ONE ROBINHOOD FOR FOUR BOWHUNTERS

That is how we started this beautiful day in the first trophy shoot of the year. A new bowhunter in my group shooting his first tournament, his first target and wham-oo, a Robinhood. This was to be a day filled with firsts. I was also shoot-ing with a youth, that was a first for me, also his first tournament as a bowhunter. This was only the first half for his father was in our group, so that was the first father and son bowhunter team I ever shot with. Also, the father beat my pants off on the first fourteen, which was a first for him as I shoot "AA" while he is "A", but you wouldn't have known it. We had been shooting slow on the first fourteen, so as the groups thinned out in front of us we elected not to take a break but to continue shooting. Since we had a youth we knew we couldn't dilly dally as they shoot a maximum of 50 yds. We spent no time on lost arrows as we only missed one bale at 60 yds., that has to be a first for four bowhunters (only one missed bale). That was not our last first for the day. Just as our target captain laid our cards on the table he heard officials saying,"We don't the know whether to disqualify them or not." Our captain said, "No pro-blem, we are all in." Then the decision was made - we were dis-qualified. That was a first for all four of us. My only gripe is - if the decision wasn't already made, why disqualify us after we were in?

What greater contribution could you make to archery than to give that youth the benefit of the doubt. Our youth are the future of archery, if archery has a future. It is not my intent to discredit a club, therefore I have neglected to disclose the club's name. A far more important issue is at hand, with the general consensus, does archery have a future?

This particular club just reflects the attitudes of some other clubs, archers and the NFAA who make their rules and changes with little or no regard as to the effect it has on the present, much less the future. The only thing organized is we all get an NFAA card, which is hardly ever complete or accurate, and an archery magazine - and brother, don't hold your breath waiting on the next archery magazine. We have clubs that won't support other clubs because of such incidents as mentioned above.

A club used to take pride in having the largest number of shooters participating in any event, regardless of what club you were supporting. Some clubs support multiple and casual registration, some a starting and finishing time, some new distances on shooting positions; then there are some clubs who support more new classes, no new classes, elimination the 80w, 45w, 15 and bunny, eliminating the animal round, some bows being legal and some illegal,

different scoring systems for each shooting style and different shooting distances for each shooting style.

My fellow archers, if this is organized archers, then we had better reorganize. I don't mean more rules and regulations, I mean some things are made better by leaving them along. I believe archery would start to grow again if we took one giant step ... backwards, ten years!




Blackwater Bowhunters Club
