However, some late archery seasons are open until the end of March so please continue to be careful out there.

If you have comments/questions/suggestions about bow hunting in Virginia, please let me know. I am proud to represent you to the VDGIF.

# It's About the Hunt; Not Your Results

The last time I wrote an article about a guided hunt was for this magazine. If you recall, I described it as a great hunt -- mostly because of the guide service but also because I harvested my first turkey.

That three-day turkey hunt was this spring with Rick Grubbs of Waccamaw Hunting Services, Hemingway, South Carolina. Bob Seltzer (immediate past VBA president) and I each harvested a bird and the experience was so good that I really looked forward to the next opportunity to get out into the South Carolina woods – this time for a larger animal. I had won an opportunity to revisit Waccamaw Hunting Services by being the high bidder on a deer hunt that Rick donated to the VBA for our March 2008 banquet. In many ways it was the best hunt of my life, even through I came home empty handed. Let me explain.

I could have gone any time in the 2008-2009 season and initially had my eyes on the rut period in November. Instead, I chose to hunt in mid-September because of a unique opportunity to see a young man harvest his first deer. I learned that Bob and his grandson Michael (age 10) along with Ralph Lawson (one of the original founders of the Belvoir Bowhunters) and his grandson Sean (age 14) would be in Rick's camp that week. Michael had never harvested a deer so I wrangled my way into the group. Dave Proctor (VBA Executive Vice President & Flight Editor), who was a good friend of Rick's dad, was also interested in the hunt and rounded out the camp.

Dave and I drove to South Carolina on a Monday. The others got there on Sunday and spent Monday in the woods. We arrived to find that the only blood shed that day was by the hunters themselves as they became donors of life-giving fluids to the next generation of South Carolina mosquitoes. Boy, are those suckers (no pun intended) big! The mosquitoes, not the hunters (except for one hunter who will go nameless). We were in the cabin after the sun went down and those monsters pounded the outside walls trying to get at us. It sounded like cannon balls trying to break through. Visions of vampires with wings hovered outside every window. Doors were opened only in grave emergencies. Stakes were driven into the ground to keep them from flying away with the building. Small children ran screaming into the night. But, I exaggerate and digress.

The time to get up came too early (as it always does) Tuesday, and we donned a couple of layers of clothes before dashing to the trucks. I would have been comfortable in a very light hunting outfit, but there was no way I was going to lose twenty pounds of fluids to a cloud of B52-sized bugs with refueling probes for noses. Those things were so long they could stick you in the shoulder and tickle your toes. Scary. But, I digress again.

Fortunately, Dave and I had brought with us gifts we had received from friends (Bob gave me mine). Each of us had a ThermaCELL and it saved our lives. Once you turned that device on it only took about two minutes and there was not a mosquito to be found within three feet. Amazing. I made a trip to town to be sure I had enough refills and spent every day in the deep woods without being bothered by the bugs or spooking the deer. Fortunately, Bob, et. al. also had ThermaCELLs and after not using them the first day they used them the rest of the week. Saved their lives also. The moral of the story is to hunt South Carolina after the first cold snap when the bugs have disappeared, but, if you have to hunt earlier, use technology.

Truth in lending: Dave was the only one on this hunt using a bow. The rest of us went to the "dark side" and used firearms of various calibers. Bob/Michael and Ralph/Sean hunted in two-man stands or ground blinds so they could enjoy the special camaraderie that spans family generations. It was also necessary that someone provide adult supervision. I'll leave it to you to decide who was the supervisor and who was the supervisee. Dave and I hunted in separate locations and the four groups got together each afternoon and evening to tell lies - I mean stories.

The best story, of course, centered on Rick putting all of us in position to see deer every day, but most importantly putting Bob and Michael in a position on their second night to harvest Michael's first animal. As the two of them related the yarn, it was a classic adventure. The animal moved quietly through the woods about 100 yards in front of the novice hunter who stayed very still so as not to betray his position. Michael then shifted slowly to get his weapon into the right position, took careful aim, and gently but steadily squeezed the trigger. Just as they teach on the firing range, the explosion surprised him and a breathless burst of air escaped as he witnessed the fruits of his labor on the forest floor. I'm sure if I had been within two miles of the scene

I have now been on two hunts with Rick and can highly recommend his turkey, deer and pig outings. He supports the VBA and he runs a classy outfit that includes a comfortable lodge and plenty of acreage with a wide variety of terrain.
