



#### International Bowbunter Instructor Course

On April 22 an International Bowhunter Education *Instructor* (IBEP course will be conducted at the Lynchburg Chapter of Izaak Walton, Amherst County.

IBEP instructors are needed to present the basic IBEP course to bowhunters throughout the State. Although the basic course is not currently required by the State to bowhunt, some military reservations and other facilities within the State do require it. Additionally, several popular bowhunting states require the course before they will issue a bowhunting license. Thus, there is a growing demand by Virginia bowhunters to attend the course.

The requirements to become an instructor are: an unquestionable record as a top quality sportsperson; minimum 18 years of age; hunted big game for at least 3 years; completed basic IBEP course; completed IBEP instructor

exam; completed Virginia Hunter Education Instructor Application; agree to undergo a police background check.

The course is free of charge. Lunch and refreshments will be available. The course will start at 8:00 a.m. and end at approximately 5:00 p.m.

Directions are as follows: From Rt. 29 North at the edge of Monroe (Amherst County) turn onto Coolwell Road (Route 604). Go approximately three miles and turn right onto Izaak Walton Road (Route 663). At 3/10 mile, you'll see the Chapter grounds on the right.

I then gave up tournaments and went back to bowhunting only.

In 1989, I joined Kingsboro Bowmen and began shooting tournaments again, first in 3Ds and then in NFAA field tournaments. I currently shoot in A class in the low 500s. I have been a staff shooter York Archery from 1990 to 1992 and helped introduce their equipment to Eastern Virginia. I have also been a staff shooter for Darton Archery up until this year. I have also been on the Eastern Archery's program and a staff shooter for Beman Archery.

I am also an archery range safety instructor for the Parks and Recreation Department, City of Suffolk, at Lone Star Lakes.

## From the Hunting Vice President

#### ramblin 'round

Well, we have another hunting season behind us and at least eight more months to suffer through until the next one. Have to find some way to keep in practice and stay proficient. There is a way we can all stay busy and stay proficient and that is to become involved at our local archery club. That involvement is also what keeps us abreast of what is going on pertinent to hunting laws and legislation regarding archery. Speaking of involvement, I hear from the Game Department that the purchase of archery licenses was down for the second year in a row but, there were still over 63,000 licenses sold. Likewise our VBA membership is down again. Still, with 63,000 bowhunters out there it seems we should be able to increase our membership over what it is currently. We should be able to carry membership of at least 10% of the ensed bowhunters. We obviously are ot doing something right either at the

local level or at state level or both. What do we need to do to increase our membership rolls?

The deer harvest this year is up again but I personally saw fewer deer than I have in the previous five years. I also was not in the group of successful hunters this year for the first time in ten years, another reason I can't wait until next season. Thank goodness for hunting partners, at least I have venison in the freezer thanks to my partner who harvested several this year. We do have quite a few successful hunters in the VBA judging from the number of Bill Bennett Award applications we've received. While our membership is down these applications are up. Remember those applications are supposed to be in within 90 days of harvesting the animal. Also if you still haven't received your plaque or pin from last year or this year then make sure your VBA club representative

comes to the VBA meeting or contacts me to make arrangements for getting the awards. Speaking of awards, the largest carp and largest gar contest was over in October (entries had to be in by the end of October) and the winners are Russ Hatchl with a 30 plus pound carp and Greg Hise with a 15 plus pound gar. Greg and Russ are both members of Belvoir Bowhunters and will receive plaques for their efforts. We only had one gar entry and four carp entries, hopefully we'll see more entries this summer.

How many of you are attending the VBA Awards Dinner? Hopefully by now you've heard about it and are planning on attending. This Dinner was planned and programmed as something specifically for the bowhunter. Hope to see you there.

- 5. Withdraw use of Unit Rule at all sanctioned shoots except Annuals. (Failed)
- 6. Any Club declining to host a State Shoot after being awarded this event, shall be removed from bidding on State event for a 2 year period. (Tabled next meeting)
- 7. Motion that VBA oppose the "new" target system at the NFAA Annual meeting and continue use of the present 5, 4, 3 system. (Passed)
