If you missed these two tournaments, then you missed a lot in addition to the opportunity to put your archery skills to work on their range. The food was great and plentiful! Each of these clubs went to much work and expense, not to mention the hospitality which was outstanding! We thank each of you! Once again, Congratulations to all of you!

VBA News. We would like to welcome Singers Glen Bowbenders back to the VBA. Their range is located on Bowbender Lane in Singers Glen, VA.

The 'After the School Archery Program' (ASAP) has begun in the VBA. Jerry Wenzel, NFAA Master Coach, has accepted the responsibility as the ASAP Coordinator. This program will provide continued archery instruction to youths that have been introduced into archery by NASP, summer camps and other archery programs.

Archery education is very important in order to continue to interest youths and other organizations in archery. Another avenue is the IBEP classes that we conduct. For those that are current instructors or who have taught IBEP classes in the past, please let me know who you are so that we can bring our list of instructors up-to-date. These folks dedicate a large amount of volunteer time to teach these classes, and we thank you.

Some of our seniors participated in the 2007 Virginia Senior Games held in May at Virginia Beach. The Compound Finger winners were Jerry Wenzel and Betty & Dean Gordon. The Compound Release winners were Mary Wenzel, Ed Bickham and Stan Parmentier. Great shooting, folks!

We continue to participate and work with organizations such as the Trailblazer, NWTF, DGIF, NASP, Boy and Girl Scouts, Sportsmen Shows and exhibits and many other events that are held throughout the year, as they are a great asset to us and to let folks know what we do. At the January VBA meeting, we asked that you please bring your club brochures to be included in our hand-out packets. Please try to remember to do this.

DGIF News. There is a proposal to have the 2008-2009 Urban Bowhunting season begin on the 1<sup>st</sup> Saturday in September and continue until the last Saturday in March.

Frankenfish, commonly known as 'Snakeheads', have become a big issue with the DGIF. This is a native Asian fish that resembles a bowfin with a snakeskin pattern over its body and teeth like the northern pike. They can live in very poor water, live out of water for a prolonged time, wriggle short distances and breathe air like a turtle. They are abundant in Virginia tributaries of the tided Potomac.

Note in the Hunting & Trapping Regulation Book that VBA is one of the many organizations listed under 'Working Together For Our Wildlife'.

### From the Hunting Vice-President

This column is being written on Sept. 7<sup>th</sup> and a quick check of the Virginia Department of Game and Inland Fisheries (VDGIF) web site reveals very few public remarks regarding the proposed changes to state regulations used to govern wildlife, hunting, trapping, fishing and boating. Inputs on the various proposals range from 0 to 60. These are extremely small numbers given the amount of time the items have been posted but that may also reflect general concurrence with the proposals and a lack of controversy. By the time you get this, the public comment period will have expired and your last chance to have input will be in person at the VDGIF meeting at 9:00 AM on Oct. 16<sup>th</sup> at 4000 West Broad Street, Richmond VA. I plan to be there to represent the VBA and make our views, consolidated at the September VBA Quarterly Meeting, known.

Moving on to another topic, the International Bowhunter Education Program in Virginia needs help. If you enjoy hunting and believe that you would like to give something back to the sport that adds so much to your life, now is your chance. Specifically, the program needs instructors. Each year the demand for classes outstrips the capacity of the IBEP program to provide instructors, and that trend will soon get worse as instructors who are youth challenged (like me!) begin to retire from the scene. So, we need a push NOW to train instructors. The training takes a day, and when you teach, the classes last one day.

How do you become an instructor? Call me or send an e-mail and I'll take it from there. My contact data is in page 2 of the FLIGHT. I plan to gather names over the rest of this year and will work with others to schedule training sessions when the weather starts to break in the spring. This is important because it is about hunting, teaching others about the ethics of our sport, and meeting the needs of hunters who require IBEP certification to hunt at numerous places around the U.S. and the world. We can get you the training needed to pitch the classes – in other words, we can train the trainer.

Right now you are thinking about the IBEP and whether you want to get involved. Please act on your instincts NOW before you put this magazine away and you lose the thought. If you don't want to participate or can't, OK. But if you are intrigued and want to take the next step let me hear from you before involvement in other activities takes this topic off your mind. Make a spur- of-the-moment decision to call me or send an e-mail and I promise you won't regret it! Thanks in advance to those of you who will get involved.

