NFAA Compound Release Aid Ballot Results

Question 1: Are you in favor of the Compound Bow in its present form? Nationally, the ballot stated 9,340 Yes, 3,292 No. Of the Yes votes, 3,692 favored it in all divisions, 2,316 were for Free Style, 126 Bare Bow, 371 Bowhunters, and 3,139 vored the Compound Bow in a separate ision: In Virginia, 425 said Yes to estion 1, 73 said No. Among the Yes answers, 195-said the compound bow should be allowed in all divisions, 128 said Free Style, 3 said Bare Bow, 18 said Bowhunter, and 95 said separate division.

Question 2: Are you in favor of Release Aids? Nationally, the ballot stated 8,362

Yes, 4192 No. Of the Yes votes, 2132 favored release aids in all divisions, 3,623 Free Style, 163 Bare Bow, 102 Bowhunter, and 2591 wanted them in a separate division. In Virginia, 383 said Yes to Question 2, 111 said No. Of the Yes votes, 88 said all divisions, 215 said Free Style, 12 Bare Bow, 4 Bowhunter, and 67 favored release aids in a separate division.

The ballot returns from Virginia ranked fifth in the Nation.

The total yes and no votes on the Compound Bow does not equal the total votes on Release Aids because some votes were cast for one of the questions, but not the other.

The 4th Annual VBA State Indoor Championship Tournament is scheduled-for March 4 and 5, 1972 at James Madison High School in Vienna, Virginia. The tournament will be conducted on the basis of individual competition, with team-competition also to be recognizied. Tournament will consist of two NFAA Indoor Rounds per archerone each day. Morning rounds will commence at 8:00 a.m. and afternoon rounds at 1:00 p.m., each day. No advance classification is required; classes will be based on scores shot during one of the two rounds. The tess of a coin prior to the start of the last end of the final game will determine the round on which all archers will be classified.
