

From the Office of the President

"John's Kitchen"

It will be my practice, as President of the Virginia Bowhunters Association, to have published in Flight an editorial each time the publication goes to press. You may not always agree with what I have to say in these articles, but that is not my goal in writing them. The topics will be as varied as my imagination. The editorials will be my personal views. For those of you who do not think that I have a "right" to my own views, I say this now and only now-tough! I have taken the job in the "kitchen," and the heat is just fine. If it were ever to get too hot, I would, as I have expressed to other members of the Virginia Bowhunters Association, simply go fishing.

In my years as Club Director and Officer of the VBA, when the general blic talks about the VBA, they usualnean the Officers of the VBA. That's fine and dandy. Since most feel that way, I have instructed the Officers of the VBA starting in September, to become more involved in the policies of the VBA. Each Officer will have the opportunity to propose changes to the VBA Constitution and By-Laws as do the Club Directors. Once proposed, it will take a "second" from the Club Diretors to make the proposal the property of the Board. This will give the Officers input into the meetings. Instead of simply giving their reports, if any Officer feels the need to make changes, there will now be a forum for that Officer. An Officer of the VBA was elected by you, the members of the VBA, to be a "leader" of the organization. By doing as I have proposed, an Officer now has the means by which to lead. If you, the member, do not agree with the workings of a particular Office, it is within the Constitutional rights to have that person removed and new Officer installed. This way you as members of the VBA can become more involved.

As in the past, the Saturday night session of the VBA is usually reserved for the "informal" part of the VBA meeting. It is here that guests, Club Directors and Officers can bring up and discuss practically any subject. There are now two Quarterly Meetings that have the "formal" Saturday night sessions; the Saturday night in September, for scheduling, and the Saturday night in January for coverage of NFAA Agenda Items. That leaves only the March and June Saturday nights for our "informal" meetings. I do not believe that this is enough. Therefore, after the "formal" meetings in September and January, on Saturday night, the floor will entertain a motion at each meeting, to have an informal meeting afterwards. I feel that this is necessary, since the "formal" meetings of the VBA will be conducted formally. That is to say that only Club Directors and Officers of the VBA may address the Body. Guests will be welcome to sit on the outside of the table, but will not be afforded a voice. In the event that a Guest has been asked a question by the Chair, that Guest will be allowed to answer, but only then. Guests may get prior approval to address the Body from the Chair on specific issues. Prior means before the meeting begins. In an effort to get the

business of the VBA taken care of in an efficient manner, I believe this format is essential.

All committees will give written reports to the Chair prior to their reports at the formal meeting. If there is a problem with time, notes will be accepted, but a written report will be submitted at a later time. Without the written report of the notes, the committee report will not be given. Anyone asked to attend any function on the behalf of the VBA, will be expected to submit a written report to the Chair prior to the next quarterly meeting. Again the reasoning behind my "madness" is to get the business of the VBA done in an orderly fashion. Any guest that should be sitting at the formal part of the VBA meeting, will not be subjected to the "bickering" of VBA Members.

So that there are no misunderstandings between myself and the Executive Board of the VBA, I made clear my expectations of VBA Officers. One major change will be the presence of "ALL VBA OFFICERS" at the VBA State Championships, the Indoor, the Open, the Closed and the 3-D. Any member who wishes to address an Officer of the VBA will now know where and when he may find that Officer. Again the "kitchen" is where the heat is. And the "kitchen" will be open at all State Tournaments.







animated conversation over a hot cup of coffee and transitions into whispered words as the hunters slowly exit a vehicle and slip into the woods.

This time, however, the hunt was not for deer in the middle of November. Instead, it was a bow shoot for carp and gar in May.

The hunt was held at Fort Belvoir in Tompkins Basin on the Potomac River and was sponsored by the Belvoir Bowhunters. This was the fourth annual carp shoot sponsored by the club and was by far the most successful.

Steve Frank led all 16 shooters with six carp and four gar weighing a total of 105 pounds. This was the fourth year in a row that Steve has won the tournament

Richard Morris took second place with six gar weighing a total of

48 pounds. Third place was captured by Paul Vogel with four gar totaling 39 pounds.

