



From The President

With the publication of this issue of *Flight* the 1985 Bowhunting season will be over or almost over, at least East of the Blue Ridge. This draws to a close the first year of the new bowhunting license many of you worked so hard to get. Comments from the various locations where licenses were sold have been very positive. This is concrete evidence that the VBA membership can have significant influence. I have been going through the minutes from past VBA meetings (back as far as January 1970). You might be interested to know that the VBA began activity back in April 1970 to obtain a second archery season west of the Blue Ridge. Also, we initiated and succeeded in eventually getting Turkey added as legal game during the archery season. That effort started back in the 70s also. So did our first activity to obtain an archery stamp/license. In other actions, the VBA succeeded in preventing a blackpowder season from being set during the archery season. And then there was the success in keeping deer dog training out of the archery season. All in all I believe that we all can be very proud of the record that the VBA has established for its activities on behalf of the bowhunters of Virginia.

On the Field Archery front, the VBA also has a fine record. One noteworthy piece was the fact that we were pioneers in establishing what has become the Freestyle Bowhunter Division (we called it the Semi-Restricted Bowhunter Division). But of all of our achievements none compare to the national and world class champions that have come (and are from) Virginia. Elmo Moore, World Barebow Champion, won at a European event; Denny Cline, National Barebow Champion and record holder for Field and Hunter Rounds, Jim Quarles, a National Freestyle Champion and the first to shoot a perfect field round at Nationals; and more that I'm sure I should name, but can't because I do not know all of the records; these are the kinds of competitors that have helped the VBA become a very well respected organization and one that I am very proud to represent.

I'm sure that some of us hear negative remarks about the VBA from time to time. But, it seems that when we meet the enemy, we find out he is us. Most of the disparagement I run across is from our own members. Considering our record, vitality (32 clubs and over 1500 members) and the respect we have gained from outside the VBA, I have no trouble putting things straight with the muckrakers. Honest constructive criticism is always welcome by the Board of Directors. But simple-minded bad-mouthing by our own members is self defeating. I would hope that all of you would take the opportunity to do some "selling" when you hear this kind of talk. We have an excellent organization that we can all be proud of, let's work to keep it that way.

6. Pay-Off: 40% — 1st Place 25% — 2nd Place




