



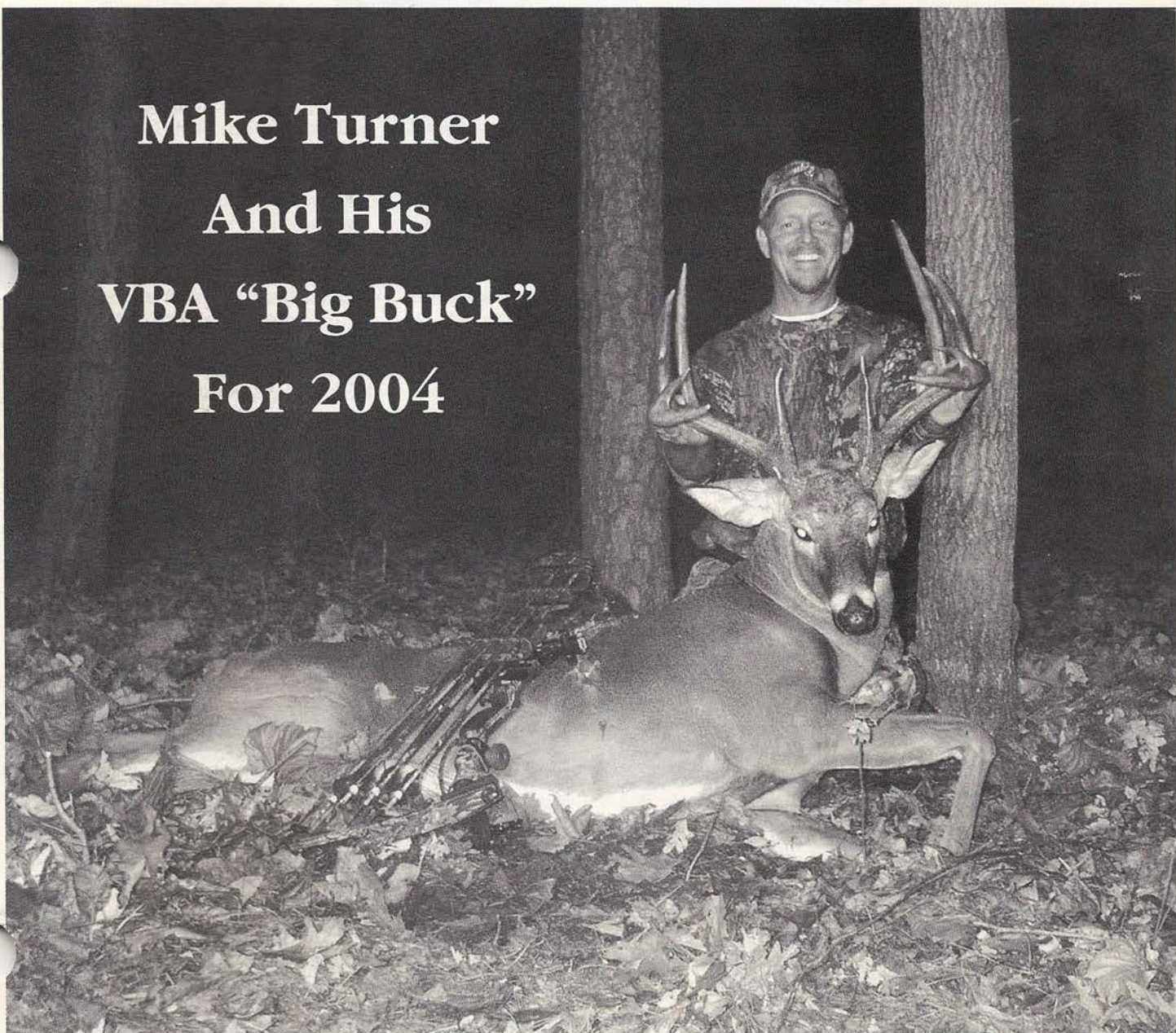

From The Publicity Director

Hello, everyone. In March, I celebrated my 60th birthday and some of my friends said that I was getting 'old'. But, there are others that are way ahead of me. Take Vic Matthews, who turned 84 in March. Vic started shooting in 1969 and still is even at the NFAA National level. Then there are Nancy Lee and Clinton Western. In December, they celebrated their 55th wedding anniversary. In April, they celebrated 50 years of both being involved in archery with the VBA. Like others, we may be getting older, but will archery get older? Archery was here before some of us were and it will continue. We have seen a decline in membership over the past years, but we are not the only state that has had a decline. And why? Just think of the other sport activities that kids are involved with. We as archers need to continue to let our community know about archery and the archery education programs we offer.

If you were not able to attend the VBA Tenth Annual Awards Banquet, you missed a very nice evening. First, our guest speaker Monty Browning was once again fantastic. Monty told us about his past experiences and adventures. Monty revealed some unbelievable experiences while bowhunting in Canada. If anyone ever came close to God, he did with his bear experiences. Our Triple Crown winners were Jarett Frame, AMFSL and Mark Gallimore, YMFS. Our Double Crown winners were Chris Willard, AMBB; Lindsay Lavenhar, YAFFS; and Sara Lavenhar, YFBB. We also had two Big Game winners with the display of their trophy bucks. The clubs that had the most increase in membership were Manahoac Bowmen with a 50% increase; Shawnee Bowmen with 19% increase and Shenandoah County Archers with 141% increase. How did Shenandoah do this?

For those that volunteered and dedicated their time to the Archery Village for the Ducks Unlimited Great Outdoor Festival last September, I presented a Certificate of Appreciation to Rich Atchison and Dave Burpee from Belvoir Bowhunters; Wayne Chadwick from Dixie Bowmen; and Victor Barnett from NORVA. Lastly, but most importantly, was the presentation by Clinton

Western to our Order of the Golden Feather honorary recipients, Dave Burpee and Paul Vogel. Congratulations to all of you!

