

COMMITTEE REPORT ON PRESIDENTS DIRECTIVE

A committee composed of Dr. W.R. Dillow, Bill Enders, Murray Selby, Jim Weidhuner, and Clinton Western as Chairman, was appointed by President Street and directed to prepare information concerning VBA suitable for distribution to the members. The purpose of this directive was to provide members with a booklet or pamphlet which would give them a working knowledge of how the Association functions and also give them related information.

In the process of carrying out the President's directive, it became obvious that before accurate information could be furnished, it would be necessary to amend the Association's constitution and bylaws. Article 7 of the Constitution "Amendments", Section 1, states that: "The Constitution may be amended or repealed by a majority of mail ballot votes of members of affiliated clubs or groups, and associated members, provided the proposed changes, along with a ballot has been mailed to the aforenentioned members at least 30 days prior to the final ballot date." Realizing there are members who do not have a copy of the constitution, it is printed in its

entirety in the left hand column, with proposed changes, if any, in the right hand column. The proposed changes are designed to bring the constitution up to date in line with existing conditions. For example, all references to the National Archery Association (NAAtarget archery) are deleted as time has proven that this Association will afford VBA no more consideration than it would an individual club, therefore, VBA, as an Association, cannot benefit itself or the members it serves by attempting to affiliate with NAA. Under Article 4, "Government", references to "NFAA representative" should be removed because this individual is an elected officer and, as such, the words "elected officers" include the NFAA representative

The Committee feels that all other proposed changes are self explanatory and the Committee as a whole urges and solicits a vote in favor of the constitutional amendments. OLD CONSTITUTION

Article 1

Name

Sec. 1. The corporate title of this association will be Virginia Bewhunters Association, Incorporated.

Article 2

Purpose

Sec. 1. The purpose of this Association shall be to foster, expand, and perpetuate the use of the bow in hunting all legal game; to cooperate with conservation organizations, Game and Fish Commissions, and Forestry Services in their efforts for preservation of our natural resources and wild life; to promote and encourage all approaches to competitive Field Archery in accordance with the National Field Archery Association standards, and shall be the governing association for NFAA activities within the State of Virginia; to promote and encourage all approaches to competitive target archery in accordance with the National Archery Association standards; and to generally require the highest standards of sportsman-like conduct in all phases of archery.

Article 3

Membership

Sec. 1. There shall be five classes of membership. a). Adult b). Youth c). Bowhunter d). Associate member e). NAA members.

a). Adult membership shall be granted to any individual having reached 18 years of age upon application and payment of regular fees and dues through chartered clubs.

b). Youth membership shall be granted to an individual under 18 years of age in the same manner as paragraph a.

c). Bowhunter membership shall be granted to any individual upon application and payment of regular fees and dues.

d). Associate membership may be held by any archer not a member of any club or group affiliated with this association.

e). NAA membership shall be granted to any individual as per current NAA requirements.

Sec. 2. Association membership shall be granted to any archery club or group within the State of Virginia, incorporated or non-incorporated, may affiliate with this association by making proper application for affiliation and registering all its members along with payment of dues as prescribed in the By-Laws of this Association.

Article 4

Government

Sec. 1 (a) The government of this association shall be vested in the Board of Directors composed of one Director of each affiliated club or group, elected officers of the Association, NEAA representative, NAA representative, and immediate past-president of the Association. A querum of the Board of Directors shall be the delegates present at a quarterly meeting.

(b) Each director shall be a direct representative of his club or group, and be entitled to one vote. No director can represent more than one club or group.

(c) Elected officers, NFAA representative, and immediate past-president will not be entitled to any vote, but will serve in a liaison and advisory capacity, or in the performance of their elected offices, except the President, or in his absence the presiding efficer, shall cast the tie-breaking vote.

(d) All officers of the Association cannot be a director representing his club or group.

 $S_{\rm gc}.$ 2. The Beard of Directors shall control and manage the activities, policy, and property of the Association. It shall have the power to make by-laws, tournament preoedure for all tournaments under its sanction, and to

alter and repeal these at its discretion; to receive, care for, and expend the funds of the Association; to make leases and other contracts; to purchase property, real or personal, and to sell, exchange, or to otherwise dispose of such property in the best interests of the Association; to accept or reject affiliation or membership in the Association; to fix the amount of dues and prescribe the rights and privileges of affiliation and membership or to alter or withdraw such items which it deems necessary for the best interests of the Association; to fine, suspend, or expel any affiliation or membership with just cause; and to do such other acts and things necessary or proper for the welfare of the Association.

Sec. 3. The Board of Directors shall appoint a nominating committee at the January meeting. This committee shall prepare a list of nominees, who have agreed to accept office, of at least one or more candidates for each office. This slate of candidates must be forwarded to each member of affiliated clubs or groups, and associated members at least thirty days prior to the April meeting. At this meeting, nomination will be open from directors and those names will be added to the official ballot. All voting for candidates will be done by mail ballots which **are** to be sent to all members of affiliated clubs or groups and associated members within 30 days after the April meeting. These ballots will be returned to the Corresponding Secretary by June 15th in order to be counted in the final tally. These ballots will be held by the Corresponding Secretary, unopened until the June meeting of the Board of Directors where they will be opened and counted. Candidates receiving the highest number of votes, whether a majority of total votes cast or not, shall be thereby elected.

