

VBA MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

To date, we have only 859 VBA—NFAA members and 2 clubs, Richmond and Flat-Top Archers, did not recharter this year.

Roger Firth, our Field Vice-President, reported he is going to reorder pins again; almost all of the original order of 1000 pins have been sold. Due to the ever increasing cost of shipping, all future pin orders to clubs will have the postage and insurance fees added. IF THE CHECK IS SENT WITH THE PIN ORDER, THEN THE CLUBS WILL BE BILLED FOR THE SHIPPING COSTS.

President Bill Enders accepted on behalf of the VBA an award from the Virginia Wildlife Federation presented to him by Game Biologist Jack Gwynn. The plaque was presented in appreciation for volunteer efforts on behalf of the Federation in futhering the cause of this state's natural resources.

Highlights of the NFAA meeting held in February were discussed by our NFAA director, Robert Cissel. In summary, Cissel gave the delegates, the following information:

In summary, Cissel gave the delegates the following information:

• The NFAA IS STILL IN A GREAT DEAL OF FINANCIAL TROUBLE AND HAVE HIRED A new executive secretary (but reduced other office personnel) who we hope has a good business management background and will be helpful in getting the NFAA out of the "red".

• We will no longer be getting

• We will no longer be getting "Archery" magazine from the NFAA. They have stopped printing "Archery" but important NFAA news will begin appearing in "Bow and Arrow" magazine, who has agreed to allow the NFAA to have a 4-6 page insert in that magazine bi-monthly.

• On the Sunday, prior to the 1980 Nationals, there will be a new type animal round shot for fun to see how everyone might like it. It will be 3-D free standing animal targets shot at unmarked distances, one arrow.

• The NFAA handicap cards are being redesigned. The basic changes will be that the handicap table will be deleted and a place will be provided for indoor tournament scores.

 Any club who might have an agenda item they wish presented at '81 NFAA National meeting, should be mailed to our NFAA director immediately. • At the Nationals this year, all flight awards will be presented at the tournament site immediately following the tabulation of scores. Only championship flight awards will be given out at the banquet. The senior division will now get awards.

• The NFAA is planning a nationwide raffle to help to overcome our present deficit. More information on the details of that when more is made known to

our NFAA director.

Most of the adgenda items taken to NFAA meeting from the Mid-Atlantic section were either defeated or else no action was taken on them. (Consult page 579 of meeting #93 minutes) Items 1,3,4,6,7,8, 10,11,12- no action taken. Item 2 was defeated while item 5 was passed and item 9 was upheld by R.I.C. Minutes of all VBA meetings are sent to your club president, club secretary, and most VBA delegates. These minutes should be discussed at your club meetings so everyone knows what is going on in our state and national association, ask the officers of your club why. If your club isn't sending a delegate to the VBA meetings, why not? And do remember this, NO VBA OFFICER has a vote at the VBA meetings, nor do we make the rules and changes in archery that are taking place.

You, your clubs, and your dlelgates are responsible for this. You are

the VBA.

Here are some rule changes or additions that took place. In CFBH, the peep sight or kisser button (you may use one, but not both) must be served into the bowstring so as not to be moveable.

Fifteen minutes will be allowed indoors for equipment failure without holding up the tournament. You shall be allowed to shoot missed arrows after end of final round with a maximum of 5 arrows.

The Zero Fine-line peep sight will be legal in CFBH Limited and

Unlimited.

In CFBH-Limited all rules will be listed in NFAA handbook. About the only rule change here is: the sight extension, sight body or any part thereof may not exceed 5 inches as measured on the horizontal plane.

The VBA strongly advises all clubs to start enforcing time limits

to help speed up rounds.

These are adgenda items which will be voted on at the June VBA meeting. Discuss each one carefully within your clubs and send your dlelgate with instructions on how to vote.





There were 43 applications received for the Bill Bennett Big Game award. Fourteen of the 43 applications were first time awards. The number of applications turned in for the 1979-80 hunting season (43) was down in comparison to the 1978-79 season (72). The average distance of the shot for last year was 23 yards. The most popular broadhead was the Savora Swept-wing, with the Satellite head following close behing. There were no bear kills turned in for the 1979-80 hunting season.

Two carp awards were given for 1979. First place to James Almond with a 33 lb. carp. Second place was to Al Sindlinger with a 31 lb. carp.

There will be an increase in hunting license this year. It will now cost you \$7.50 resident license and \$7.50 for the Big Game stamp.
