Yes, the VBA has a new website, plus more future enhancements and drop down menus. Tim Seymour has re-designed the new VBA website and has devoted many hours, along with his knowledge and expertise. All the events and information are based around the Calendar. I can't begin to tell you what a pleasure it is to work with him. Tim has also designed three new spreadsheets in Excel for the State Indoors, State 3D Spring/ Fall and the State Open/Closed. They have replaced the MS Access database that we have used in the past. It does all the calculations when the hosting club(s) enters the required fields and it includes the Unit Rule. These templates are the property of the VBA and are only to be used for clubs hosting VBA State Tournaments. Tim needs to be commended for his outstanding accomplishments to the VBA and much more!

I would also like to 'thank' Bob Foster for his contributions and help with the new website, and providing information on IBEP, Bowhunting Education Programs, other archery education and training information, and working closely with the VDGIF.

We welcome any feedback, stories, pictures and information you would like to share with the VBA, your fellow archers and bowhunters. Just Google the website at - www.vbarchers.com.

As you know, Singers Glen Bowbenders hosted the State 3D Spring Tournament. I would like to recognize them for doing a great job since it was their first State tournament. Next year, they will be hosting the State 3D Spring and have the opportunity to use the new spreadsheet. Also, to Sherwood Archers especially the Shumate's, as they were the first club to use the new State Open/Closed spreadsheet. Since they will be hosting the upcoming State 3D Fall, they will have the opportunity to use the State 3D Spring/Fall spreadsheet.

OGF Update - recently, we received an email from Mike Bunting, son of Harry Bunting and past VBA President. He found some photos and articles dating back to 1954. Our VBA OGF chairperson, Dave Burpee, will be working with Mike. Once all this information is collected, Dave will share this with us in FLIGHT, on our website and in the OGF scrapbook.

Topics on VDGIF events - the VDGIF Recognition Awards annual banquet was held in April and I received my Master's as a Hunter Education Instructor. The Complementary Work Force Program (CWF) recently held their annual awards banquet and I was recognized for over 375 hours of volunteer services. A Hunter Ed & IBEP Instructors Treestand Safety certification class was held at the IWLA in Stafford, which I and other instructors attended. On July 1st, Capt. Bobby Mawyer, Outdoor Education Manager, retired. The Verona office has a new Hunter Education Assistant, Carmella Joseph who is working with CPO, Kris Dougherty. They both coordinate the Hunter Ed program with Sgt. David Dodson from the Fredericksburg office.

Beginning January 1, 2013, the VDGIF will be instituting a new curriculum in order to meet the International Hunter Ed Association (IHEA) standards for all Hunter Ed classes. These classes will stress the importance of Safety (firearms & treestand) and Ethics (game laws).

Other facts - in 1937, Senator Key Pittman of Nevada and Congressman A. Willis Robertson of Virginia sponsored what is now known as the Pittman-Robertson Act. Today, the Pittman-Robertson excise tax is at 11 percent, and is collected on all firearms, ammunition and archery equipment. Through these taxes and fees on hunting licenses, hunters in the US contribute approximately \$3.5 million towards wildlife conservation and hunter education. Hunters play an important role in caring for and managing wildlife.

Don't forget to get the word out of the upcoming VBA State 3D Fall hosted by Sherwood Archers and the State Closed hosted by Two Rivers Archery Club. Is it possible that we could break the attendance at both tournaments from the previous years?

Hope to see you in September for the VBA 2013 Scheduling session.

### **NFAA Master Coach Course Offered**

An NFAA Master Coach course is being offered at the end of August, specifically 4 days over the weekend of 23 to 26 August. Master Coach is the highest level archery coach level in the NFAA instructor/coach program. The course is being presented by three current Master Coaches, Bernie Pellerite, the creator of the NFAA Mobile Shooters School and owner of Robinhood Videos; Paul Vogel and Jerry Wenzel, two Master Coaches who have been coaching archery in Maryland and Virginia for several years. The course will be held at the Belvoir Bowhunters facilities at Ft. Belvoir, VA.

The cost of the course is \$500.00 per person, and will include all course materials. A \$150.00 deposit is required to reserve a place in the course.

