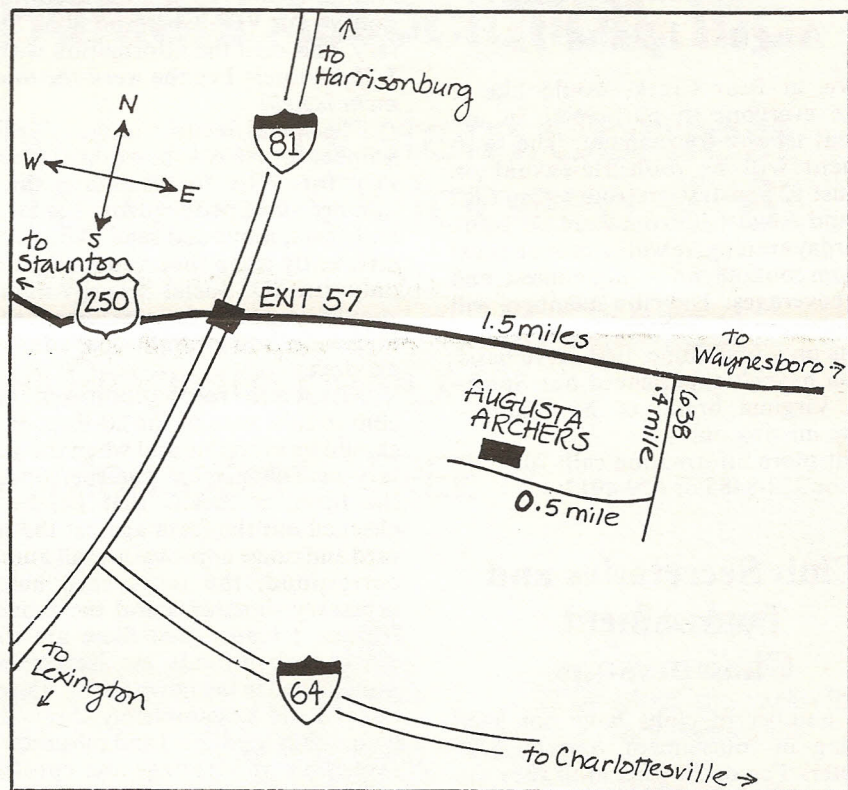

### Club Secretaries and Tournament Chairpersons

A number of clubs have not been sending in tournament reports, \$.25 Shooters Fee or 20-Pins until they are contacted—some, several times!

At the March 29, 1989 VBA meeting, the following agenda item was passed, effective the weekend of March 25 and 26, 1989:

"The \$4.00 shooting fee will apply to pin shoots only. \$.25 will be sent to VBA

for all scheduled shoots except one annual shoot each year. Closed club functions are exempt."

Clubs who have more than one annual scheduled, should notify the Corresponding Secretary which *one* is exempt!

Tournament reports should be mailed no later than *Tuesday* following the tournament. Scores are then posted on each member's card (or the computer, once it's finally programmed) and need to be posted in date order. Please record members name and *VBA number* on the tournament sheet, as it appears on the Handicap Card. (No nicknames!) If a tournament is cancelled or no Field or Hunter round is shot, it is necessary to notify your VBA Corresponding Secretary, and mail the information with the \$.25 Shooters Fee the *week the tournament is held*.

The Social Security number is the ID number for NFAA, however, it is necessary for VBA to also have this ID number since people drop out for several years, move and send their name in differently when they rejoin. This is the only sure ID. Social Security numbers should be sent in for everyone, head of household and all additional adults and children.

Also it is the responsibility of the host club to take care of the 20-Pins. Forms should be available and when the Secretary or Tournament chairperson signs the form, it means that he/she has checked out the form against the score card and range approval and all numbers correspond, the score card has the necessary signatures and the money is correct. I realize that there are times, due to lack of funds, etc., some people want to mail in their own forms, however, they should be completely checked out before they are signed and released. This saves time and postage and cuts down on errors. 20-Pin forms must be mailed in within 30 days after completion of the tournament. It is best to mail them in with the tournament report.

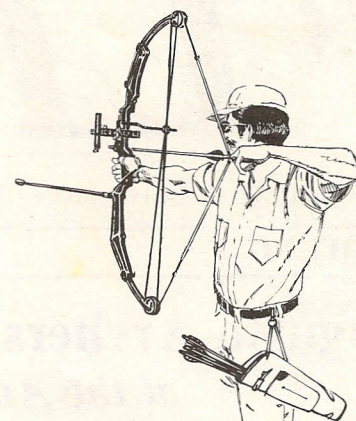

7. Contact Person and phone number for your club.

## Ft. Belvoir Army Base

Oct. 12, 1988

4:45 p.m.

After being in my portable tree stand about two hours, I carefully picked up my rattling antlers and gave them a try (my first experience in using antlers). 20 min. later I tried it again. As I went to hang them on a small branch down out of the tree, they fell splashing into a small creek below me. 10 min. later, there he was, 20 yds. away looking away from me. Up went my bow, deep breath, 20 yd. pin, release, then the famous ka-thunk as the arrow entered the chest cavity. Off he crashed what sounded like 300 yds. (actually 60). Then came the "shakes" along with another sporty 6 pt. in the same place. With my bow on the ground I did nothing but watch as he looked and looked for his competition. Finally he got some human scent and sped away.

