IBEP Update

Congratulations to our seventeen newest IBEP instructors! These individuals completed the certification workshop in Lynchburg on July 25! Regional coordinators will receive an updated list as soon as the background checks are completed.

If you think you would like to become a certified instructor, please call Al Baughman for more information – 804-525-7427, after 6 p.m. There will be a minimum of two instructor certification workshops for new instructors next year. One will be held in Lynchburg in March, and another in Harrisonburg in June. A third may be held in the Richmond/Virginia Beach area if there is sufficient interest.

As of this printing, eight IBEP student courses have been held across the state. Another seven are scheduled between now and the end of October. Please note that a class has been added at Fort A. P. Hill on October 24 from 9 a.m to 5 p.m. There is no fee, but preregistration is required. For more information, call Terry Banks at 804-633-8255.

Looking Ahead To 1999!

At the September VBA meeting, each club will be asked to consider sponsoring an IBEP student course in their community for 1999. Class attendance may be increased by inviting a pro-shop or non-VBA 3-D club to co-sponsor with you. There are sufficient instructors within the five regions to assist you with your class. Clubs will be asked to respond to this challenge by calling Al Baughman with their dates by October 31. We are timing the publication of our schedule to take advantage of "freebie" advertising offered by other organizations and publishers.

In 1999 we will be hosting several activities designed to recognize IBEP coordinators and instructors for their volunteer efforts and to provide them with some of the newest instructional techniques. These activities will include a coordinator's planning meeting, IBP instructor advanced workshop, an instructor recognition at our March VBA Banquet. Activity dates will be published in the Winter issue of *Flight*.

A few words about several topics will serve to address the main issues on our plate now. Please feel free to call me or the Chairman of the Hunting Committee, Steve Lowe of Cherokee Archers, if you want additional details about any topic.

New Deer And Fish Award Forms

The VBA has a new form you can use to submit deer for the annual awards competition. First, second and third place winners will be awarded in the categories of largest buck by weight, largest rack, and largest doe by weight. We have also revised the carp/gar form to include skate/shark! All awards are presented at the Annual Banquet in March. Hopefully these new forms will increase substantially the number of entries. Let the competition begin!

Bill Bennett Award

In addition to the new form for the er trophy competition mentioned ove, we still have the Bill Bennett award to recognize success in harvest-

ing a deer, bear or turkey. Submit your form early, and then be sure someone from your club attends a quarterly VBA meeting to pick up your award! This year I finally completed a two-year backlog of award presentations caused because club reps had not been at the meetings to pick up awards for their members.

Rack Scoring Class

The new award form mentioned above is one initiative to increase competition in our deer hunting categories. Another initiative is to conduct a class that will enable us to have persons around the state who will be able to score deer racks by the Virginia System. In the past, lack of scorers has limited the entries in this part of the competition. A class will be conducted at 11:00 am on September 26 at the Best Western Mount Vernon Inn in Charlottesville. All clubs (and certainly each region) should have one or more persons attend. The class shouldn't last more than an hour.

VDGIF

The next meeting of the VDGIF Board of Directors is in late October. Let me know before September 26 if you have topics you want brought to their attention so it can be discussed at the VBA meeting first. Also, I'm sure you are all aware by now of the favorable results regarding HR 38. Thanks for your support and congratulations on a job well done. Finally, the VDGIF has tabled any discussion or work on the issue of Sunday hunting. We will monitor future meetings and keep you informed if the topic should arise again.

Salt and Pepper Crusted Venison Backstrap

2 teaspoons pepper 1 teaspoon salt 1 teaspoon dried rosemary 1 large garlic clove, minced 1 lb. of venison backstrap 1 tablespoon olive oil

Cut venison backstrap in two pieces and tie together at 2" intervals with kitchen twine. Combine pepper, salt, rosemary and garlic in small bowl. Rub over venison and let stand at least 15 minutes. Preheat oven to 400°. Heat oil in heavy medium oven-proof skillet over high heat. Add tied venison and brown on all sides and ends. Transfer skillet with venison to oven and roast until venison is cooked to medium rare. Turn occasionally, about 20 minutes. Slice and serve. Serves two to four.
