Hunting and ...

It is close to deadline for the FLIGHT and I'm in one of those "writer's block" moods. I know you have never experienced such a frustration, but mainly it consists of the desire to write and the inability to think of a darn thing to put on paper.

So, what you will get is musings. About hunting and...

Life. I am thinking about life in the sense that it is too short. When we hunt, we take a life but we do it in a way that fits the natural order of things in a world that combines predator, prey, hunger, sport, ethics and a lot of other issues tossed into the mix. But, mainly it is about the life that we live as individuals and the opportunities we have to go to the woods or enjoy whatever it is about life that makes us smile. This week I'm not smiling much because our family lost a wonderful daughter, wife, mother, sister and sister-in-law after a long battle with a tough enemy. Thinking about her and the 54-years she spent making this world a better place for others is both a sadness and an inspiration. Details are not important for this article, but since we are talking about our precious time on this planet you could do a lot worse than living life to its fullest like my sister-in-law. She always put her religion, family, friends, community and kids at school far in front of her own needs and desires. I know each reader has a similar story in their own history, so why not take a moment to remember those who have passed, tip our hats to their example, and move on like they hope we have the strength to do.

Ethics. There are lots of ways to look at ethics and the ones that most often come to mind have to do with the ethics of doing the right things in the woods – even if no one is watching. I will push the envelope a little and say that hunting ethics begins long before the season sees its first day. For example, it is very ethical for a hunter to participate in the sport of indoor archery because the skills learned and practiced directly translate to skills used to harvest an animal. What can be more ethical than keeping sharp the ability to put an arrow into an animal in exactly the right place? So, the next time a hunter tells you that he/she does not have time to participate in indoor (or outdoor non-3D) archery, you can encourage them to join you on the range and sharpen their ethics.

Money. Ah yes, the thing of which we cannot get enough. But, what does money have to do with hunting? Well, a lot, it turns out, because obviously it takes a lot of the coin of the realm to get into the woods. Add up what a hunter spends on a hunting outfit (bow with attachments, arrows, clothing, treestand, licenses, etc., etc., etc.) and you have a considerable sum. I am not going to suggest that you can go hunting without spending money, but I do think younger hunters feel intimidated by what they see many of their elders spend. It is certainly OK to spend money on top-of-the-line "stuff," but it is also certainly not necessary. Many an animal has met its fate from a hunter dressed in jeans and tennis shoes hunting from a ground blind with a recurve. Often we hear people say that it is not about the harvest but is all about the hunt. They are right, and it is OK to remember that when visiting your local sports emporium.

Gadgets. Talking about money leads naturally to talking about gadgets. In fact, many guys I know live by the motto that "He who has the most when we die wins." One member of a hunt club in Northern Virginia is well known for his use of and knowledge about gadgets. A highlight of the club year is his annual presentation about new items on the market – seems like he owns or has field tested EVERYTHING. He is the first to tell you, however, that gadgets have their place in hunting but they should not replace the hunt. His emphasis is on the hunt, and he incorporates gadgets to help. Unfortunately, we all know at least one person who has that equation exactly reversed. Gadgets become the Holy Grail and the focus on the conversation. The actual hunt itself revolves around the latest scent dispenser, rangefinder, treestand, clothing, hearing assistance, pop-up tent, boots, bow, lighted arrow nock, -- and the list goes on. Remember, people used to do this with a sapling, gut cord, turkey feathers, and branch with a stone tip while dressed in a loin cloth. Sort of makes the rest of it seem -- if not silly -- at least interesting.

So, live life to the fullest and be an ethical hunter who treats money with respect and gadgets with a sense of caution.

5. Combine the Field Governor's responsibilities under the Field Vice President's duties. (Range Inspections) Effective January 11, 2009. **PASSED**

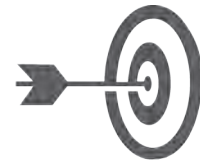
