From the Office of the NFAA Director

1990 was a year spent writing countless letters and spending countless hours on the telephone, in my attempt to persuade the other NFAA Directors to help us in our struggle to remain with the NFAA. There were times when I felt totally alienated in my endeavors. There were often times when the thought of just giving up was really inviting. I agreed to another term in this office for only one reason, to see a conclusion, one way or another, to the "mess" the VBA was faced with.

The big news from the 1991 Annual NFAA Meeting is that the Virginia Bowhunters Association as well as all other states who do not want to participate in a Direct Billing Program with the NFAA, now has a choice. In short, this means that money collected for VBA dues will stay in Virginia where it belongs, it also means that the NFAA handicap cards will again be issued from the office of the VBA Secretary instead of NFAA headquarters. When you receive your NFAA handicap card each year, it will again have listed the last seven scores you shot for the last 12 month period. The issue of Mandatory Direct Billing has been laid to rest. The NFAA through action of the Board of Directors, has returned the NFAA to a Voluntary Billing Program, a program that will benefit all in the NFAA.

In January at the VBA quarterly meeting, I was asked by the Directors of the VBA if I thought the decision made by the NFAA Council in 1990 which forced a Mandatory Direct Billing Program on all of us could be reversed. I responded that I could not nor would not go to the Annual Meeting in Nevada 1991 if I thought that the outcome of a year's worth of work on my part would end in failure. I have always believed that the VBA was in the RIGHT in our stand against the way the Council had forced a decision upon us concerning the Billing Program. I also felt that the other NFAA Directors from the other state associations would not want to see the NFAA lose such a valuable asset as the VBA has been to the NFAA, over a forced decision by the NFAA Council. When the vote came down on the Friday morning of the Annual Meeting, the outcome was the only one that I had allowed myself to accept. A VOLUNTARY BILLING PROGRAM WAS ADOPTED, again, BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE NFAA. We the VBA had won. We could continue doing business with the NFAA in the same manner that has made the VBA

in 1990 the SECOND LARGEST NFAA MEMBERSHIP STATE IN THE NATIONAL FIELD ARCHERY ASSOCIATION.

WE ALL CAN NOW GET ON WITH THE BUSINESS OF SHOOTING FIELD ARCHERY AND ENJOYING THE CAMARADERIE OF OUR FELLOW ARCHERS.

I have not published anything in FLIGHT in the past year because of all of the turmoil between the VBA and the NFAA. Starting with this issue, I intend to have something in each and every FLIGHT edition from now on.

As I stated before, Virginia had the second largest number of NFAA memberships in the NFAA for the last few years. I believe that the increase in NFAA membership in Virginia, during a year when there was so much animosity between the NFAA and the VBA, helped our case when the vote came down from the other Directors of the NFAA.

To those VBA members who kept their membership in the NFAA, I thank you for your support. If I did not believe in what the NFAA can do for the VBA membership and the Archery Hunters in Virginia, the fight to keep the affiliation would not have been fought by me.

To those VBA members who have not seen fit to join the NFAA, I strongly urge you to do so this year. Your membership in the NFAA not only will help your State Association in their endeavors with the NFAA, but will also help in giving support to an organization well equipped to fight the gaining numbers of anti-hunter groups here in Virginia. I've heard it said before that the only reason to join the NFAA in Virginia is so that an individual may shoot competitively in the VBA sanctioned shoots. This is as far from the truth as you can get. True, you must have the NFAA membership to shoot in Virginia, but I believe the reason to join a national organization such as the NFAA, is to show your support to the very reason we all support the VBA, to protect our hunting rights in a time when more and more pressure is being put on our legislators to ban hunting in one form or another through out the country. THERE IS STRENGTH IN NUMBERS. UNITED WE STAND. DIVIDED WE FALL.

IF YOU ARE NOT ALREADY A MEMBER OF THE NFAA, SEE YOUR CLUB SECRETARY TODAY AND JOIN IN THE FIGHT TO KEEP OUR HUNTING RIGHTS INTACT.

