




Flight Deadline

A Personal Opinion

Princess Anne Bowmen has put an agenda item on the floor concerning the establishment of criteria leading to the designation of target captain.

I feel that the importance of this agenda item is to alleviate scoring inconsistencies in all levels of shooting from club to national competition. I have received many reports of scoring violations in all classes, styles, and tournament levels. Some examples are: Archers shooting more than one arrow from a shooting stake on a walk up or a fan and being given the points, or an archer shooting the wrong target on a multiple target butt and being given the points. I don't believe these are isolated incidents. Therefore, I feel it is important to establish criteria for target captains. Making sure they are knowledgeable of N.F.A.A. tournament rules, and that these rules are strictly adhered to. This can be done on either the state or the club level. In the best interest of all I think some measures must be taken to insure consistent scoring practices.