My last topic centers on the use of various types of trail cameras and other devices to locate deer and other big game. I'm hearing from some folks that the use of such devices is OK but there is a limit. For some people, using multiple cameras to saturate an area exceeds their concept of ethical use of the cameras. Others have more tolerance, but reach their limit when hunters use signals via cell phones or other transmission devices connected to remote cameras to be alerted that game is in the area and then immediately move to that area in search of an animal. This, to them, is akin to searching for game from an airplane and then landing near an intended animal for a hunt.

What's an acceptable limit? Your thoughts would be appreciated since this topic is gaining momentum on the national stage and I'll be asked for the VBA opinion, which I can get from your reps at the quarterly VBA meeting – provided they go and provided you discuss this in your Clubs. So, let me hear from you directly or through your Club rep.

Finally, remember that a successful hunt can be defined as coming out of the woods safely and in good health. My best wishes to you this hunting season for lots of "successful" days afield combined with an occasional harvest.

# VBA State Indoor Sectional Championship Hosted by The Belvoir Bowhunters



DIRECTIONS: Exit U.S. Route 1 (Richmond Highway) at traffic signal at Pohick Road. This intersection is the entrance to Fort Belvoir at Tulley Gate. Drive to the security control point and visitor center. Obtain a temporary vehicle pass at the visitor center adjacent to the control point by presenting driver's license and vehicle registration. Proceed south on Pohick Road to the first traffic light at Theote Road and turn right. Proceed approximately one-half mile to a stop sign at Warren Road and turn right. Proceed to Tompkins Basin, turning right at the intersection at the bottom of the hill. The new Indoor Range is the long white building (Bldg 778) on the right and set back from the road at the base of the hill. The new Fort Belvoir Archery Center is located in the same building.







hiring within the Department. With a ceiling of 190 Conservation Police Officers, they currently have some 160 personnel on board to maintain and support their Hunting, Fishing and Conservation programs.

Susan Alger, Program Coordinator (formerly the Game Warden for 27 yrs. in Fairfax county), has established a new volunteer program entitled 'Complementary Work Force Program.' As a team volunteer, you can assist and support the efforts of the DGIF mission by helping with projects such as permit inspections & issuance, trout stocking, wildlife damage inspections, exhibits, waterway marker inspections, equipment repair & maintenance, research assistance and more. This program is currently in Regions 1 & 5 which covers Dixie, Kingsboro, Belvoir Bowhunters, Cub Run, Manahoac, NORVA and Pr. William clubs. To become a volunteer (as I have), sign up on-line to help our Conservation Police Officers.

# Field Points

### **A New Program to Promote Youth Archery**

ASAP – After School Archery Program, that is – is now in Virginia. ASAP is a program to provide follow-on archery instruction to youth introduced to the sport in summer camps, NASP or other beginning archery programs. The program was started by NFAA to be presented in community environments such as schools, Recreation Councils, park programs or clubs; and to take beginning archers to a level that will enable them to fully participate in the sport by competing at local shoots and joining archery clubs. It was also intended to enable archery instructors to receive some income for their efforts. ASAP is also supported by USA Archery, the Archery Shooters Association (ASA), the Archery Trade Association (ATA) and the Easton Sports Development Foundation. The latter has made funds available for grants of equipment for use in the program.

VBA has received one of those grants of equipment, including bows, arrows, targets and accessories for use by ASAP participants. We now have a case with 12 bows, sights, six dozen arrows, 12 quivers, accessories for 12 participants and 4 large targets. Jerry Wenzel, a NFAA Master Coach, has accepted the responsibility as ASAP Coordinator within VBA and the VBA ASAP equipment. The equipment is available to any instructor who wishes to present an ASAP session and will take responsibility for the equipment. The program may be presented by any instructor certified by USA Archery, NFAA or NASP, and is particularly suited for Intermediate Level and higher level instructors.

There will be a cost to the participants to cover the expenses such as:

- The cost of registering as an ASAP club and providing ASAP achievement awards.
- The cost of equipment maintenance and transportation.
- The cost of venue use if required.
- Income for instructors and/or clubs running the program.

A sample financial template was presented at the September VBA meeting and is available to interested instructors and clubs. The cost of Individual ASAP programs will vary depending on venue costs and the financial requirements of partner organizations such as club, Recreation Councils or schools.




