## From the President

Attendance at the State Indoor was good and, except for a few minor bugs with score keeping, all went smoothly. Attendance at the Banquet was down, but all who came had a good time and, although the Banquet is not planned as a fundraiser, we made a little money. Again, thanks to all who took the time to support the local clubs holding the Indoor Championship, and for coming out to socialize with fellow archers and honoring those receiving awards.

The March VBA Quarterly Meeting was a long, drawn-out affair. To those club delegates who attended, thank you for your patience in sitting through it. There were many issues discussed and voted on at this meeting, and I would like to take the time to let our membership know what occurred. The main topics of discussion involved our Constitution, Bylaws, and Shooting Rules. As you should be aware, we have been trying to update and correct these documents. Over time, these documents have been modified by motions passed at previous Quarterly Meetings, by your delegates who attend the meetings. Errors in grammar, punctuation, spelling, and wording were found, and were corrected in the latest update voted on and approved at the meeting. However, there are still several conflicts and discrepancies found by members, which need to be corrected. We began to go through these at the meeting, but decided to send this back to the committee which had been reviewing the documents, for additional recommendations on how to best make the needed corrections. I heard several delegates comment on the amount of time that is spent reviewing and updating these documents. The Constitution, Bylaws and Shooting Rules are the foundation of the Virginia Bowhunters Association. They set the rules by which we operate and are governed. It is imperative that they are accurate and understandable by all our members. If any conflicts arise regarding the functioning of the Association, these documents are where we go to find resolutions. It may take some time to get the documents worded correctly, but it is time well spent. These documents are constantly changing as new motions and rules are submitted, voted on, and passed. This is the nature of our organization. In any event, I would like to thank Terry Ballowe for all his hard work in getting these documents up to date, and to all those other members who have taken the time to contribute to this relentless task.

Another matter brought up at the meeting was nominations for VBA members to be inducted into the Order of the Golden Feather. The Order is the highest form of recognition for outstanding service by members to the VBA and archery in general. The names of two VBA members were submitted for nomination - Bob Foster and Jerry Jordan. These nominations have gone back to the local clubs for consideration and, at

## From the Hunting Vice President

We recently held the VBA banquet at Keezletown Ruritan and had a wonderful time. I believe everyone that attended had a great time and some even left with a great prize or two from the raffle and silent auctions. I want to congratulate all of the Bill Bennett award, double crown award and pin winners for 2013-2014. I hope to see more award winners attend future banquets. Also remember if you harvest a deer, bear or turkey you need to send in a Bill Bennett award application.

I want to thank the many businesses, clubs and individuals that donated items to raise money for the VBA. I would personally like to thank Dances Sporting Goods and Dominion Outdoor for their generous donations to the VBA banquet.

We made history in Virginia when Gov. Terry McCaulliff signed HB1237 into law on March 5, 2014. If you do not already know HB1237 allows Sunday hunting on private land with written permission. The new law becomes effective July 1, 2014. This was not the only change that will affect hunters this fall. There were two other bills of significance to bowhunters that were signed into law. The first is HB715, it combines the archery and crossbow license into one license. The second is HB857, it requires the use of blaze orange during muzzleloading season which will affect bowhunters due to season overlap. Please take the time to read up on the new laws and how they will affect you and your hunting areas.

The Spring Gobbler Turkey season is right around the corner, opening day is April 12, 2014. If you hunt during the spring gobbler season, I wish you good luck and straight shooting. But please be careful while enjoying the season. A few simple rules to follow to protect yourself and other hunters. Be sure of your target and beyond. Never stalk a turkey, it might be another hunter pretending to be a turkey. If you become aware that another hunter is stalking you, call out loudly without moving. Sit with your back against a tree as wide as your shoulders. Place your decoys where other hunters will see you if they happen by and do not wear black, blue or white into the turkey woods. Those are the same colors of a turkey.

Once again be safe while bowhunting turkeys this spring. Straight shooting to all.

The VBA would like to thank Belvoir Bowhunter, Kingsboro Bowmen and Sherwood Archers for hosting the 2014 State Indoor Championship. We had 140 archers register which was down from past years. In June, 2013, the directors approved the new shooting rules to allow archers to shoot 1 or 2 times on either day. As a result, we had 43 archers shot on the day of their choice. The VBA would also like to thank Cay McManus for stepping up as our new Field Vice-President, just in time for the tournaments to begin. Cay is diligently working on refining the VBA and IBM shooting rules.

The VBA 19<sup>th</sup> Annual Awards Banquet was held on March 22<sup>nd</sup> at the Keezletown Ruritan Club. The 59 attendees from 13 clubs enjoyed seeing everyone and the club's delicious buffet. Our guest speaker was Andy Hofmann, Refuge Manager from the Eastern Virginia Rivers NWRC (U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service). Andy gave a very nice and educational presentation about the various refuges, their history, wildlife, what they do and much more.

Before the presentation of awards, Rob Pecora, presented the "President's Award" to Ed Bickham, for his devoted dedication to the VBA and serving several offices over the years, as well as an honorable OGF member.