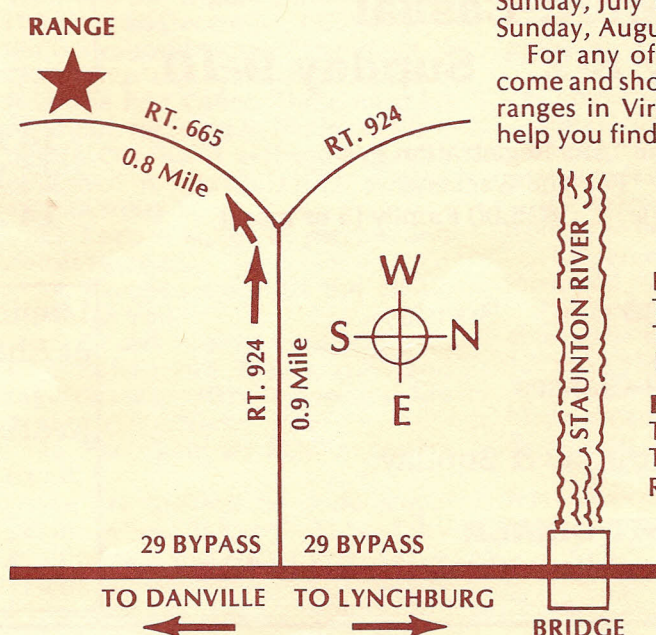

1990 Virginia Bowhunters Association Bowhunting Statistics

If you were a typical VBA bowhunter last season the following statistics would have applied to you.

You would have taken a 4 point buck that field dressed 95 pounds. You would have shot the deer at a distance of 21 yards from a tree stand in late afternoon. Your equipment would have been a 66 pound compound bow, aluminum arrows, and a 125 grain Thunderhead broadhead.

The above composite was developed from analyzing the data included on the 234 applications for Bill Bennett Big Game awards for deer. Following is information compiled from the applications for 234 deer, 4 turkeys, and 3 black bears.

Number and percentage that were does: 103, 44%
- Field dressed weight of deer:

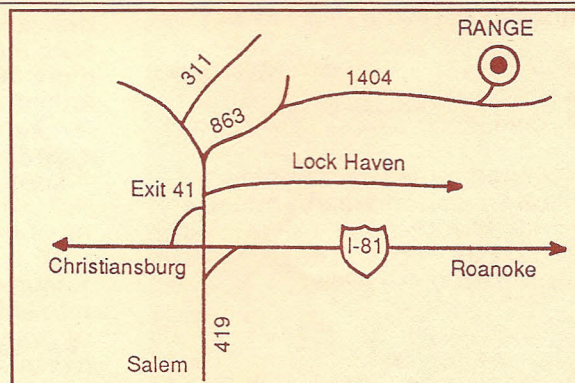

Applications Being Accepted for Office of Corresponding Secretary

Effective following the March, 1992, VBA meeting, your present Corresponding Secretary will be retiring. Resumes are now being accepted and should be sent to this office and should include qualifications and references. A successful applicant will be appointed by the Executive Committee as set forth by the VBA Constitution, Article 4: Government, Section 5-b, and Article 5: Election and Term of Offices, Section 2.

The Corresponding Secretary is the Registered Agent for the Virginia Bowhunters Association, Incorporated and is responsible for filing the Annual Report with the State Corporation Commission before April 1 of each year.

