## Agenda for the September 2006 Meeting

1. By-laws, Art. 5, Page 2 – Hunting Vice President – Change wording from “March and May” to “as needed when there will be public input.” Reason – More flexibility.
2. By-laws, Art. 11, Section 1, D., Page 3 – Change “10 members” to “10 head of household members.” Reason – clarify the meaning and intent.
3. By-laws, Art. 11, Section 3., C., Page 4 – Change “eight (8) paid members” to “eight (8) head of household members”. Reason – Clarify meaning and intent.
4. By-laws, Art. 11, Section 5., Page 4 – Membership Rosters – Remove entire section. Reason – Housekeeping.
5. By-laws, Art. 11, Section 7., Page 5 – Add after “...of their respective club” “immediately after new officers are elected or appointed.” Reason – Housekeeping.
6. By-laws – Several references to Pros throughout the By-laws – Change all to: “Pros are welcome to compete.” Reason – Housekeeping.
7. Indoor Shooting Rules, Page 5, #15 – Remove the word “diagonally.” Reason – To avoid confusion.
8. Indoor Shooting Rules, Page 5, #1, 2, 4, 5, 17 – Remove all references to four spot targets. Reason – Never used by VBA.
9. Combined 3-D Shooting Rules, Page 7 – Add to By-laws, Art. 16, Sections B & D. “Archers must shoot both days.” Reason – Some archers want to shoot both rounds on one day for Spring marked distances.
10. Combined 3-D Shooting Rules, Page 7 – Add to shooting rules & contracts – “Archers must touch shooting stake.” Reason – To conform with other organizations.
11. Change shooting styles of Barebow and Bowhunter to allow multi-colored strings and center/end servings. (Section 1 & 2, Page 10) Reason: Many new strings on the market are of multi-colored strings/ servings.
12. Amend Standing Rules, Page 13. Amend Standing Rule #4 to read: “...Expense reimbursement for travel of VBA Officer shall be \$ .30 per mile.” Reason – This is currently \$ .22 per mile. (Meeting #136, Page 724, 9/90). Reason – The rising cost of gas. The reimbursement rate has not been raised since 1990. Price of fuel has tripled in 16 years.

