DO YOU WANT BLACK POWDER GUNS IN ARCHERY SEASON???

We have been advised by the office on one of our General Assembly members that unless the Game Commissioner receives letters opposing the black powder season in archery season, we are going to lose out.

The Game Commission is being swamped by letters in favor of the early black powder in archery season. To date, they have not received one letter from archers opposed to this.

These letters must be in the hands of the Game Commissioner prior to the meeting on May 1, 1981. The earlier, the better. DO NOT DELAY. Address is below. We must write individual letters at once opposing

early black powder season.

The Virginia Bowhunters Association will also oppose this proposal and we will receive proposals from them later for a concerted effort.

Some points to consider:

- Do you want to take your youngster out in bow season with bullets.
- Bullets and arrows are not compatible in the same season.
- Complete camouflage used in bowhunting. Bowhunting requires stealth, stalking, planning, scouting, and quiet.

5. Average bowshot is 15-25 yards. Black powder guns accurate 75-100 yards.

Much pressure and letters will be received by the

Game Commissioner from all gun hunters. Gun hunters could extend their season by 4 weeks in

early archery season alone. All that is required is a black powder gun.

More pressure on game people. Require more supervision. Possible more deer killed and never checked.

In my years of bowhunting experience I could have killed a number of bucks with black powder gun. They were not close enough for a bow.

A purist or sincere black powder gun hunter would hunt thru regular gun season and also in the alternatively proposed season from 3rd Monday in Dec. until Jan. 5.

Hunting Vic-President Dickie Hall reported that Cub FS (Limited and unlimited) and BB are the only Cub classes; Cubs do not have a CFSBH class. If they shoot this style they must register in FS. Hall also reported that FS-Limited will be recognized at the State Open and

C. D. Tarter, Conservation Vice-President told delegates that funds are available to clubs wishing to apply for seeding, trees and other conservation projects done on

archery range land.

John Stockman, who served as chairman of the Nomination Committee, reported that all the present officers had agreed to run again for another 2 year term with the exception of the Treasurer; Denny Fry was nominated for that position. President Enders then opened the floor to additional nominations and there were none. (As per Article 4, Sec. 3 of VBA Constitution and By-Laws, when only one person is running for each office, No mail ballot will be sent out.)

The Raffle Committee reported ticket sales are looking really good and final plans on the hunting trip were made. The raffle winners will be drawn at the June 28 VBA meeting. September 6-12, 1981 is the scheduled date for the winner of the elk hunt. The winner can hunt for elk and/or mule deer.


pound bear.

Directors Report

By Bob Cissel 1981 NFAA Directors Meeting Held at Kansas City, Mo. Feb. 18-21

A budget was approved that would show a profit of \$70,000.00 at the year ending 1981. This reflects target sales being handled outside the NFAA by Novely Target Co. You will still order targets through the NFAA. The Bowhunter Defence Fund will be paid through a proposed five year pay-back at a rate of \$10,000.00 per year starting in

Starting March 1, 1981, Albert H. Wohlers and Co. of Park Ridge, Ill. will be the new agency for the NFAA club liability insurance program. The insurance will be underwritten by the Atlanta International Insurance Co. If you have any questions concerning your club liability you may call Mr. Terry Berwier at 1-800-323-2106.

A four person monitoring committee will be set up to review all checks written monthly by the NFAA. The council will review all monthly bank statements. The new "Constitution and By Laws" will contain a list of merchandise and services available from the NFAA.

The NFAA will now recognize an Adult Division and a Pro Division. This only means that at Sectional and National tournaments the old Open and Amateur Divisions will shoot as one Adult Division. This will not affect your state or local shoots. The Junior Division saw no changes at this meeting.

The Bowhunter Chairman and Pro Chairman will no longer have any voting privledges on the Board of Directors Council. They will only attend the Board meetings if invited by the President.

The general feeling is that the coverage NFAA receives under the agreement with Bow and Arrow is insufficient. NFAA will mail two news-letters this year to its members, this should help to improve the flow of information from headquarters to the members. Council has also heard serveral proposals from different publishers, concerning the publishing of another archery type magazine. This we will hear more about in the future. The stories of the "Boner" award will be published whenever possible in the offical publication of the NFAA.

All bids for National tournaments will be sent to the State Director 15 days prior to the signing of the tournament contract, and a copy be on hand at headquarters for inspection.

A Senior Division for archers 55 years and over shall be provided at National Tournaments and is optional at Sectional Tournament level and below. Shooting styles for men and women with awards being medals only.

All animal rounds shot before 1977 are to be considered in NFAA record books. In the future a handicap chart will accompany all handi-

cap cards.

No archer shall advance to the target and then return to the shooting stake to shoot again in the event of a missed arrow, this applies to all rounds. A lot of archers have been

advancing on the animal round. In the Competitive Bowhunter Division the Dyna-Bow and like bows will not be allowed in any of the Bowhunter styles due to the bow having a positive draw check. An archer will not be permitted to change the draw weight of any bow during a tournament. It was passed that any type field point may be used as long as it is commercially manufactured and not altered and weighs 125 grains for men and 100 grains for women and can be replaced with a broadhead.