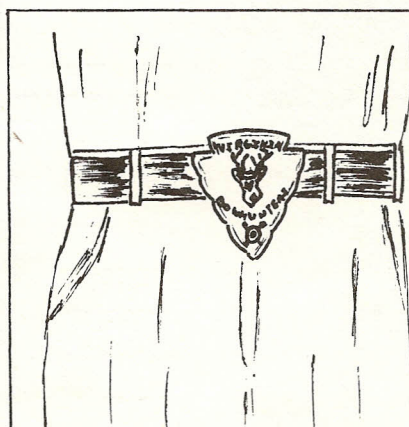
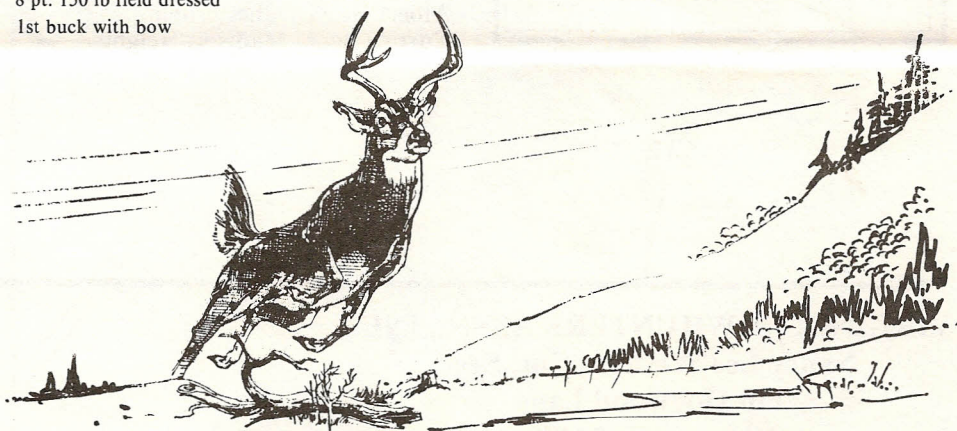
While hunting on Ft. Belvior you must return your hunting pass 1 hour after dark, so back to the game check I went. I got (4) other hunters to go back and help me find the deer. When we found the deer I told a hunter to get my archery tag out of the pouch on my back. It was GONE! The only thing in the pouch was my small game license. I dressed the animal and we took it back to the game check and I told the young warden of the problem. I bought my hunting license on the base and he even had a record of it. The way I understood the warden was that I had to have my original archery license in order to take the animal. I looked all morning the next day. Then I figured something just isn't right here. The warden didn't help me in any way by telling me of other means of tagging that deer, so I called the Virginia Main Game Office in Richmond and they told me to go to the place where I bought my license (Ft. Belvior) and get a duplicate copy of it (which took about 5 min.). After that I called this Ft. Belvior warden back at 12 noon and he said they took my deer to the dump. He said I could have the antlers along with a \$75.00 fine for failure to carry a hunting license.

About two weeks later I received a letter which had my archery license in it. A jogger had found it along the road where I was hunting.

With this new evidence the warden dismissed the fine in court. But here I am with antlers and memories but no venison from that buck.

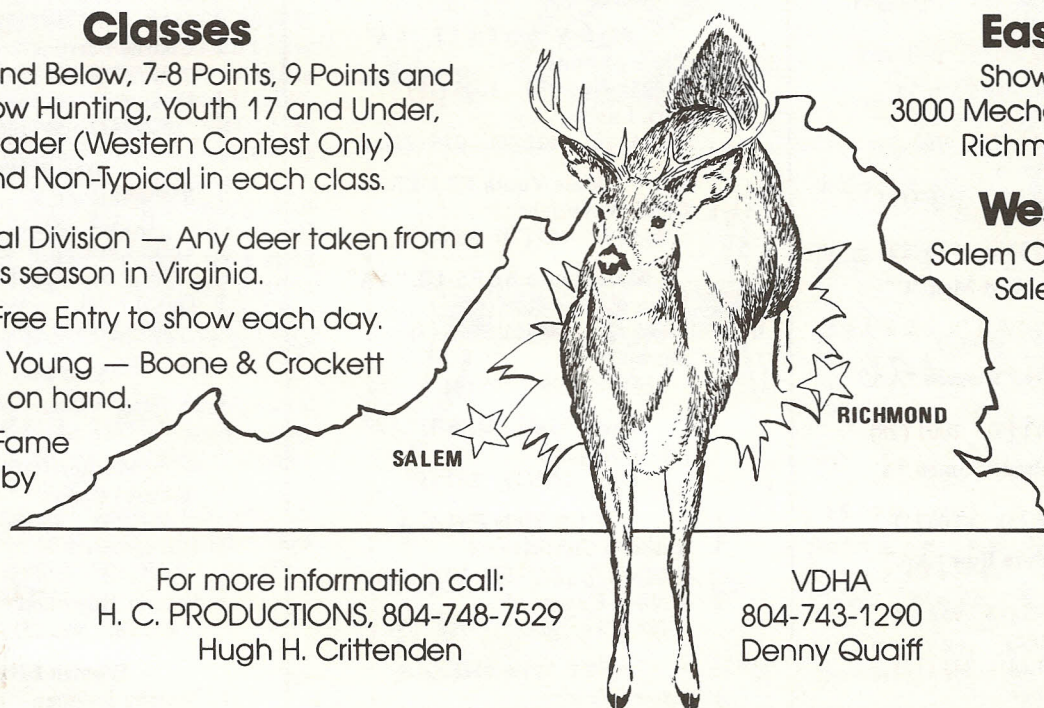