Sec. 4 The Board of Directors may transact the business of the Association through such agents and committees as it may deem necessary, and these agents and committees shall have such powers as may be from time to time prescribed by the Board. Members of standing committees shall be appointed in whatever manner prescribed by the Board and shall serve for the duration of the fiscal year, or such time as specifically directed by the Board.

Sec. 5. The elected officers of this Association shall be President, Executive Vice President, Field Vice President, Hunting Vice President, Corresponding Secretary, Recording Secretary, Treasurer, Conservation Vice Presidnet, VEA Field Governor, NFAA Director, and NAA Director.

Sec. 6. The Board of Directors shall have the right to request the resignation of any elected officer, should he fail to perform the duties of the office, or act in such a manner detrimental to the welfare of the Association, by a 2/3 vote of a quorum of the Board. Also, the Board shall have the right to appoint a successor to fill an unexpired term of office any vacancy created by reason of death, resignation, disqualification, or otherwise, by majority vote of a quorum of the Board.

Article 5

Election & Term of Offices

Sec. 1. Election of officers shall be prescribed in the Constitution of this Association, Article 4, Section 3. Term of office shall be for the Fiscal Year of the Association. Duties of the various officers shall be prescribed in the By-Laws of this Association. All elected officers will serve until replaced after their term of office by duly and properly elected successors to their office in accordance with this Constitution and its By-Laws.

Article 6

Fiscal Year

Sec. 1 The Fiscal Year of the Association shall end on the last day of June of each year.

Article 7

Amendments

Sec. 1 The Constitution may be amended or repealed by a majority of mail ballot votes of members of affiliated clubs or groups, and associated members, provided the proposed changes, along with a ballot has been mailed to the aforementioned members at least 30 days prior to the final ballot date.

Sec. 3 Change second sentence to read: "This committee shall prepare a list of nominees, who have agreed to accept office and who have stated they can and will attend VBA meetings. They shall submit a list of at least one or more candidates for each office."

DRUGGED ARROWS BANNED by Tink Nathan

The following was taken from the Federal Register on September 4, 1974.

In July, 1974 a regulation was proposed which would restrict the type of archery equipment hunters may use on national wildlife refuges. The public was provided with a 30 day comment period and no comments were received Accordingly 32.2 General provisions, is amended by the addition of paragraph (g) as Follows

\$ 32.2 General Provisions (g) The use of any Drug on an arrow for bow hunting on national wildlife refuges is prohibited. Archers may not have arrows employing such drugs in their possession on any national wildlife refuge.

Effective date. This amendment becomes effective on Oct. 4, 1974. F. N. Schmidt, Deputy Director, U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service. * * * * * * * * * * * * * * * *

This represents a clear cut victory for the vast majority of American Bowhunters who wanted no part of pod arrows or drugs. Most of the drugs that could be used were illegal and

were usually obtained in violation of Federal laws. Many bowhunters organizations spoke out against the use of drugged arrows, the so called POD and the hypo-arrow.

the so called POD and the hypo-arrow. The Professional Bowhunters Society went on record against the drugged arrows at its annual meeting in 1974.

The Pope & Young Club does not recognize trophy big game taken with the use of drugged arrows.

There was considerable pressure from a small group of Fish & Wildlife officials in support of the drugged arrow, but an opinion handed down by the Solictors (Attorneys) Office of the Interior drove home the final nail. The opinion said "The drugged arrow or pod is the illegal use of an unlicenced drug".

Hopefully hunters can now put aside this dead issue and concentrate joint efforts to combat the Anti-Hunting pressures spreading thru our elementary and secondary schools thru the efforts of the Humane Society of the U.S.

I read with interest the Sept. - Oct. issue of "Flight". With one exception, I thought it was a fine issue. That exception was to your article on the cover page which seemed to follow the established pattern of lauding the accomplishments of Freestyle shooters while slighting shooters of other divisions. For example, more space was devoted to Mr. Quarles than to all other shooters combined. In comparison it seems unjust to merely acknowledge he scores of Tom Frye (several times, fate champion and past national champion) with a one sentence statement. Further, no mention was made at all of Webb Babcock in the Semi Restricted Bowhunter's Divismon. Why not? It

is a recognized division within the state you know. The point I'm trying to make is that there are Barebow, Bowhunter, and Semi- Restricted Bowhunter Champions and these individuals deserve recognition too. Naturally they aren't going to shoot the perfect scores Mr. Quarles will with all of the aids he uses, but who is to say that a 520 in Bowhunter Division, for example, isn't equivalent to a 560 in the Freestyle Division.

Perhaps the fact that it is easy to rank shooters according to the total score they shoot without regard to the aids they are permitted to use in achieving those scores contributes to our present practice of regarding the person with the highest score as the champion.

Incidentally, I agree that Mr. Quarles is a great archer.




How to make 3-D Targets

From Archery World Digest 1971 Making 3-dimension targets is a fine club project. It keeps interest up during the winter. Members compete to see who can make the most life-like target. And when summer rolls around, an invitational tournament probably can recover the cost of the materials . . . and leave enough left over for a club picnic.

Project a slide on a wall, trace the outline out of cardboard silhouette in basic shape of the animal.



Build up layers of Styrofoam cut to fit the pattern. Caulking compounds make the best glue. Insert heavy wire over the back and down the legs to reinforce the target.



Rasp smooth and cover with two foot strips of burlap, dipped in wallpaper paste. Paint in natural colors after the burlap dries. Use inner tube ears, marble eyes.
