# Report From Your VBA Hunting Vice President

JOHN STOCKMAN

Hunting Vice President, John Stockman wrote to the Virginia Commission of Game and Inland Fisheries asking whether two doe may be taken by a bowhunter in those counties with a two deer season bag limit. The answer from the commission was "yes". Furthermore, the commission said that if a bowhunter took a doe in bow season he could also take a doe in a two deer county during gun season when does were permitted to be taken by gun. One reason John wrote to the commission was that a state game warden told a group attending a Bowhunter Education Program that under no circumstances could a hunter take more than one doe a season in Virginia. In the Northern Virginia area, perhaps one reason this belief prevails is that Marine Base Quantico (a popular hunting area for Northern Virginians) allows two deer per season but only one can be a doe. Military reservations can make their regulations more restrictive than state laws. John asked the game warden at Quantico if he plans to change the one doe policy. The reply was "No". The game warden felt that the hunting pressure at Quantico justified permitting only one doe.

Further hunting news is that on July 28th at the invitation of the Commission of Game and Inland Fisheries, VBA members C.D. Tarter (conser-Continued on Page 6

Flight has developed this column for griping. As a beginning to my sound-off, I attended the quarterly VBA meeting recently in Charlottesville. There are 27 chartered archery clubs which belong to the VBA; there were 13 represented at the VBA meeting. This is less than onehalf of the clubs in our state that had someone there to find out what goes on and who makes the rules by which we must all abide. There was lots of enthusium at the meeting but look how much more could be created if each one of us would take it upon ourselves to insist that our club sends a delegate. (anyone from your club can attend as a guest). There are many items put on the agenda to be voted on at the next meeting. Does your club secretary or president (if you do not have a VBA delegate) report the VBA minutes to you, a copy of which he receives prior to the next VBA meeting? How did you find out about the "beer on the range" issue? From the minutes or by word of mouth? To be a strong association we all must become interested in what's happening. We all grip about what the VBA is doing to us, but the truth is - WE are the VBA and WE must not let half of our state organization speak for all of us.

Warwick Bowmen hosted the '77 state shoot. Because of their hard work and long hours, they deserved a huge attendance. Instead, they had 165 archers. This represents about

16% of the total VBA membership. What's wrong that our state championship can draw no more shooters than some clubs do at their annuals?

There was a conflict in one Women's Freestyle class- an uncalled for conflict, in my opinion. The rules were made at the last VBA meeting regarding class breakdowns and how the shooters would be classified after the first day. If each individual there did not know how they would be classed, then that's your fault for not getting this information prior to the state shoot. The classification break-downs should not have been any great surprise. Your VBA delegate was at the June meeting and voted on this issue, didn't he? And reported this information back to your club, didn't he? If the answer is no, then isn't it time you have a delegate attending?

My point is that we need more participation in our state association. EVERYONE, both officers and members, must become more active and take a greater interest in what's going on.

As assistant to Flight editor, Norman Sparks, it is very disgusting and disheartening to see the lack of interest among clubs for sending articles into us. No one has the right to complain about the articles or pictures published in Flight unless they are willing to contribute better. Ever since Norman became editor, he has asked each club for interesting stories or pictures from club events. Has your club responded to Norman's plea? Flight, like VBA, is only as good as you help to make it.



## The Bowhunter

John Locke is a VBA Member and gave permission for this reprint.

Between the time a kid picks up his first bow and dies an old bowhunter, we find a most unusual kind of guy. They're found in camouflaged shirts and wool pants and all of them have the same idea-to hunt everyday: to enjoy every minute of every hunt; to protest violently at the slowness of the approaching dawn and give up reluctantly when the sun sets.

Bowhunters are found most anywhere. . on mountain top ridges, in swamps, alder thickets, in sporting goods stores, archery shops, treestands, sneaking out back doors and telling lies at the office to get off work early. He is truth with freezing feet; beauty in camouflage paint; wisdom in a rainstorm and hope with nature as his god.

When you have work to be done, he's thinking of arrows, broadheads, bows, antlers or game trails. When you want him to make a good impression, he may talk of his best hunts, the season to come, taxidermy work or the biggest buck he's ever seen. He has the enthusiasm of a kid at Christmas, as he looks over a ridgetop for sign and when his big chance comes, he has the imagination to explain why the arrow fell off his bowstring.

He likes wool clothes, waterproof boots, dry feathers, razor sharp broadheads, camouflage of all sorts, crisp mornings, frequent holidays, hidden swamps and questionable characters who claim to be better bowhunters than himself. He is not much for dancing, posted land, fluorescent vests, shaving, certain card games, soap operas, weekend company, short seasons, dieting in camp or late sleepers. Without thought of background, position or economic status, he likes people who bowhunt four or more months a year and talk about it the rest of the time.

Nobody else in the world is so early to rise or so tired to get home. Nobody else can get so much enjoyment out of a thermos of hot coffee and cold peanut butter sandwich. No body else suffers so silently with chapped lips. Nobody else can cram into one pocket, two tubes of camouflage paint, a spare bowstring, extra smokes, three candy bars, gum, lifesavers, a container of insect repellent, a map, compass, a squashed sandwich, ball of string, spare wet matches and a busted bottle of deer musk. You can't help but like him. He can stretch a weekend into five days.

And although you may lose patience with him in the fall every year, there's something about the guy that rings as true as a shiny new aluminum arrow. He's an honest and kindly man who asks only of life that the bucks grow big racks, that he gave them a fair sporting chance, and that God will let him come back to the ridges again next year.

vation Vice President), John Stockman (Hunting Vice President) and Dave Watson (an energetic and active Bowhunter Education Program advocate) traveled Bristol, to Virginia to explain the NFAA Bowhunter Education Program to Commission personnel. The objective, goals, course content, teaching techniques, and instructional aids were discussed. The information was enthusiastically received by Commission personnel who requested that VBA Certified BEP instructors conduct the Bowhunting portion of the Hunter Safety Courses sponsored by the Commission. At present about one hour of the Hunter Safety course is reserved for Bowhunting. The feeling was that the VBA instructors would probably be better qualified to instruct the Bowhunting portion of the Hunter Safety course than anyone else. This would provide an excellent opportunity for the VBA instructor to invite attendees who were bowhunters to participate in the NFAA BEP course at some future date. John Stockman has provided a list of certified BEP instructors to the Commission. Commission Safety Officer James Kerrick said he would contact instructors who lived in the areas in which he was conducting Hunter Safety Courses and ask them to assist him. Instructors may also be asked to conduct a course for State Game Wardens. Several wardens attended the seminar and were anxious to attend the course prior to hunting season.