Shooters formed two and three man teams that operated from personally owned boats or boats provided by the Ft. Belvoir marina. The motors authorized were those powered by electricity; gas motors of any size were prohibited.

The small entry fee covered lunch and formed the pool of prize money.

This was the best year in the history of the tournament in terms of fish seen, shot at and retrieved. Everyone saw plenty of fish and almost everyone had multiple chances to shoot an arrow.

The real winner of the day, however, was the crow that opened two packages of hot dogs and ate eleven before Bob Seltzer ran it off!

Come and warm up for deer season! Kingsboro Bowmen announces the opening of our 3D range at Lone Star Lakes in the Chuckatuck section of Suffolk. We will have two matches this year, both on Sundays, so as not to interfere with hunting time. The dates are September 26 and October 17 with registration from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. both days. There will be five divisions, elite, release, fingers, women and cubs (shooters through age 11). One place will be awarded in elite and unit rule to apply in all other divisions. One place will be awarded with 1-3 shooters; two places will be awarded with 4-6 shooters, and three places will be awarded with seven or more shooters.

Entry fee will be \$5. No broadheads on range; only target and field points allowed. Contestants may not use binoculars, or similar devices, or any range finding aid.

Join us in Suffolk this fall and have fun, even if you're not hunting this year!






Letter to the Editor

Bowbunters -"You Snooze, You Lose"

On June 18, 1993, the Game Commission added one week to the muzzleloading season to open the first Monday in November. They also allowed the muzzleloaders to use the sabot projectile. According to some experienced muzzleloader hunters, the use of the sabot is equivalent to the muzzle velocity of a 30,30.

The gun hunters have long coveted the rut season and they have now accomplished this fact. They now cover the pre-rut, active rut and the post-rut deer season. This action was taken by the Game Commission because you, the bowhunter, sat on your duff and did nothing to prevent this.

Many excuses are given for the lack of action, but you, the members of the VBA, should have known about it. The presidents of all affiliated clubs except to (no address on the VBA roster) re sent the names and addresses of the directors of the Game Commission with a cover letter explaining the situation and requesting that they contact their members and have them write the directors. The Bowhunters of Rockingham sent out 120 letters to their members requesting them to write letters to the commissioners.

There were three bowhunters from The Bowhunters of Rockingham and a non-member from Fulks Run at the Commission meeting. That was it. The results of the requested correspondence to the directors were practically nil.

Mr. Duncan, chief of the biologists, received 66 letters, of which 46 were opposed to the extended muzzleloading season. I do not know if he received all the letters from the directors, but Mr. Leon Turner stated that he had given Mr. Duncan copies of all the correspondence he had received.

I talked with Mr. Turner and he went through his file and he had received 11-12 letters concerning the muzzleloading season extension. Seven of those letters were from Bowhunters of Rockingham members and a letter from Kenny Sorrels, president of the VBA. I did not recognize the signatures of the remaining four. I did not have time to contact the other directors.

You, the members of the VBA, make



time to practice, attend tournaments and other activities, but you won't take the time to write a letter or letters to protect the hunting privileges you had. Lord help us when the anti-hunters get to bowhunting because you surely won't do anything. Just leave it up to someone else.

I realize that hunting east of the Blue Ridge is much different from west of the Blue Ridge. The pre-rut west of the Blue Ridge starts about the first week in November. This is when you generally see the first horned trees and the scrapes. This is the beginning of the prime time to hunt bucks. Prior to this time you see mostly does.

There was considerable sentiment in the Game Commission to split the muzzleloading season between east and west of the Blue Ridge. It all depended on the response from the bowhunters.

The extended week of bowseason was a sugar-coated pill to pacify the bowhunter. But west of the Blue Ridge, it is not worth diddley.

There is a good reason for the stagnation in the growth of the membership in VBA. I have talked to a number of bowhunters and their first question has been "What does the VBA do for the bowhunters?" In this case, NOTHING.






