

# **No Boaring Hunt**

"What's the game plan?" I asked Ken Martin, part owner of Boar-walla Lodge. "No plan, we just walk and hunt," he said. After a lengthy get-together with the other hunters at the lodge, fellow bowhunters, and members of The Traditional Bowhunters of Virginia, all agreed this was a well-deserved break from our jobs and shoveling snow all winter.

The boar hunt would take place in the beautiful Allegheny mountains, 14 miles south of Covington, Virginia, where the scenery brought back memories of my hunts in Colorado. Although not nearly as large, the Alleghenies have their own unique

beauty and ruggedness.

The next morning found four middleged men climbing ip a very steep hill. Hearing a very muffled huffing sound, I asked fellow bow hunter Jack Denbow of Purcellville if he it heard also. "Heard it? That's me!" said Denbow. Not long after we topped the hill, a huge boar jumped out of its bed and took off like a scalded rabbit. This hunt was definitely going to be more of a challenge than I thought. Fifteen minutes later we lined up along a well-used trail. It

wasn't long before a medium-sized boar came down a hill and cut through a briar patch twenty yards in front of us. Unfortunately a clear shot never presented itself, so Martin elected to push the pigs with a minidrive. Shortly after the drive started, eight pigs ran directly toward the waiting bow hunters, but stopped at a screeching halt at the sight of the hunter. Quickly scanning for the average barbecue pig, I made my choice and loosed my arrow in one split second. The shot was good and I collected a fine boar. Once again I have to stress that Boar-walla is as close to fair-chase hunt as one can get at a hunting preserve.

All animals run wild, and each hunter will have to work for his game. There are basically three ways to hunt pigs: spot and stalk, standing near a well-used trail, or a drive. Contrary to popular belief, pigs have better eyesight than most people think. Try moving with the approach of a porker. I'll guarantee, you won't make that mistake again. As with any game, hunt into the wind, pigs have a great sense of smell as well as hearing. Hunts are conducted year-round at Boar-walla, with the fall and winter months being the most popular.

The lodging and food at Boar-walla are extraordinary. I've traveled and hunted in many parts of North

America and can truly say the accommodations were exceptional. Partners Ken Martin and Betty Hawkins run their lodge with a commitment of 110% effort, providing the hunter with a unique hunting experience that will have you planning next trip vour before leaving for home.