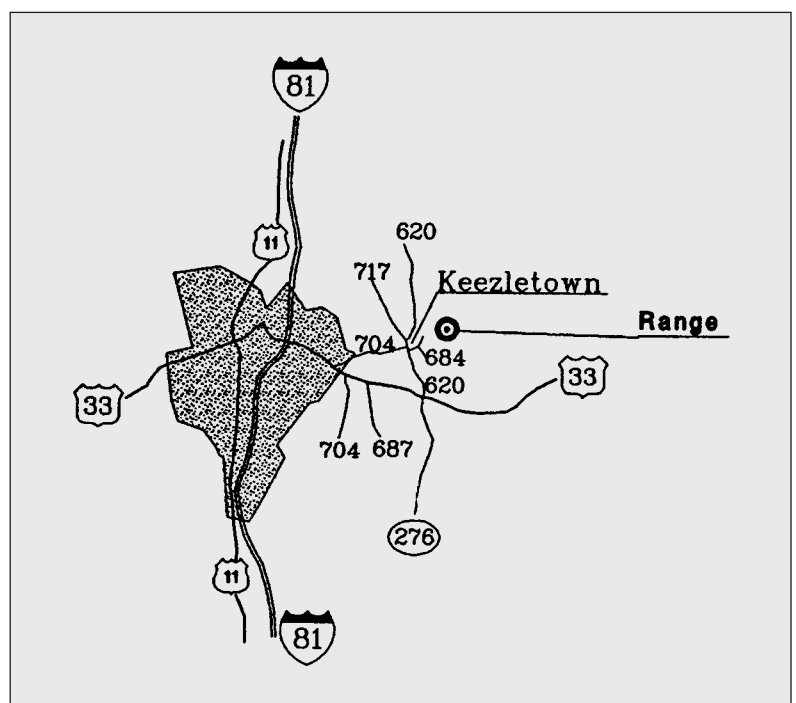

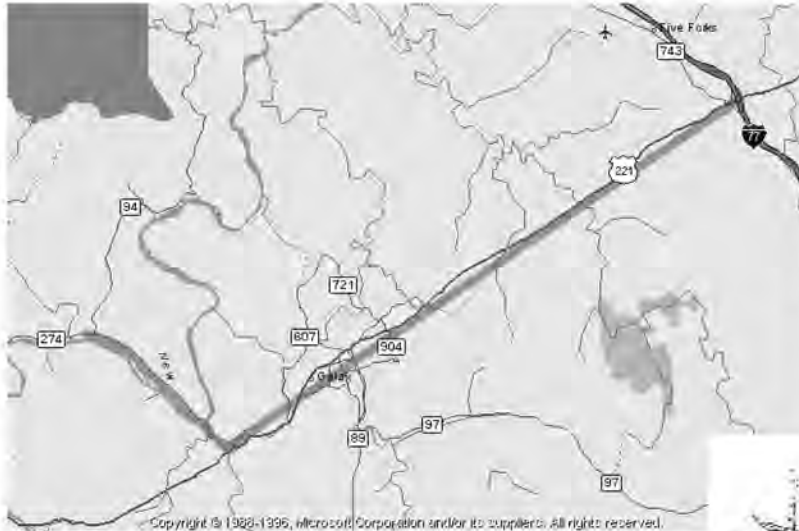

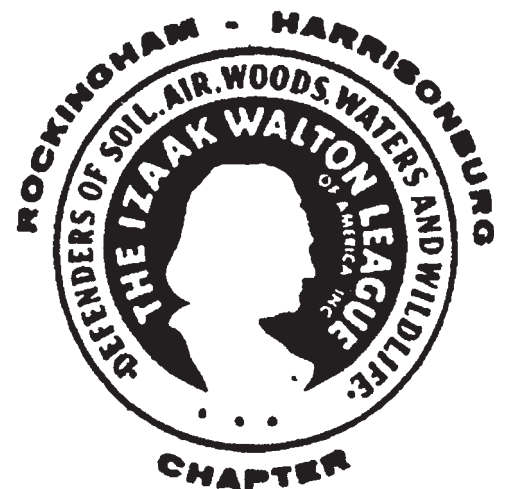

# Kids on the Range

As my sight pin hovered on the 40-yard X during the state match at Sherwood Archers, I could hear my two boys heading off toward trouble behind me. I could have let down. I could have ignored them and, with cold concentration, made the shot. Instead, I opted for the worst choice of all: at full draw, I quickly glanced behind me to make sure they were OK, aimed again, and let the arrow go. Oh, well, another day on the range with the kids.

Is it worth taking young kids out on the range? I ask that question just about every summer weekend. Certainly, my scores, such as they are, suffer. And the boys are bound to tangle up in a justifiable scolding from me or some other responsible adult at least once because there is no room for rule-breaking with all those arrows flying around.

As often as I ask, I come up with the same answer. Yes. It is worth it. Here are a couple of reasons why: First, being outdoors and using one's instincts and skills is a rite that is at least 3000 years old and is a far better education for my kids than television or computer games. Archery teaches responsibility, concentration, endurance, and humility. Can you think of a better set of virtues for a young one to learn while having fun at the same time?

We meet some real pros on the VBA circuit - characters who are fun to be around, people who are full of useful advice. There are plenty of top shooters at my own club, Cub Run, and we keep meeting more in other clubs all the time. In May, my kids were paired up with Bobby Norris, which in my mind is like getting to spend the morning working on your pitching with Roger Clemens.

Approximately one half hour before the tournament began at the Sherwood shoot, my son had a serious problem with the arrow rest on his recurve that I couldn't resolve. I walked over to Terry Ballowe's truck, and he had it re-tapped and fixed in ten minutes. If you are a parent involved in this great sport, take it from me - there is a huge, rich vein of talent and experience in this organization that is out there waiting for you to discover at the cost of a handshake.

All of the above reasons are important, but I had an experience at Shenandoah Archers last summer that emphasized why this investment in kids is so valuable. My son, Sebastian, and I were paired up with a group of college students. At first, I didn't think these 20-year-old mountain cats would have the patience to hang out with a five-year-old and his dad. I was wrong.

Not only were they respectful, but they bird-dogged my lost arrows, gave me a few shooting tips, had a couple of good hunting stories to tell, and, on the whole, were fun and polite. Driving home that afternoon, I realized that I had gotten a glimpse into the future. The reason why we must bring kids out on the range is so that they will be there behind us as we move along. These are the ones who are going to come out on work days in our clubs. These are the ones who are going to be handing out shooting tips to the generation behind them.

Making the investment of time and patience in kids is not easy. Your day on the range or at the tournament probably isn't going to be all about the score. I think I barely caught the outside ring on the shot I described above. Then again, my kids were heading toward poison ivy or a snake we had just spotted so I was a little distracted. I don't especially enjoy those moments. But the payback, I think, is that 10 years from now there will be three of them out there instead of just me, and in 20 years each of them will be bringing three or four of their own.

Of all the good things VBA does, one of the organization's defining aspects is its welcoming attitude toward youth. I've found this in every club, and as long as this prevails I will be optimistic about our future.

My three sons, Nicolas, Sebastian and Benjamin, are lucky to be involved in VBA, and, as their dad, so am I. There is no shortage of adult hot shots who rank above me on the score boards. My sons could use a lot more competitors. Bring your kids out and join us. But you better do it soon, because thanks to the guys and gals at Cub Run and folks we meet at the shoots, my kids are getting better every year.

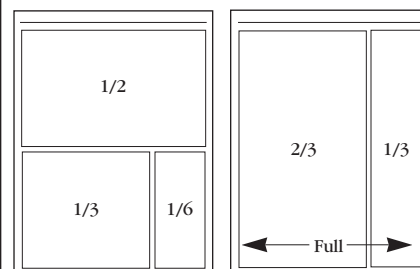
