

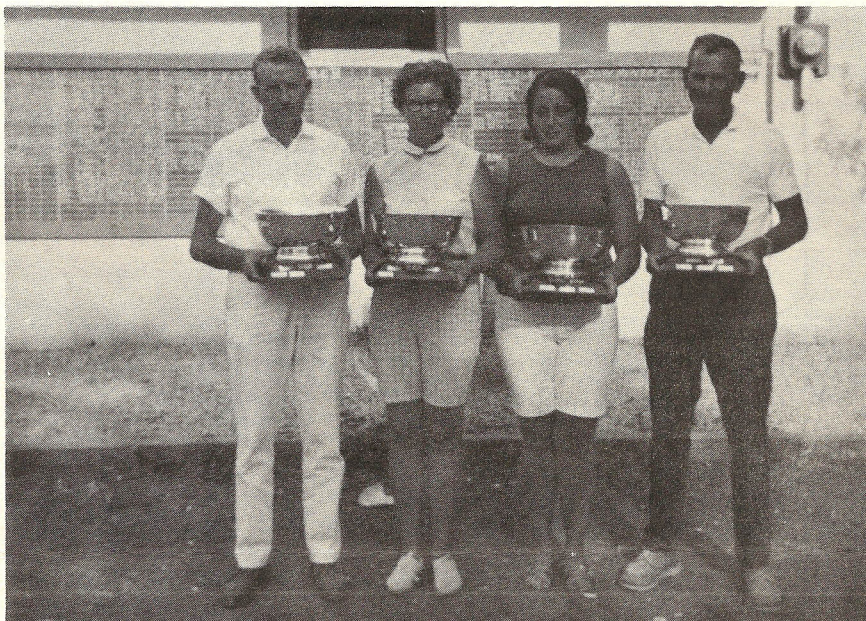

Warren T. Cowles, from Northern Va. Bare Bow, took an early lead in the field round with a 492 over the 1966 champ, Thomas Frye of Leesburg, with a 474. Cowles held the lead to win the championship with an aggregate of 1487 over Thomas Frye's 1479.

Penny Shannon didn't play second fiddle this year. With a 1124 aggregate, she is now in the number one spot and champion of the Women's Bare Bow Division.

Last year Penny was second to Mary Lee Craft, who was champion for the seventh time in 1966.

Clifford Necessary didn't play third

this year, either, like the true champ he is. He took the men's Freestyle with flying colors.

In the Women's Freestyle Division, Naomi W. Fox with a 1110 in 1966 for third, became number one champ this year with a 1204.

In the Women's Bowhunter Division, Mary S. Hodges held first all the way.

Youth Division winners were: Bare Bow Boys, John D. Hoover; Bare Bow Girls, Shirley Perdue; Freestyle Boys, Jeffrey Stanley; Freestyle Girls, Karen Taylor.

ARCHERY SEASON

Archery season for deer, bear, and squirrel will begin October 16 and extend through November 15. During this period archers may kill one deer a day, 2 per license year (either sex) in counties with a two deer limit; or one per day, one per license year (either sex) in counties with a one deer limit and game taken is to be included in the total permitted for the license year. Regular bag limits apply on bear and squirrel.

Two special hunts for Sika Deer are scheduled for the Chincoteague National Wildlife Refuge in Accomack County. An Archery season will be held October 11-14 and a season for bows and arrows is scheduled for October 20-21, the bag limit will be one a day, one per license year, either sex. Deer taken on this hunt
