you to carefully review the hunting regulations and also check the VDGIF web site to stay current on the changes.

I think the trend driving encroachments on the archery season and the imposition of other weapons (Xbow) into the season are driven by the fact that VDGIF revenues are down because the number of hunters is declining. As a result, the VDGIF will do all in its power to raise and conserve funds because as they lose funds they will need to cut back services and may even have to cancel some fishing/hunting seasons or at least support to those activities. The VBA supports a strong and effective VDGIF but does not want to see all improvements and savings come at the expense of the bowhunter.

The VBA has enjoyed much success over the years in working with the VDGIF and we are committed to continued engagement. The VBA has already reached out to individual Commissioners and will pursue an increased proactive strategy that will place VBA proposals on the agenda the next time hunting regulations are reviewed (2009). Some ideas are already in the works, and this will be the focus of the next VBA Hunting Committee meeting in January. Hopefully, all the Club representatives will have ideas we can use to enhance the bowhunting experience in Virginia.

In the meantime, I suggest we all try harder to increase our membership roles. This is obviously good for the VBA clubs because the new members infuse ideas and enthusiasm. Additionally, the increased VBA membership does matter when it comes to representing an organization because it is true that there is strength in numbers.

Second, I want to update you on your response to my request that volunteers step forward to be trained as International Bowhunter Education Program instructors. More instructors are needed so this excellent program can be continued in Virginia. The update won't take long. I had one volunteer. If I could fix this myself by working longer hours or trying harder, I would. But, I'm already maxed out in those areas, and besides, this is one issue where the load needs to be spread throughout the State to be successful. The early returns are dismal. Maybe I'll get lots of volunteers at the next VBA meeting, but I doubt it. If interested, please contact me using the number/address on page two of this FLIGHT. The rationale for why we need volunteers is in my column in the last FLIGHT.

Finally, the use of trail cameras and other devices to locate deer and other big game generated some discussion. The bottom line is that folks think their use is OK until it exceeds the bounds of fair chase. In other words, it's OK to use a camera for scouting but not OK to have the camera take a picture and e-mail it instantly to you so you can be at the location in a very short period of time. It seems to be the majority opinion that just as high fences impair fair chase so too do trail cameras used in such a manner as to quickly put hunters on game – much like using a plane to spot animals and then land to hunt them.

I hope your holiday season was filled with good cheer and that this coming year will bring you happiness and good health, because without them nothing else matters.

Drive to the security control point and visitor center. Obtain a temporary vehicle pass at the visitor center adjacent to the control point by presenting driver's license and vehicle registration. Proceed south on Pohick Road to the first traffic light at Theote Road and turn right. Proceed approximately one-half mile to a stop sign at Warren Road and turn right. Proceed to Tompkins Basin, turning right at the intersection at the bottom of the hill. The Indoor Range is the long, white building (Bldg 778) on the right and set back from the road at the base of the hill. The Fort Belvoir Archery Center is located in the same building. Once again, the Director's position is open with Mike Bise, Acting; and Dabney W.Watts, Jr., being promoted to Chief of Law Enforcement. On the subject of game trail cameras, they are legal in Virginia and the VDGIF has no views regarding their use, except they be used in conjunction with <u>lawful activity</u>.

FROM THE KITCHEN OF WALLY & WINNIE

Now that hunting season is over and the freezer is stocked, it's time to enjoy your bounty. When mixed with browned, ground venison the barbecue sauce below makes awesome Sloppy Joes. Venison hot dogs are also delicious cooked in it.

WINNING BARBECUE SAUCE

1 med onion, chopped
1/2 green pepper, chopped
1/3 C brown sugar
1 tsp Worcestershire Sauce
1 tsp red pepper
1/2 tsp chili powder

1/2 C butter
1 C vinegar
1 C catsup
2 tsp lemon juice
1/2 tsp dry mustard

Brown ground venison. Remove from skillet and saute onion and green pepper in butter until tender. Stir in remaining ingredients and simmer 15 minutes. Stir in browned venison or hot dogs cut into 1-2" pieces and simmer over low heat for 15 min.