Other duties are as follows:

1. Collect all funds and deposit them in the Signet bank. Mail the Treasurer a copy of the deposit ticket and receipt. The Corresponding Secretary is bonded.
2. Furnishing necessary forms for rechartering clubs (Dec. 5 of each year) and to new clubs who wish to affiliate according to the Constitution.
3. Use "List of Club Officers" returned with Charter Application and compile the "VBA Affiliated Clubs", list which lists presidents and secretaries with their addresses and phone numbers. This list is sent out with the January VBA minutes.
4. Prepare Charters and give them to all clubs present at the March meeting. Mail remainder.
5. Process members—new and those renewing. Since VBA dues expire December 31 of each year, January is the busiest time for processing members. There were 1,192 members processed this past January. Since NFAA has changed their expiration date, it is necessary to issue both a VBA and a NFAA card. Dues and members are sent to NFAA at least twice a month.
6. Record all field and hunter scores shot in competition. Collect the 25 cent shooters fee.
7. Process applications and mail out 20-pins. A supply is kept in stock.
8. Close books one week before the VBA meetings in January, March, June and September and send a written report to the Treasurer showing the current status of membership and cash receipts. Before the June meeting it is also necessary to compile an annual report. The Corresponding

Secretary has a petty cash fund of \$300. A statement of expenditures (to the penny) must be sent to the Treasurer to be reimbursed.

9. The Recording Secretary mails a copy of the minutes to the Corresponding Secretary within 30 days after the quarterly VBA meeting. The agenda for the upcoming meeting is typed and copies of the agenda and minutes are made and mailed to the Club Presidents, Secretaries, Committeemen and VBA Officers 30 days before the next VBA quarterly meeting.

10. Attend the quarterly VBA meetings and the three (Indoor, Open and Closed) State Tournaments.

11. Every two years (uneven) ballots are mailed within 30 days after the March meeting for election of officers, to every member. If there is only one person running for each office, no ballot is mailed. Ballots are returned to the office of Corresponding Secretary and taken UNOPENED to the June meeting.

12. FLIGHT is received in boxes from the printer. Labels are run off on the computer, separated by zip code and counted. They are then put on FLIGHT and tied up in bundles according to postal regulations. The form, "Statement of Mailing Second-Class Regular . . .", must be filled out and accompany each mailing. Issues are mailed in February, April, June, August, October and December. The smallest mailing is in February (1,000 copies February, 1991) and the largest is in December (1,840 copies December, 1990). In September you will receive "Statement of Ownership and Circulation" papers from the Post Office. These must be filled out, returned to the Post Office before October 1 and must also be published in the first FLIGHT printed after October 1.

13. Keep a supply of patches and decals in stock.

14. Correspond with the NFAA office for VBA.

15. Be able to answer questions on Constitution and Bylaws, rules and regulations or refer the person to the proper VBA Officer.

16. Keep a supply of all necessary forms.

We are looking for a dedicated person who will hopefully hold this position for more than a year or two. Typing is essential. It is necessary to keep dual records, computer and

paper. Only one of these reasons being computer down time, which happened for 3 weeks.

In our opinion, this job is too time consuming for anyone who has outside employment.

Clinton and I feel it will be necessary for the new Secretary to be a guest in our home to observe and assist with the actual mailing of FLIGHT, processing of memberships, etc.

• Comparisons to 1989:

The average length of shot remained unchanged at 21 yards. In fact, ten years ago it was 21 yards.

The average bow weight increased from 64 to 66 pounds.

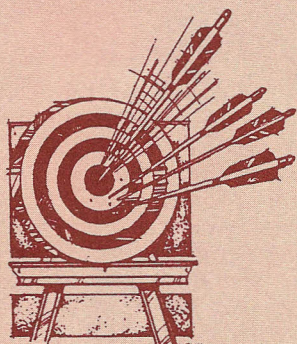
The percentage of does harvested increased by 10% from 34% to 44%.

The most frequently used replaceable blade broadhead remained the 125 grain Thunderhead.

The most frequently used fixed blade broadhead remained the Bear Razorhead.

The percentage of VBA bowhunters using compound bows remained unchanged at 99%.

The number of successful female bowhunters increased from one to seven.

Virginia Bowhunters Association Fall Rendezvous

The 1st annual Virginia Bowhunters and Sportsmans Rendezvous will be held on August 9, 10, and 11 at Maury State Park in Buena Vista, Virginia, located off I-81 and I-64 near Lexington.
