





VBA Meeting Highlights

The last quarterly VBA meeting was represented by 21 clubs. The next meeting will be held on September 25-26 at the Mt. Vernon Motel in Charlottesville. The Sept. 25 Saturday night meeting will be the scheduling session for your club's 1983 shoots. Every club is urged to have a delegate present at this meeting.

Agenda items to be voted on at the next meeting are as follows:

1. (Prince William) State Indoor be optionally held at 2 locations on the same date if there are two clubs who bid and the VBA board of directors approves a two location tournament. A tournament committee co-chaired by a member from each club will establish the procedures.

2. (Prince William) At State Indoor shoots, scoring will include counting spots (X's) for the purpose of breaking ties. Shoot-offs will be used only when both score and spot count are the same for 2 or more archers.

3. (Dixie) Every chartered club must hold at least one (1) sanctional shoot per year when facilities are available.

4. (Prince William) A child under the age of 12 may not accompany any archer in a state shoot during a sanctioned round unless that child is also a participant.

Two deer limit West of Blue Ridge

The Virginia Game Commission passed the proposed 2-deer kill at the May 1982 meeting. This law will permit the taking of 2 deer by both gun and bowhunters. The bow hunter may take 2 deer of either sex during the bow season. The gun hunter may also take 2 deer during gun season, but does may be taken on the last day only. A hunter may also take one deer in each season if he prefers. If a hunter has any questions concerning this new law he should contact his local game officer.

There was also concern among some clubs about the proposed law to case all guns and bows when crossing or traveling in National forest areas. This issue was defeated.

With the additional deer kill permitted in the western part of the state, we may see an increase in the number of bow hunters this year. Let's conduct ourselves in a manner that represents our sport in the way it should be. Our actions may influence a prospective V.B.A. member.
