I figure my mother and father must be really meant for each other; otherwise their marriage would never have survived nearly 40 years of my father's triumphant bringing home of the venison.

It is a real problem to try to sneak rib roast of beef into the house when the institution size freezer in the basement is bulging with seven hundred pounds of venison roasts.

"What in hell's wrong with venison?" my father roars. He has never realized (or accepted, perhaps) that my mother detests venison, especially every night.

"I thought," she begins, in her most placating tone, "that since we haven't had a beef roast in three years....."

t my tather interrupts, ''Why are vasting money on that? The venison , dst as good!'' My mother sighs, and endures for a while longer Venaison Bourguigonne, Venison Stroganoff, Deerburgers.

And finally, having waded through the entire ton or whatever of frozen meat, she breathes a sigh of relief, and heads gratefully for the meat counter at the A&P only to return home to Daddy, pleased as punch with himself, his red cap gleaming, skinning a huge buck in the back yard. And if she has come dangerously close to spousicide on those late fall afternoons with the echoes of cracking guns in the surrounding hills, she has never told the children.

There are some things even she can do to venison. It is, of course, cheaper than other meat, though my mother denies this citing the mounting expenses of hunting licenses and ammunition as dogged proof that beef is really cheaper.

- 1 pound loin of venison, cut into strips or cubes
- 2 cups dry red wine
- 2 tablespoons flour
- 1 large onion, chopped
- 4 tablespoons butter
- 2 cloves garlic, mashed
- pound fresh mushrooms, sliced
- cup sour cream
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1/4 teaspoon pepper

Drug - Tipped Arrou by JIM OVERFELT

Last week in Blacksburg on the campus of V.P.I. & S.U., Dr. Herrington of Missippissi gave a talk on "Drug-Tipped Arrows."

Dr. Herrington invented the "Pod" some years back and has a patent on it. He travels and gives talks to interested groups that will listen. He doesn't push the idea at you or try to sell you on the use of "pods". He merely states facts concerning the use of the pods in Mississippi and explains the advantages and disadvantages of pods according to his experience of ten years.

I won't go into details of the meeting except to mention that most of the important facts can be read in the May issue of "Sports Afield"

There were several members of the Va. WildlifeDept. present and they were very interested in the pods. They even want to run a hunting experiment at the Radford Arsenal using drug-tipped arrows and compare the wounded animal data with data already taken there some years ago.

According to Dr. Herrington, the drugtipped arrows are in use in many states because there are no laws in those states to prevent the use of them.

By the time you get this edition, this old year will have been put to rest. From all of us in Zone one to all of you we wish you a



Marinate the venison in the red wine & garlic for several hours. Drain well and pat dry, keeping the wine. Dredge meat in flour and set aside.

Saute the onion in the butter until golden, add the meat, and stir constantly for five minutes. Pour in the marinade, cover and simmer a half hour.

Allow the wine to reduce by about half Add the mushrooms, cover and cook 5 minutes. Add sour cream, salt, and pepper, and heat just long enough to heat through. Serve on wide flat noodles.

VENAISON BOURGUIGNONNE

- 2 lb. top sirloin of venison
- 1/4 lb. bacon, cut into 1/2 in. strips
- 1 large onion chopped
- 1 large garlic clove, diced
- handful parsely, chopped
- $\frac{1}{2}$ lb. fresh mushrooms, or an 8 oz. can
- 1/2 lb. fresh carrotts, in chunks
- teaspoon each: thyme, marjoram, oregano
- 4 table spoons flour
- cups bouillion
- 2
- teaspoons salt
- 1/4 teaspoon pepper
- 1 large jar whole onions
- 2 tablespoons butter

Marinate venison at least 24 hours in red wine. Cook bacon until crisp, remove from pan, leaving fat. Save bacon. Cook venison, onion, parsley and garlic in bacon fat until venison loses red color.

Sprinkle flour over top, and stir in well. Add wine and bouillion and stir well. Cover and simmer.

Meanwhile, in 2 tablespoons butter, saute mushrooms whole or sliced depending on their size. Add carrots and onions, spices, salt and pepper, and saute slowly until golden and savory. Pour this mixture into the meat mixture and cook an hour, slowly.

Before serving, sprinkle crumbled bacon over top.

Poison arrows are illegal in Va., but the drug used in the pods is not a poison it is a muscle relaxer. I don't proclaim the use of pods until they are legal, but I am just making a point of fact.

The drug used is succinylcholine cloride which is already in use in Va. to capture deer. This drug is not a stock item in drug stores and even if it was, a prescription is needed to get the drug.

I feel that legalizing the drug-tipped arrow may be a long way off, but there is no reason why Va. should not implement a test state-wide on the pods and the meat killed by the pods.

V.B.A. doesn't directly represent the bowhunters in Va., but V.B.A. is the strongest group of bowhunters in Va.

I hope V.B.A. will implement a program or at least a committee to investigate the drug-tipped arrow and possible use of it.