This year, our Double Crown winner was Ethan Mullins, Sherwood Archers, CMBB style; and our Triple Crown winners were: Corbin Durham, Bowhunters of Rockingham, CMBHFS/R and Cory Mullins, Sherwood Archers, YAFBHFS/R styles.

The clubs with the most increase in membership for 2013 to the following:

the smallest clubs went to Two Rivers Archery Club, 1<sup>st</sup> place and Shenandoah Archery Club, 2<sup>nd</sup> place; the medium club went to Cub Run Archers for 1<sup>st</sup> place and the largest clubs went to NORVA, 1<sup>st</sup> Place and Sherwood Archers, 2<sup>nd</sup> place.

FYI, at the end of the fourth quarter of 2013, VBA had 1,572 members, but at the end of the first quarter of 2014, we had 1,044 members. Hopefully, the clubs will work towards an increase in membership as last year.

The largest buck by weight at 155 lbs., to Wade Colton; Arthur Sommers, largest buck by weight, 2<sup>nd</sup> place at 150 lbs.; Randy Armentrout, largest buck by weight, 3<sup>rd</sup> place at 150 lbs.; Robert Yager, Jr, largest doe by weight at 126 lbs.; Randy Armentrout, largest doe by weight, 2<sup>nd</sup> place at 114 lbs.; Trent Diehl, largest doe by weight at 100 lbs., 3<sup>rd</sup> place; Wade Colton, largest bear by weight at 260 lbs., and Wayne East, largest bear by weight at 140 lbs., 2<sup>nd</sup> place; Hunter Heavner, largest rack scoring at 184-3/16 and Clint Keller, largest rack scoring at 135-2/8 2<sup>nd</sup> place.

The following clubs received the most awards: BOR – 23, Massanutten – 12, Augusta – 2, Dixie – 2

and Sherwood – 1. Hopefully next year, we will receive more Big Game Award applications and mention those bowhunters who have harvest various big game out-of-state.

The Silent Auction winners with the highest bid went to Peggy Ballowe, the “Sunrise Nags Head 2009”; Dave Burpee, the “Chimney Poster”; Matt Nixon, the Rescur One CDS II; Olin Bare, targets; Marie Bell, Framed Prints; Jon Robertson, one dozen express mixima hunter 250 and the Turkey print; Carolyn Bickham, four books; Joyce Camera, the Turkey Decoy and Wade Colton, the Parker Bow.

The 6<sup>th</sup> Annual National Archery in the Schools State Tournament was held on March 8<sup>th</sup> at the Meadows Events Park in Doswell, VA. The event had over 500+ schools participating. The championship winners will be going to Kentucky for the National Tournament. For the first time, Karen Holson had an Educational Activity event next door. The students, parents, and guest participated in boating safety, fish casting, firearm simulator, treestand safety, 3-Ds, 3-D platform and SACO target shooting. The DGIF/CWF volunteers had animal furs and live snakes on display for them to feel and hold them. I will be attending various DGIF events, such as the Kids Fishing Days, archery, other fishing events, various state and county sportsmen shows and DGIF training.

The DGIF Hunter Education Program has been moved from the Law Enforcement Division to the Agency Outreach Program. This will allow the Department to replace their CPOs who will be retiring or moving onto other jobs with non-sworn employees. The Region 2 Coordinator, Crystal Weidman retired and Jackson Landers was selected to fill her position. The Region 1 Hunter Education Program Coordinator has been filled by Ray Philbates, effective April 10<sup>th</sup>. Now, the position for the CWF Coordinator in Region I need to be filled. Also, CPO Megan Vick is now working with Karen with her NASP and other archery programs, and K-9 Jake has retired.

The Governor has approved two new regional coordinator positions for the VDGIF, Complementary Workforce in Regions 2 and 3.

If anyone has any animal furs, mounts or snake skins they would like to donate to the DGIF for their various outdoor educational events, please let me know and bring them to the June’s meeting.

We would like to thank Jon Robertson, our new Hunting Vice-President, his wife Lori and Ed Bickham who did a fantasy job putting this year’s event on and other officers who helped make this a success. Also, thanks to the clubs and individuals who donated raffle prizes. Much thanks to everyone who participated in the raffles and silent auctions to raise money for our upcoming VBA 75<sup>th</sup> Anniversary in 2016.

I might add that Jon has done an outstanding job since he stepped up to replace Ed. Jon has attended many VDGIF Board Meetings, communicating with them, keeping on top of the House/Senate bills and informing the clubs of what is going on and what is coming regarding the changes in the hunting regulations as well as other topics.

We have two VBA State Tournaments coming up. The 3-D Spring Classic (marked) that will be hosted by Manahoac Bowmen on April 12<sup>th</sup> & 13<sup>th</sup> and the State Open that will be hosted by Sherwood Archers on May 24<sup>th</sup> & 25<sup>th</sup>. As a reminder, at all State 3-D Spring Classic (on a trial bases from 2014 thru 2016), archers have an option of shooting one or two times and their highest score will count. The fee will be the same. Don’t forget to check our website calendar for upcoming events, contacts and directions and other information.

