Bowhunting Bushytails

A s I placed my bow into my old Jeep, my mind wandered back to my first squirrel hunting trip with my big brother. I was only 12, and my brother realized that the hunting action needed to be fairly quick to hold a youngster's attention. Not exactly big game, but it was my introduction to hunting old bushytail. Now, 30 years later and after all the big game hunts I've been on far and near, I'm hunting squirrels again. Only this time it's with a bow, which is very challenging to say the least.

Squirrels can be found in nearly every part of the United States. In some regions old bushytail has become a pest to farmers and homeowners, creating more crop damage than even deer. Nuts are a mainstay in a squirrel's diet, but he also eats tree blossoms, buds, fruit, fungi, corn, and occasionally, eggs and baby birds.

On a recent trip, it was still dark when I quietly slipped into the woods bout a hundred yards and sat down on a log until first light. My first task would be to find a good food source for squirrels. Late summer usually brings plenty of white oak acorns and hickory nuts; find them and old bushytail won't be far off. I walked a little and found a hickory tree with cuttings littering the ground and I knew I'd hit a honey hole. I watched the tree and tapped on my Knight and Hale squirrel call a few times. A squirrel answered immediately. I couldn't see him, but I heard him about twenty yards to my left. I reached for an arrow, and as quickly as I nocked it, I locked in on my small gray target and sent the shaft flying his way. He was the only squirrel I got that day. I had other chances and missed them, but thoroughly enjoyed the day nonetheless. As that example points out, the key to successful squirrel bowhunting is to hunt not only by sight, but also by hearing.

In the early fall, squirrels can be difficult to see due to the foliage, but as the leaves fall, bushytails are easier to ocate. Binoculars are a valuable tool or scanning the surrounding area before venturing out; squirrels have excellent eyesight and will always spot your movement first. In fact squirrel hunting and spring gobbler hunting have many similarities. I use many turkey hunting tactics for squirrels. Methods used include calling, sitting and watching, slowly stalking; all these techniques can be used for either hunt.

Stalking is my favorite which entails moving slowly from tree to tree; walk a few steps and listen for a minute or two, and most importantly listen for the rustling of leaves. Think of it this way — if you move 100 yards an hour, you're moving too fast. Of course, stay out of leaves whenever possible to keep the noise down. Surprising a squirrel is the order of the day. But remember the noise of the leaves that may give your location away will also announce the presence of a squirrel.

Stationary hunting, waiting for bushytail to come to you takes much more patience. Calling is helpful when stationary hunting, as you can bring the squirrels to you, possibly taking several before moving to another location. When calling squirrels, the one call that seems to work best is the bark or "quack." This bark has given many bushytails' whereabouts away, giving me an opportunity that I wouldn't have had otherwise. When using a hand held call, cup a hand over the barrel's end to adjust sound and pitch.

After shooting a squirrel, sit still and wait; many times there are more than one. Squirrels are quick to notice any

movement and will race off if spooked. If this happens, mark the spot visually where a squirrel was last seen and wait. It won't be long before curiosity will get the best of old bushytail and offer you another shot. If he goes behind a tree, throw a branch or rock to the opposite side of the tree; a squirrel most likely will circle back into view. I've seen a squirrel flatten his body against a tree trunk or branch and not move until the hunter leaves. This is where the buddy system works well; one hunter on each side of a tree. If you connect, it's important to be absolutely positive the squirrel is dead before reaching for him, as you might get a nasty bite. One time I touched a squirrel that I thought was dead, and the animal viciously bit the end of my arrow.

Regarding equipment, just about any bow that you use to hunt big game will do nicely on squirrels. I use a metal blunt mounted on a four-fletched flu-flu arrow. This type of arrow with high-cut feathers travels only 50 yards before landing, and makes arrow retrieval easier. Fletch arrows with bright colored feathers, so they will be easier to locate after a shot. Steel blunts are usually available at most archery shops, or make your own from empty rifle or pistol cartridge casings.

In many areas of the country squirrel season opens before big game season, affording an archer an excellent opportunity to hone bowhunting skills. Take the comment of Tom Frye, Archery Shooters Association World Champion and Shooter of the Year (1993) (Traditional Class) for example says, "I've bow-hunted squirrels all my life. Before the season opens, I practice with my bow by shooting at walnuts in a tree near my home. A walnut is about the size of a squirrel's head, and I always aim for the head."

As you can see these fast little critters can be a formidable challenge for archers, and I don't know of a better way to sharpen bowhunting and stalking skills. Bowhunting squirrels is greatly satisfying and can put your hunting skills to the test. And it adds many hours of enjoyment afield before the big game season opens.



Nothing is to be mailed to NFAA except insurance.*

I hope all members will work toward the growth of VBA as we need teamwork in order for our sport to grow *in all ways*.
