In February, we began with the State Indoors, hosted by Belvoir Bowhunters Sherwood Archers with a turnout of 120 shooters. Dave Dobbins shot a Robin Hood on Saturday, and Paul Vogel set a new State Indoor record for the traditional style. In the spring, NORVA will host the 3-D Classic on April 10 -11, and Sherwood Archers will host the State Open on May 22 -23. In the fall, NORVA will host the State Closed on September 4 - 5, and New River Bowhunters will host the 3-D Fall Classic on September 18 - 19. Throughout the season clubs will be holding 3-D, Field/Hunter and their club's Annual shoots. Before we know it, the bowhunting season will be here. The March VBA meeting was topped off with the VBA Awards Banquet, featuring guest speaker Carson Quarles, Chairman, Viginia Department of Game and Inland Fisheries Board of Commissioners. It was a great time for all, especially for our trophy bowhunter awardees and other prizewinners.

This year's VBA events will include many IBEP courses throughout the Commonwealth, which Al Baughman is busy coordinating. We encourage every member to actively promote VBA by distributing the "Bowhunters" brochure, participating in IBEP classes and getting involved by seeking new members and/or clubs. I myself will be attending the VDGIF program, "Becoming an Outdoors-Woman" (BOW) workshop in May, where I will assist in teaching two archery classes. I am also planning to attend the awards dinner for Hunter Education Instructors, as archery is one of the subjects covered in the course.

In case anyone has not heard, we need to recognize one outstanding individual who will be stepping down as NFAA Director - Clinton Western.

Cay McManus will succeed him in June. Good luck, Cay, and you have our support! Clinton has dedicated many years to VBA, not to mention his expertise and excellent work. Another individual deserving of recognition is our Executive State Secretary, Ann R. Boyd. Ann continues to do a super job in her expedient processing of all the necessary paper work, answering inquiries and keeping us all on course! Her helping hands go to our clubs' secretaries for their cooperation and timeliness. Guidelines For Increasing Membership At State And Club Levels

1. Each club is encouraged to produce a brochure, similar to the VBA brochure to distribute locally. The club brochure should be designed to highlight the club, its activities and affiliations. The purpose is to make the public aware that the club and VBA exist in that area.

2. Research and develop opportunities to sponsor archery events specifically targeted toward youth groups (at both state and local levels). This will take dedicated individual effort to identify and have the groups commit to an archery program. Some groups that may be approached are:

a. Boy/Girl/Cub Scouts

c. 4-H Clubs

b. Churches

d. School athletic directors

3. In order to start a program for youth groups, archery equipment will be a major requirement. Clubs may be able to obtain the basic equipment by petitioning the following for donations and sponsorship of these programs:

a. Local archery/pro shops b. Individual archers

c. Archery manufacturers

d. NFAA (should be approached by VBA)

Hunting Lease Liability Insurance

A company known as Forest Landowners Association, Inc. has provided information regarding liability insurance for hunting leases. Limits are one million per occurrence/two million aggregate. Medical payments for \$1,500 is also included. Annual cost is 17¢ per acre leased, plus \$80.00 membership for the club and landowner. Please call 1-800-325-2954 for information or applications. Policies are effective August 1 to July 31.

IBEP Classes

Dates are now being finalized for our 1999 IBEP classes. Student courses will be held at Fort Belvoir, NAS Oceana and Harrisonburg. If you are a VDGIF Hunter Education Instructor, the student course will also be available August 28 at the advanced training workshop in Appomattox.

- 4. Clubs need to generate more input to the *Flight* publication. Each club should try to submit at least one article with pictures annually. Highlighting club events not only advertises activity, but also encourages future participation.
- 5. News releases should become automatic and routine at each club
- a. Contact local media (i.e., newspaper sports departments, TV(cable, radio) about shoots and other events being sponsored or organized by the club.
- b. Recognize local archers accomplishments at state and national level.
- 6. VBA should establish an "800" telephone number to encourage calls by interested potential members.
- 7. Each VBA head of household will automatically receive a VBA window decal upon joining or renewal of membership.
- 8. Direct marketing should be accomplished through contact by the VBA with Bowhunter/Hunting magazines and publications that distribute in Virginia.
- 9. VBA to begin mailing brochures directly to game check stations throughout Virginia prior to the beginning of hunting season.
- 10. Establish a "new" VBA brochure specifically directed toward the bowhunter.
 - a. "Why we need" them to join VBA.
 - b. Benefits of joining VBA and what we can do for them.
- 11. Develop a VBA youth recognition award program in conjunction with numbers 2 and 3.