At the VBA State Indoor, we had 112 archers competing with each other in their styles. There were 27 young archers that had as high scores as some of the adults. This seems to stem from Paul's "Archery FUNDamentals" classes. Everyone had a great time and those that went to the new Belvoir Indoor range were amazed.

For our VBA members who attended the NFAA Indoor, following are the results. Robin Vogel placed second in AFTRAD; Patrick Vogel was National champ in YAMFSL; Sara Lavenhar was National champ in YFBB; Cay Core placed sixth in AFBH; Rick Stark set a new world record in AMBB with 297 points out of 300; Darryl Diehl placed fifth in the ProFS; Matt Faulkner placed second in AMFS; in AMTRAD, Carl Lattimer placed first and Paul Vogel placed second; in Amateur MFS, Ken Norris placed first, Robert Kenley placed second and Joel Hugill placed third. In Amateur MFSL, Danny Baird placed first; Steve Oldham placed first in SMBHFS; in YAMFS, Alex King placed first, Dave Colbert placed second and Kevin Bradford placed third. Lauren Norris placed first in YAFFS; Colton Bednaski placed first in YAMFS; and Lucas Kenley placed first in CMFS. As for Vic Matthews, he was able to support everyone from the bottom up!

At the recent VBA Quarterly meeting, there were two decisions regarding issues with the Virginia Department of Game and Inland Fisheries that are very important to all citizens and hunters in Virginia. The first decision authorized VBA support for an investigation by Governor Warner or his selected representative. The investigation would center on the Board of Commissioners of the Game Commission and the VDGIF to determine if there was any misuse of funds, their policy and/or law violations. The second decision established VBA support for additional discussions regarding the use of crossbows during the archery season before rules and regulations are established by the Board of Commissions and the VDGIF. My Adventures With Porcine And Porcelain

My adventures started right off before I even was able to leave home. I had a hog hunting trip to Texas planned and was really looking forward to the trip. Santa had brought me a new bow for Christmas and I was itching to try it out on some game. I was to meet my buddy in San Antonio who had gone down there on business three days earlier. Our outfitter would pick us up at the airport and take us to Cinco Cattle Ranch two and one half hours southwest of San Antonio. The ranch is located right on the Rio Grande River.

