

VBA MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

Despite the bitter cold, 17 clubs had directors present at the recent VBA meeting.

There has been a price increase from NFAA on 20-pins and bars. The 20-pins now cost \$3.00 each, the bars at \$2.00 each. Also available once again are the VBA window decals and most directors picked up a supply of these and also copies of the newly revised VBA By-laws and Constitution. We urge members to purchase these window decals from club secretaries and display them on your cars to help promote the possible growth of VBA.

Our NFAA director Bob Cissel, who will be attending the National NFAA meeting next month gave a lengthy report on agenda items which will be brought before the National directors for vote. Our delegates gave him directions on how to vote on most issues at this meeting and he will report to us at the March VBA meeting the details of the National meeting and his full report will be published in the *Flight* at that time.

President Bill Enders formed a Raffle committee consisting of Bill Reeves as Chairman, with Van Vanek, Dave Proctor and John Stockman. Bill Taylor will join the committee as an advisor. The raffle which we held last year was successful and produced much needed revenue for VBA, that we are now considering making it an annual event.

Bill Reeves, who is our new director of the Bowhunter Education Program gave an interesting talk on the possible development of BEP in our state. He will invite Bill Wadsworth to our next quarterly VBA meeting (March 27-28) to help present the BEP to those who wish to participate. The program will begin on Saturday, March 27 at 9 a.m. at the Mount Vernon Motel in Charlottesville.

2. (Sherwood) Place a 5 year mortarium on any proposed changes to the number and type rounds to be shot at State Open and State Closed.




Two Rivers Archer Youth Bags Black Bear