The proposal to change all distances to the metric system was tabled at this meeting. This will surely come about in the future, it's only a matter of time before we'll be shooting metric distances.

The Pro Division will use some of their funds to hire a Public Relations person to promote the Pro Division. Also a committee was appointed to look into the problems concerning the Pro Division.

Bowhunter Committee The reported on a new patch program which should be available for next hunting season. There will be patches for 11 big game animals also a Bowhunter, Expert Bowhunter and Champion Bowhunter. Patch cost is to be \$2.50 per patch. You will apply through the existing Art Young big game awards pro-Information on the Art Young awards can be found in the NFAA By Laws.

A new Indoor Freeman/Bowhunter Round has been approved. I will

try to explain it here.

Distance: Freeman Round Targets: Target used on Freeman round and Group 4 animal targets on 10 and 15 yards. Group 3 animal targets on 20 yards.

SCORING: Circle targets: 5-4-3-2-1 (See Article VIII HSA (pg. 33).

Animals 5 kill; 4 non-vital. Teams: League makes up teams based on handicapping of 2 scores. Each team to be made as equal in shooting ability as possible. Each shooter to declare which type of target they will shoot at. Type of target can only be changed at the half way point. Preformed teams are not allowed. Handicap: Based on 2 scores of the league competition and NFAA 300 handicap system. Awards: Regular indoor patch-

Fees: Current NFAA League Sanction fee.

If you need more information on this please call or write me, I will be glad to give you any help or answer any questions you may have.

The NFAA has objected to the Article in the February issue of Bow and Arrow, titled "Little Lion" It was not in the best interest of Bowhunting.

I feel we had a very good meeting and many things were accomplished.

The above discussed "Constitution and By-Laws" will become effective on April 20, 1981.

A National Bowhunter Tournament will be held in 1981. The tournament will be a three day event to be held on a Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday. Twenty-eight (28) targets to be shot each day. There will be no marked yardages. The tournament is to be held on a date not to conflict with any other activity of the NFAA between June 1st and October 1st of 1981. At this time I have no information as to the date.

Entry fee for the Bowhunter Tournament will be \$25.00, other special timed and skilled events will also be held. The tournament is to be restricted to 500 shooters the first year. More information will be published as soon as I receive it.

BOWFISHING PROGRAM

PATCH PROGRAM This program would consist of two different types of patches. One would be a regular shoulder patch denoting that you are a member of NFAA Bowfisher. The second NFAA Bowfisher. patch would be a bar type patch that would denote what types of fish you

have taken. Must Be A NFAA Member.

2. NFAA BOWFISHER OF THE YEAR

This program would have two winners. These winners would be the ones who shot the largest fish in either of two species. These species would be carp and gar. The awards would be plaques and would preferably be awarded at one of his state functions.

Rules are as follows:

Must be member of NFAA.

2. There will be two awards. One for gar and one for carp. There will be no charge for entering a fish.

4. Entry deadline will be Oct-

ober 1.

The entrant will furnish NFAA 5. with a picture of the fish next to a measurable object and a signed affidavit by two witnesses stating that they were present at the time of the weighing. Winners will be determined by weight.
6. All entries will be inspected by

the NFAA Bowfisher committee to determine the winner. The winners will then be notified by mail. 7. The winners will receive an en-

graved plaque.

3. NFAA BOWHUNTER RECORDS

This is a program where by NFAA Bowfisher keeps records of who holds the distinction of having taken the biggest fish of any certain species by means of bow and arrow. Rules are as follows:

1. Must be member of NFAA There will be no charge for

entering a fish

3. These records will stand for one year at which time the NFAA Bowfisher committee will review all entries and make all necessary changes to update the records list. If no records are beaten, they remain on the list for the next year. These changes will be done by the committee at the annual NFAA board of directors meeting.
4. Entry dead-line will be Dec-

ember 31.

The entrant must furnish NFAA with a picture of the fish next to a measurable object a signed affidavit by two witnesses stating that they were present at the time of the weighing.

4. \$2,000.00 NFAA SPONSORED CHAMPIONSHIP BOWFISHING TOURNAMENT TO START IN 1981 ON A 2 YEAR

TRIAL BASIS.

A. Any club or organization with five or more members can host two tournaments.

B. These will be two man team tournaments starting May 1 and ending July 10.

C. Each club will be responsible for its own advertising and tournament scheduling.

D. Each tournament will have a twelve hour time limit.

E. Participants do not have to be members of NFAAand are eligible to win either or both divisions. Divisions being carp and gar. G. Winners will be determined by the total weight of fish taken during a single tournament.

Entry fees will be \$10.00 per person per tournament. Fifty percent will be returned to NFAA to be used as prize money and fifty percent will be retained by the tour-nament host.

10. The bowhunter could be literally swamped with gun hunters with black powder weapons. Better to try for that buck with a black powder gun than to wait for gun season and let some other black powder hunter get him first. SAFETY IS THE MAIN FEATURE.

These are merely suggestions. It is not necessary to try and use them all in one letter. Write letter as an individual. This will carry weight and is necessary. The program by VBA will carry additional weight. Contact any and all bowhunters who are interested in bowhunting and have them write to:



Record Crowd of 184 Archers Attend State Indoor


