No Distances Marked

There will be no distances marked or made available to the archers in any manner.

Such was the decision of the NFAA Field Governors on the recent question sent to them for their votes. The question voted on follows:

"Shall the distances between the shooting position stake, or stakes, and the target, or targets, on any course used for an NFAA registered tournament or for classification purposes, be made available to the archers in any manner."

A two-thirds majority vote was required to carry the question. The 2/3 vote necessary was 11,336 votes. The question carried with 11,419 votes against 5,369 votes sanctioning the marking of distances.


Annual Shoots

Is Your Club Guilty Of This Crime?

Out of the 46 affiliated clubs in VBA only two clubs had contributed any money to the Conservation Fund reported at the last VBA meeting. As of January, 1960 only \$29.00 had been received from Clubs in the state for conservation purposes.

It has been suggested in the past that each Club hold a conservation shoot and that the proceeds be turned over to the Conservation Fund through your VBA Treasurer.

Field Archers Safety Code

1. Always call "timber" before starting to shoot as a warning to others who may not have cleared the shooting line or target area.

2. Always leave one member of your party standing in front of the target while you are looking for lost arrows as warning to others following on the course. If you are alone, leave your bow.

3. Never release an arrow when you cannot see where it will land; never "flight shoot" an arrow in the woods. Never shoot straight up.

4. Never shoot a broken arrow. Inspect each arrow carefully as you retrieve it.

5. Always have your arrows marked with your name and address.

6. Remember at all times that bow and arrow is a deadly weapon, as dangerous as a gun in the hands of an irresponsible person.

7. Never attempt to demonstrate your skill by using a person as a target, or by permitting another to hold the object at which you shoot.

9. Protect your sport by being careful and sure when you shoot.

From The Editor

Another tournament season is under way and should prove to be the biggest year in the history of the VBA participation wise. This season will see many changes in our rules and regulations and they will have a major effect on every archer in the state.

In this issue of Flight you will find two very important articles, one, on the new standards adopted for course approvals and another on the proposed requirements for obtaining and maintaining a VBA club charter. Both of these rules additions are needed if we are to have a strong state association and afford the archers participating in sanctioned tournaments the protection they should be able to expect while at these tournaments.

The matter of requirements for obtaining and maintaining the club charters is of vital importance to all of us. Read these requirements carefully and look at them not as to what they will do to your club, BUT, what will they do to the whole VBA. I know that this is difficult for a person to do but in this case it is necessary. If you want a strong state association, which we must at all costs have, then we must accept the fact that we cannot give charters to clubs who do not meet with rigid requirements. The VBA is no stronger than its weakest club.

On another subject of vital importance I wish to acknowledge the receipt of a clipping from the Newport News Daily Press sent to me by Arthur F. Low of the Warwick Club. The column written by Mr. Eddie Edgar known as Fins, Furs, and Feathers has the following on the Warwick club. "Peninsula sportsmen are missing many benefits by not belonging to a national conservation organization.

There are a number of excellent sportsmen's clubs in Newport News and Hampton, but few have statewide or national affiliation.

This column has urged such affiliation many times in previous years.

Now more than ever, organization is necessary to achieve results. Our democratic government is based on rule by majority. The group that represents the largest number of voters usually has its way.

This is a period of big business, powerful labor interest, and potent lobbyists. Individuals, without organization, speak only in a whisper.

There are two major national conservation groups—the Izaak Walton League of America and the National Wildlife Federation. The only Peninsula group, to my knowledge, affiliated with either is the Warwick Bowmen who belong to the Virginia Wildlife Federation through membership in the Virginia Bowhunters Association." The Warwick club was very pleased with the mention of their organization in the article and applauded

CONDITIONS PERTAINING TO THE ISSUANCE, OPERATION AND MAINTAINANCE OF CLUB CHARTERS

1. Prospective groups desiring a charter for a club under the auspices of the Virginia Bowhunters Assoc., Inc. may obtain an application form from the V.B.A. corresponding secretary.
2. The application will contain the following requirements:
 - a. Endorsement of a sponsoring club, signed by its president and secretary.
 - *b. Charter fee of _____ dollars.
 - *c. The minimum V.B.A. membership necessary to qualify for issuance of a club charter shall be _____ members.
 - d. Range facilities and course approval by the Field Governor or his representative will be necessary.
 - e. V.B.A. membership dues must accompany application. (all members).
 - f. Signature of acting president and secretary with mailing address and range location.
3. Upon issuance of charter, club will be privileged to:
 - a. Refer to itself as an affiliate with V.B.A.
 - b. Attend V.B.A. official meetings with voting privileges.
 - c. Conduct V.B.A. sanctioned club tournaments.
 - d. Compete in State Tournaments as team or individuals.
 - e. Members will receive issues of the official V.B.A. magazine "FLIGHT."
 - f. All other miscellaneous privileges afforded V.B.A. members.
4. Maintainance of club charter:
 - a. Club charters will be issued annually.
 - b. Range facilities and course reapproval will be required.
 - *c. Have minimum of _____ paid up members.
 - d. Meet requirements by Feb. 1st, each year.
