VBA STATE OPEN May 12 & 13

Sherwood Archers of Roanoke, Virginia will host the VBA State Open Championship Tournament at their range located 2.3 miles from I-81, Exit 41. A location map and a list of convenient motels are on page 8. An invitation is extended to qualified archers in Virginia and surrounding states.

Our 90 acre range has three beautiful courses. A 28 target field round will be shot May 12th and a 28 target hunter round on May 13th.

Classes will be recognized in all divisions including Competitive Free Style Bowhunter.

Camping space (no hook up) and hot food will be available at the range. Complete camping facilities are available at Sun Valley and Dixie Caverns. Archers desiring to camp at the range may call Range Captain Ralph Long at (703) 563-1840.

Registration fees will be \$8.00 per shooter and \$20.00 maximum per family.

The schedule will be as follows:

Friday, May 11 Registration: 6:00 P.M. to 9:00 P.M.

Saturday, May 12 Registration: 7:00 A.M. to 9:00 A.M. Starting Time: 10:00 A.M.

> Sunday, May 13 Starting Time: 9:00 A.M.

The VBA Open will be preceeded by Sherwood Archers Annual Dogwood Festival on April 28 and 29. Registration will be casual and multiple, shooting will begin at 10:00 A.M., Saturday. Directions and accomodations noted above also apply.

Plan now to help us celebrate the arrival of spring by attending either or both of these events.

NFAA Meeting Feb. 20-25 Denver, Colorado

Ervin Belt, the NFAA Executive Secretary has resigned and Jo Anne Hunnicut has taken over all the duties at headquarters. The biggest reason for this shakeup is based on mis-management of all NFAA accounts plus several smaller reasons.

A new accounting system has now been instituted utilizing a C.P.A. This system will provide a detailed accounting of all receipts and expenditures.

The Board of Directors Council has established a four person finance monitoring committee. This committee will consist of: Bennie Mooer, Wayne Sanderson, Bill Wadsworth and James Shubert. Their duties will be:

Review monthly expenditures of 1. the Association.

Approve the transfer of monies 2. between bugeted accounts. 3. Make a quarterly financial re-

port to all Board of Directors. 4. Have an annual continued

Have an annual certified audit.

5. Review and make recommendations of all salaries and employee benifits annually.

6. The Board of Directors Council will meet at the 1979 NFAA Championship Tournament and review with a report of the financial performance from February through July 1979.

This meeting will determine whether or not that a dues increase is or is not necessary, and if necessary, how much. At this time it is believed that a dues increase is required. The 1979 NFAA Championship

Tournament will be held at Detroit Lakes, Minnesota. The dates will be from July 23 thru July 27, 1979. Rumor is that it is a beautiful country, but it sure is a long way off.

All target faces and scoring will stay the same as it is now except most states are going back to the big indoor face versus the four face championship round. this is a state option therefore we can go along with the wishes of the people.

All amateur archers will be responsible for their own amateur status.

The pylon (or the "fly swatter" as it is more commonly known) will be allowed as long as it is not in the sight window. The fly swatter is legal on the bow that it is manufactured for.

A dropped arrow is one which falls while being transferred from the quiver to be nocked on the string or in preparation for a shot or which falls from the string during a controlled let down. A dropped arrow may be reshot.

Delete the shot arrow paragraph 12 in its entirity.

International rounds will be shot in the black face instead of the field face.

No written memoranda will be allowed in the Barebow or Bowhunter Divisions.

Juniors who want to shoot in the Bowhunter Division will have to compete against the adults. At this time there will not be a Junior Bowhunter Division.

The sight extension bar may not exceed more than five inches in any direction in the Freestyle Bowhunter Division.

The Fineline bowsight and zero sight are illegal in the Freestyle Bowhunter Division.

All members of a non affiliated state must apply through a neighbor-ing state of their choice in their section to be eligible for awards in a Sec-tional Championship. This also includes the Pros.

A Pro must stay a Pro for the full calendar year that he joined. He may not alter his status to win a particular event.

There will be an NFAA Indoor Championship Tournament in Omaha. Nebraska on March 8-9, 1980. More information on this will be published later.

VBA Meeting Highlights

Committee Chairman Dave Proctor reported that maps of range locations would be available to VBA clubs. This will prove to be handy for everyone as there are some new clubs in the state and some older clubs have been forced to move their ranges for various reasons.

The State Closed, scheduled for September 1 & 2 at Augusta Archers in Staunton will consist of a Field and Animal round (28 targets each) to be shot on Saturday and a Hunter round on Sunday (also 28 targets). The Pros will shoot a field round on Saturday and a Hunter round on Sunday. Shooting will start both days at 9 a.m.

The VBA membership now stands at 859. This is somewhat below past years and certainly needs to be improved. You have received election ballots by now. Voting deadline is June 15. Published in this Flight issue is a brief summary on each candidate so you can know them better. Please Vote.

The Pro Division has changed its rule regarding membership. You can now become a Va. Pro without having to join the NFAA Pro Division The dues are \$25.00 annually with \$10.00 going to the State Indoor and \$10.00 to the State Closed and the balance for operating costs. Dues can be paid to Nancy Lee Western, Corresponding Secretary starting immediately. We believe that by making this change in our rules we can increase Va. Pro Membership drastically. Clubs that wish to host a Pro shoot at their tournaments are asked to do so. One VBA club is already guaranteeing a Pro pot of \$185.00 at their annual in May. They have solicited businesses in their area for donations into the pot. Your area archery shops are a good place to start, but don't stop there! Any business that wishes to donate even just a little is helping the Pro division and the VBA to grow and all will benefit. The Va. Pro division is open to any man or woman in any division of shooting.

It was the general opinion of everyone who attenede the VBA meeting and of the ones who shot at the indoor championship in Christiansburg, that the 4-face indoor targets STINK!! It is believed that these targets have kept alot of people particularly Barebow and Bowhunter from shooting. Next year it is expected that we will be once again shooting the old 40cc indoor targets that were shot in past years. The Pros however will be shooting the 4-face target.

Two agenda items to be voted on at the June meeting are:

1. Scoring changed back to 5 and 3 for youth and below. (Loudoun Bowhunters)

2. Increase in shooting fees at the State open, closed and indoor. (Augusta Archers).



The State of Bowhunting In America Today

- You can bowhunt 365 days a year in Arizona, California, Iowa, Nebraska, and New Jersey.
- 19 states permit the hunter to take a deer with a bow and another with a gun. These Two-Season Hunter States are Alabama, Arkansas, Delaware, Georgia, Indiana, Maryland, Michigan, Mississippi, Missouri, Nebraska, New Hampshire, New Jersey, North Dakota, Oklahoma, Rhode Island, Tennessee, Vermont, West Virginia, and Wisconsin. Connecticut, Florida, Illinois and South Dakota are considering such a program.
- 25 states permit Late Bowhunting Seasons in addition to their regular early bowhunting seasons for maximum utilization of available hunting land.
- 33 states permit Spring Bowhunting for Wild Turkeys, 24 permit Fall Bowhunting for Wild Turkeys. Another 5 states plan on it in the near future.
- 32 states say bowhunter violations are less than gunhunter violations, 9 say they are about the same, and 7 don't know.