Course requirements are minimum age of 21 years, certification as an NFAA Advanced Certified Instructor (ACI) or NFAA Certified Instructor (CI), and five years of archery experience. Newly certified Master Coaches will have a one year probationary period, and Master Coach Certification expires ten years after issuance.

Minimum class size is ten and will be limited to a maximum of twenty. Those interested in attending the course or who have questions about the course, please contact Jerry Wenzel at 540-854-0245 or by e-mail at <a href="mailto:coachjerry@coac

### ITEMS PASSED AT JUNE MEETING:

- (1) By-laws, Indoor Shooting Rules, 1st. Para. 3rd. sentence, pg, 5, and Art. 15, Para., H, pg. 7. Pros are welcome to compete, add: in their corresponding VBA style for awards or as a guest without an award. Eff. immediately. Passed
- (3) Const.By-laws,Art.15,Sect.2,Para.F.,pg.9, There will be no shoots on club properties or in club name,private or public,conducted on the days that State Tournaments are held. Eff.immediately. Passed

### AGENDA ITEMS FOR SEPTEMBER MEETING:

(1) The following is a substitute for Agenda item #2, from June meeting:

Const.Art.3,Sect.1,Para.C,pg.1,Change to read," Bowhunter membership is open to individuals who reside 50 miles or greater from the nearest VBA club, upon application and payment of VBA fees and dues set for Bowhunter members. Bowhunter members shall have the rights and privileges of VBA membership. Eff. immediately.

Justification: To return Bowhunter membership to its original intent and to protect VBA clubs from loss of members while also allowing Bowhunter members to compete in VBA tournaments as intended by June agenda item #2.

(2) Combine the Spring 3-D Classic and Fall 3-D Championships into one State 3-D Championship. For the past 8 years, the Fall Classic has only averaged 44 shooters per event, which is questionable if it is worth the host club's time and effort. A combined shoot could still provide a marked and unmarked tournament. Saturday's round could be shot as unmarked, and Sunday could be a marked shoot, which would speed up the Sunday activities and give more time to present awards.

Justification: By combining the two shoots, it would make it a more profitable shoot for the host club, and make it a more prestigious shoot for the winners. It would also make another weekend available that clubs could use to schedule their local shoots. Eff. 2014

(3) Request to spend upto \$500.00 for the speaker for the 2013 Banquet to cover his expenses .Tenative speaker, Mr.Hal Schaefer of National syndicated TV Show, "Drop Zone."

Justification: Grow attendance at Banquet. Effective immediately.

### **Elephant Stew (from Joel Lutkenhouse)**

- 1 elephant 4 bushels onions
- 2 rabbits (optional) 93 1/2 gal. water
- 1/2 pail pepper 6 pails flour
- 2 pails salt

### Draft Virginia Black Bear Management Plan

The Virginia Department of Game and Inland Fisheries is seeking public input on the *Draft Virginia Black Bear Management Plan* through <u>August 1, 2012</u>. The *Virginia Black Bear Management Plan*, first developed in 2001, is being revised through the involvement of public stakeholders and bear managers. Because VDGIF's mission is "to serve the needs of the Commonwealth," it is important that the process used to develop and revise the Bear Plan incorporates both public values (e.g., economic, sociological, and political) and biological considerations.





The Virginia Black Bear Management Plan will guide bear management across the Commonwealth through 2021. This plan describes the history of black bear management, current status (supply and demand) of the bear resource and management programs, and the future of the bear management program in Virginia. The plan identifies a framework of what needs to be done, how it should be done, and when it should be done.

Guided by the VDGIF mission, the *Virginia Black Bear Management Plan* includes four goals that specify general directions for: (1) bear populations, (2) bear habitat, (3) bear-related recreation, and (4) human-bear problems. Specific objectives help guide the attainment of each goal. Potential strategies then clarify how each objective could be achieved, but without delving into the operational details. By clarifying directions for bear management, this plan will assist the VDGIF Board of Directors, VDGIF administrators and staff, and the public in addressing bear issues.

**Public input is important!** Beginning <u>June 11, 2012</u>, the draft plan will be available at <u>www.dgif.virginia.gov/comment</u>. You will be able to review and submit your comments online. Comments may also be sent to Jaime Sajecki BBMP, VDGIF, 4010 West Broad Street, Richmond, VA 23230. Comments are due **August 1, 2012**.
