



## From The VBA Executive State Secretary

By the middle of December, all club secretaries should have received the necessary papers for the 1999 club charter renewals and dues collections. If you are no longer your club's secretary, please forward all the forms mailed to you to the proper person, or contact my office immediately.

All VBA dues expire on December 31 of each year. Members who are NOT planning to shoot in competition may join only the VBA through your local club. If you shoot in competition for awards, for example in the State Indoor, Open, or Closed, it is *mandatory* that you hold a valid NFAA membership card.

Club secretaries are asked to return *all* forms issued by my office to me before the January 25, 1999 deadline. I must have all club renewal charters (NFAA will mail you renewal forms before the end of this year), all your club officers dues, and a copy of your

club's constitution/by-laws, if changed. I must have all these necessary forms before I can process your club's recharter application. Return all papers at the same time to my office so as to avoid confusion. Nothing is mailed to NFAA except insurance payments. Make all checks payable to the Virginia Bowhunters Association, Inc. If I do not receive all the necessary forms from you at the same time, everything will be mailed back.

Lend your club secretary a hand by paying your dues early and getting new people to join your club and VBA. Our club definitely needs increasing and we are all responsible for the growth of VBA.

I wish all of you a safe and happy holiday season. I am always available in the VBA office to assist in any way can. Feel free to call upon me at time.

## Membership, A Problem We All Need To Work On

Over the last ten years VBA membership has steadily declined. There may be many reasons for this, but we know what some of the primary ones are. The numbers of bowhunters (persons purchasing archery licenses) in Virginia have declined at about the same rate as our membership. We have lost large clubs in high-density areas such as Richmond and Tidewater. We were slow to accept and foster 3-D as an integral part of the VBA. Also, and probably most importantly, we have not done a very good job of promoting ourselves.

It's time to start turning this around. Hopefully we will see a completely new approach to archery beginning at the quarterly meeting in January. The Executive Board has developed some deas including a new brochure that all help us promote our organization. What we really need, though, is your help. We need every member to actively seek out other archers and promote

the VBA. Encourage new membership. Learn more about your organization so you may tell others what the VBA has accomplished over recent years and what it continues to do to support archery and bowhunting in Virginia. Most of all we need your participation in the process of "re-growing" the VBA. Your involvement and ideas are instrumental to what we can accomplish. If you're not interested, why should anyone else be?



It's time to put any differences or disagreements in the past where they belong. We need a strong VBA to take archery and bowhunting into the new century, to work with the state government and agencies in presenting our interests, to educate bowhunters throughout Virginia through the National Bowhunter Education Program and to "Protect What's Right."

There are still more than 55,000 archery licenses sold annually in Virginia so there are a lot of prospective new VBA members and old members who haven't belonged in awhile for us to recruit from. Be prepared to do your part. Provide your ideas and actively seek and encourage others to join your club and the VBA. Participate in "re-growing" the Virginia Bowhunters Association. Hope you all enjoy a Happy Holiday Season and are looking forward to a healthy and prosperous 1999.







## The Pembroke Farm Buck

the dream buck was hidden behind the stand of willow trees. I had heard him crunching the white-oak acorns. Finally I saw his white antlers bobbing up and down as he enjoyed his late afternoon snack. He slowly moved toward a small opening that might give me a long-awaited shot. I had been bowhunting since 1969 and so far had only killed two small sixpointers. The opening just wasn't quite large enough to shoot through, however it did give a good look at the antlers. He definitely was a "fall-out-of-treestand" deer as I called all large-racked deer that I had seen taken by other bowhunters. Another five yards and he would be out from behind the trees. I held my breath as he approached the open area. He seemed relaxed and unaware of the danger he was approaching. As he finally stepped into the opening, he picked up another acorn and looked directly up at me! I froze, hoping my full camouflage was working well enough to confuse him. He looked down, picked up another acorn and again looked at me. I saw him tense up and thought he would bound away, only leaving me a story

about "the big one."

Then I heard another crunching sound from somewhere behind this deer. Another deer was following him. Again the antlers were bobbing up and down like the first deer. He was also a large animal. He moved faster than the first deer into the first small opening and I saw that his horns were large, but not as symmetrical as number one. Now I had a dilemma — which one to shoot!!! In twenty-nine years I had never seen a rack this large and now two of them were tempting me. I decided very quickly that whichever one gave me the first opportunity would be my target. The first buck seemed to relax when the deer behind him didn't seem to sense the danger. I judged that he was already thirty yards away. A long shot — but it was open all the way. He quartered away from me and I put my twenty-five yard pin on the top of his back, picked a spot and mentally tried to relax and squeeze off the shot.

My heart pounded as the two deer ran right up to the ridge, then to the left after going over. I listened as I thought I heard an arrow rattling through the trees. Damn, maybe I missed and the arrow was ricocheting through the tree limbs. Maybe some limb that I didn't see had deflected the arrow to a harmless ending wrapped around a tree. I sat down to let my heart calm down. I waited fifteen minutes, just in case the noises had fooled me. I put my climbing spurs on and gently climbed down the tree. I approached the spot and saw no blood on my arrow. I then spotted my nock about ten feet from the fresh panic hoof marks on the ridge. I looked up from the nock and saw the first sign of blood. An apple-sized blotch, bright red, gave me encouragement. Another six feet away I found a second spot the size of a pencil eraser. Then nothing! I gently walked in small half circles hoping to find another sign. It didn't look good. I slowly walked in ever larger semi-circles, hoping for another sign The light was fading. Finding nothir decided to go to the house and, help from my son, Lon. Perhaps with good light we could pick up the shiny signs just after dark.

After picking up my bow and bag, I decided to walk back along the ridge where I had last heard them running. I could not believe my eyes when about thirty yards along the way I spotted him down and obviously not able to rise. He had passed. I spent a moment in appreciation of his majesty. He definitely was a wall-hanger. He had ten points, evenly spaced and very symmetrical. I knew the work had just begun as I was about a half mile from the truck. I went home and brought Lon back to help me bring him out of the woods. The game check station said he was the largest they had seen this year. He measures 23" outside and should make the 125 minimum score for Pope and Young.

It was a very successful hunt which ended in the harvest of a magnificent buck. I have decided to have him mounted and will see how he sco against the other trophies taken in state. The taxidermist has promised to have him ready for the VBA banquet in March 1999. Look forward to seeing you there!







## **Burgundy & Spice** Venison Pot Roast

1 3-4 lb. venison round roast 2 cloves of garlic sliced salt, black pepper all-purpose flour 1 small yellow onion, minced 1/4 cup safflower oil 2 Tbsp. butter allspice ground cloves cinammon

Make deep cuts in venison and place a slice of garlic in each cut. Rub the roast with salt and pepper. Dredge the venison in flour *after* salting and peppering it. Brown venison on all sides in oil and butter in Dutch oven.

Brown minced onions in small amount of safflower oil and place browned onions on top of browned roast. Sprinkle roast with a dash each of allspice, cloves and cinnamon.

Pour Burgundy or other red wine over the venison roast. Cover and simmer on top of stove for two to three hours, or until tender. Add more wine if needed. Remove roast to a warm oven. Reduce pan liquids to make gravy. Slice roast and spoon gravy over the slices.
