



## HANDICAP IN EFFECT JANUARY 1, 1969

### I. HANDICAP SYSTEM

#### *Broad Recommended Guidelines*

Statement of Policy—It is felt by the Executive Committee of VBA that there should be broad guidelines to assist in implementing the Handicap System, realizing that there will be many unforeseen circumstances and situations that may need further clarification. In this respect we offer the following recommendations:

1. It is recommended that, for purposes of competition, males should **NOT** shoot against females.

2. It is recommended that any one flight consist of all styles of shooting, i.e., Barebow, Free-style, Bow Hunter, and including Amateurs. (see \*2)

3. It is recommended that Youth have their own flights. Youth handicaps figured on adult ranges will be separated from those figured on the modified Youth range (former B&C classes.) When Youth reach the proficiency of a 170 handicap or lower, they will shoot on the adult range.

4. It is recommended that scratch scores be used for the championship flight. Registration for this flight will be voluntary. (Scratch scores are raw scores with no handicap added.)

\*2 Realizing there may be some inconsistency between VBA recommendations and the "NFAA Handicap System" booklet, in the interest of statewide uniformity this recommendation will need to be given a fair and just trial.

6. It is the consensus of the Executive Committee that VBA should provide a maximum of four sets of distinctive award pins, in the new design form, for issuance at shoots. These award pins will be provided in first, second and third places for each flight. (see footnote).

### II. PINS AND MEDALS

The Executive Committee recommends that a new award pin be designed and that VBA purchase the dies for manufacture of these pins. (Cost of die estimated at \$85.00).

### III. FINANCIAL INCOME (1969)

The Executive Committee recommends that VBA dues for new members be increased, effective in 1969, in the amount of \$1. Further, it is recommended that this \$1 increase apply to all individuals joining or renewing VBA membership on or after January 1, 1970.

### VII. INDOOR STATE TOURNAMENT

#### *Recommendations:*

1. Handicap system to be used.  
2. Require seven scores to develop archer's handicap.

3. Team participation will be stressed.

4. Individual's scores should be attested by club secretary prior to date of shoot.

5. Awards prior to date of shoot.

5. Awards to be given on team basis—type to be determined. Some individual awards may be given.

6. Strongly encourage advance registration. Recommended fee—\$16 per team, or \$18 per team for late registration.

7. VBA should receive \$1 per shooter registered.

8. Host club should have option to provide awards for out-of-

to provide awards for out-of-state teams.

9. A team is made up of four shooters.

(Footnote to agenda item I. It is the understanding of the Executive Committee that each club secretary has been provided a copy of the "NFAA Handicap System" booklet.)

## WINGFIELD WINS OVER BOYLE

The National Field Archery Association elections have concluded with Pat Wingfield, Salinas, California the victor over William Boyle, New York and Don LaDuke, Michigan. Wingfield will officially take the helm of the 37,000 membership organization on January 1, 1969. The duration of the term for serving as president of the N.F.A.A. is two years. The new mentor of the N.F.A.A. has previously headed the California State Archery Organization for the past two years. He resides in Salinas, California with his wife and three children. He is a partner in the Peninsula Typewriter Company of Salinas which serves the Salinas and Monterey area with office supply equipment. Wingfield has been in this field for the past fifteen years.

When contacted about his victory in the N.F.A.A. election he was enthusiastic about the office he will assume the first of the year.

"There are many areas in which our association can improve to better serve the membership," Wingfield commented. "A good strong legislative program, building program, and a means of obtaining a self-owned publication for the association are just a few of the needed improvements in this united organization of field archers. With the backing of my fifty-four man Board of Directors, I feel sure the next two years can be productive in strengthening the association and we can most certainly accomplish the goals which will champion the N.F.A.A. as the most influential speaking voice of the archers of the United States.