As a reminder, the VDGIF Outdoor Report is free to everyone, so please sign-up. There are many interesting information for all of us. ## From the NBEF/IBEP Director

I have said many times in these articles that the IBEP course is a Safety Course. While we talk a lot about hunting techniques and shooting techniques, I always tell my students that the one take away they must remember is never to leave the ground unless they are safely tethered to a Full Body Harness (with a Suspension Relief System) that is securely attached to the tree. Last fall, our bowhunting community lost one of our own, and I've started reading his story to my classes so they fully understand what can happen if they ignore this critical safety rule. I would like to share it with you as well. The article was published in the The Indianapolis Star, by Ryan Sabalow and Kristine Guerra last November.

*DECATUR, Ind. -- It started out as a typical fall Saturday afternoon inside Abbey and Tim Bowers' home. The newlyweds kicked back and watched some TV before he said goodbye. As he so often did this time of year, he was going hunting. He'd be home a little after dark. Hopefully, with a nice buck.*

*Just hours later, Tim woke up in the hospital. He couldn't move. His family told him they'd asked the doctors to bring him out of a drug-induced coma. They had terrible news — and a horrific question to ask.*

*He had fallen 16 feet as he was climbing to his tree stand, and he had shattered his spine. He likely would spend the rest of his life connected to a breathing machine, unable to walk and never able to hold the baby that Abbey was carrying in her womb. Would he rather be disconnected from the respirator?*

*Tim Bowers, just 32 years old, decided it was his time.*

*"The last thing he wanted was to be in a wheelchair," Abbey Bowers said Wednesday. "To have all that stuff taken away would probably be devastating. He would never be able to give hugs, to hold his baby. We made sure he knew that, so he could make a decision. Even if he decided the other thing, the quality of life would've been very poor. His life expectancy would be very low."*

*He died Sunday, about five hours after his breathing tube was removed. He spent his final hours with his family and friends, about 75 of whom gathered inside the hospital's waiting room. They prayed and sang songs.*

As clearly as this tragedy illustrates the point I'm trying to make for my students, it is one I wish I never had the opportunity to use. My heartfelt condolences go out to Amy Bowers, as well as the family and friends of Tim Bowers. Never forget that the most dangerous part of your hunt is climbing in and out of your treestand. Make sure you have a Full Body Harness with a Suspension Relief System that is securely attached to the tree, or don't leave the ground.

## AGENDA ITEMS

### AGENDA ITEMS VOTED AT MARCH MEETING:

(5) The VBA shall accept the newly revised Constitution and By-laws as ammended by Feb. 15, 2014, as the official documents of the organization. Effective, April, 2014. **Passed, 31-4.**

(6) Constitution, Art. 10, Sect. 1 ,Pg. 3; Change current VBA Charter fee from \$20.00 to \$25.00. Effective, Jan. 01, 2015. **Passed, 33-2.**

### AGENDA ITEMS FOR JUNE MEETING:

(1) Change VBA Rules and Styles, Sect. 1, Outdoor Classifications, Pg. 7; Senior, Silver Senior and Master Senior, by removing the words, “no class breakdown in this division,” and inserting the words in each cateryory, “same class breakdown as adult men and adult women.” Add a heading to this paragraph to read: Male and Female. Effective on passage of motion.

Justification: More people now shooting in this age group.

(2) VBA By-laws, Art. 3, Sect. 3. 2, Flight Editor, Pg. 4 of 22; Change last sentence and add a sentence as follows: He shall cause this publication to be made available to at least one member of each household of an affiliated club and associated member of this association by regular mail, e-mail or by access to a downloadable copy from the VBA website. Members wishing to receive the publication by e-mail must request that mode of delivery and provide the editor with an e-mail address. Effective, Jan. 2015.

Justification: Several member households routinely receive the Flight magazine late, often after VBA events advertized in the magazine have occured. Example, several members received the Winter 2014 issue after the VBA State Indoor Sectional Tournament. Sending Flight by e-mail may reduce VBA costs.

(3) Motion to create an Affiliate Membership Classification, Art. 3, Sect. 3.3; for corporations,clubs,and/or organizations wanting to affiliate with the VBA including a fee of \$50.00 with no voting rights.

Justification: No membership presently available and VBA would receive more advertisement and obtain an associate member.

(4) By-laws, Sect. 15, 2.4. Pg. 13, Sanctioned Tournaments; Remove, “for Indoor, Field, Hunter, and Paper Animals.” Effective July1, 2014.

Justification: Not to limit what is a sanctioned tournament.

(5) By-laws, Sect. 15, 1.10, Registration Fees ,Pg. 12, D; Remove “Field/Hunter and 3-D”.Add “for any sanctioned tournament.”Effective, July 1, 2014.

Justification: Not to limit what a sanctioned tournament is.