My first "adventure" occurred while loading up the car for my trip to the airport. I felt a sudden urge and made it to the porcelain throne just in the nick of time. I figured I was playing Russian Roulette by getting on an airplane in my condition, but I didn't have much choice with a big snow storm due to hit in a couple of hours, there was no telling when I would be able to get out of town. I made it all the way to the ranch without any further "adventures". I even hunted Saturday afternoon, but the wind betrayed my position to the hogs and javelinas that I saw.

Saturday night the "adventures" really got started and for the next two days I stayed real close to the porcelain throne. Things got so bad that my "GOOD BUDDY," Bob Seltzer, moved out of our cabin and into another cabin, leaving me to suffer alone.

After two different kinds of



medicine, and lots of it, we finally got the porcelain adventures stopped. By Monday evening I was ready to take a chance and go out and try some porcine adventures. I went and checked out a couple of stands. The one I liked best had the wind blowing wrong to hunt there. The stand I did hunt, the wind changed just as the hogs arrived and away they went with no shots taken.

Tuesday morning the stand I hunted had some hogs come in at daylight and it was a full 30 minutes before I was able to get a shot I was comfortable with at the boar I wanted, and as an hunter once told me, "The hair carried the meat away." Hogs one, Jack zero; things were not looking good for the new bow. Tuesday evening I was able to hunt the stand I liked best though the wind wasn't great; I did have some hogs come in late, but once again, "the

hair carried the meat away." Hogs two, Jack zero. I was blaming my earlier "adventures" for my poor shooting; it had to be that, because it couldn't be the bow or me.

Wednesday morning I hunted the stand that I had hunted the morning before in hopes of redeeming myself, but all that came in were deer, including a very nice eight pointer with a broken tine, and lots of turkeys.

Wednesday evening I went back to my favorite stand, this was my last chance to redeem myself. At about 5:15 a nice boar came in with 5 smaller hogs.

Every time I drew my bow, he would move or another hog would walk in front of him blocking my shot. Finally he got in the clear and I was able to send a 700 grain hickory arrow into his heart. He raced off for about 40 yards crashing into a tree and that was it. The new bow and the shooter redeemed themselves.

Bob was hunting with a new bow, also, and he seemed to be having the same problems, but we each managed to bring a hog home.

The porcelain adventures started out bad, but the porcine adventures turned out good!

Results Of The Quarterly Meeting

- VBA to remove the position of Field Governor from its slate of officer by June 2005. **FAILED**
- VBA to hold a contest to design a patch to be awarded to State Champions. Guidelines to be: Patch no larger than 4"; patch not to exceed seven colors; patch to include VBA logo; patch to include words State Champion. Winner will receive one year free VBA membership. Design to be submitted by the June VBA meeting and voted on by the September meeting. **PASSED**
- Amend Standing Rule 14, first sentence, after the words "whitetail deer, black bear, or turkey" add the words "in any state," to be effective September 2005. **PASSED**
- VBA officers and/or Tournament Committee assist with the registration and running of state shoots, i.e. registration, grouping of archers and target assignment, and tallying of scores. Effective January 1, 2006. **FAILED**
- All current VBA ranges have an initial range inspection ASAP this year. Thereafter, range inspections for all new ranges, ranges that have made changes, or within 30 days prior to a State Shoot as needed. All ranges should be re-inspected every five years. **PASSED**
- Prince William would like to have the Flight magazine sent out to be downloaded from the VBA website instead of mailing. Effective September 2005, **FAILED**
- Amend Standing Rule 14 or make a new rule by adding: "The VBA big game contest for whitetail deer, bear and turkey will be for game taken within the State of Virginia. Effective September 2005. **PASSED**

does not object to the use of the crossbow during the firearms season, but does have a serious concern about safety and other issues related to crossbows used during archery-only season. All clubs were urged to send a representative to the meeting that was held on Thursday, March 24th to voice their concerns.

Since then, the VDGIF has appointed Sherry Crumley as the new chairperson succeeding Daniel Hoffler, who resigned. The board voted to form a committee to investigate all allegations of financial mismanagement and ethical conducts.

Also, at the VBA meeting, Bob Seltzer mentioned the Pope and Young Crossbow Policy statement published in their Spring 2005 issue and quoted here:

"The Pope and Young Club was founded to promote bowhunting and to record for posterity the outstanding examples of North American big game animals taken solely with the hunting bow.

"For the purpose of the Pope and Young Club, a bow shall be defined as a longbow, recurve bow or compound bow that is hand-held and

hand-drawn, and that has no mechanical device to enable the hunter to lock the bow at full or partial draw. Other than the energy stored by the drawn bow, no device to propel the arrow will be permitted. Consequently, the Pope and Young Club do not consider the crossbow to be a hunting bow and will not accept any trophies, collected by crossbow hunters. Further, the Pope and Young Club consider the use of crossbows during bowhunting seasons to be a serious threat to the future of bowhunting. The Pope and Young Club therefore recommend the crossbow should not be considered for use in any bowhunting only season. Also, the Club strongly recommends that crossbow hunting be abolished from all existing bowhunting only seasons and the use of crossbows for hunting is restricted to firearms seasons."

Once again, I'm reminding everyone about the Second Annual Ducks Unlimited Great Outdoors Festival that will be held June 17 - 19 at the Virginia

Motorsports Park. Show times are Friday from noon to 6 p.m., on Saturday from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. and on Sunday from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. All volunteers are asked to sign up for 12 hours and attend one of the two orientations. Orientations will be on Sunday, June 12 at 2 p.m. and on Thursday, June 16 at 3 p.m. After each orientation, you will receive your shirt, cap, your pass (free parking) and wrist band. Food and drinks will be provided to the volunteers. For those that attend the orientation on Thursday, there will be an open party from 6 to 9 p.m. We, (I) need volunteers for the Archery Village. Promoting The Future

There comes a time when veteran archers must step up and promote the future of archery. Paul Vogel has combined with Fort Belvoir Morale, Welfare and Recreation (MWR) and a cadre of volunteer Belvoir Bowhunter Certified Instructors to promote our sport in Northern Virginia.

At his own expense, Paul has purchased a supply of quality bows, arrows, arm guards and supporting supplies to provide a training base for both Beginning and Intermediate Archery Students. Fort Belvoir MWR has also purchased training bows and supporting equipment and provides range facilities in support of the current 17-week block of archery instruction conducted each Monday night 6 to 8 p.m.

Beginning students are graduated to the Intermediate level when they have demonstrated proficiency in basic archery form, discipline and accuracy. Intermediate students develop skill in the courtesy and accuracy elements of competitive archery under match conditions. Physically handicapped students are included in both classes.

Stan Parmentier, Mike Brown, Bob Baird and Dave Hesaltine develop the Basic Students and pass them to Paul Vogel, Kay and Larry Core, Vic Matthews, Hank McGee and Robin Vogel for polish and development of a competitive attitude.

The newly completed Fort Belvoir Indoor Archery Ranges provide 12



lanes for Beginners, starting at five and 10 yards, while 18 adjacent lanes at 20 yards support Intermediate training. A 30-yard wall separates the two side-by-side ranges. The classes have grown during the winter to an average of 43 students each evening. A significant number of these students have registered for the 2005 VBA Indoor Championships. Students from the 2004 Classes progressed on to medal winning performance in the National Indoor Championships.

As weather improves, Paul will move his classes to the NORVA Outdoor Ranges to continue development of future archery champions. Paul also has a comprehensive program for loaning his equipment and vision to Scout Camps during the summer for development of archery skills and additional visibility of this beneficial sport among our youth.
