DIRECTOR'S REPORT NFAA ANNUAL MEETING FEBRUARY 17th-19th, 1982 SEATTLE, WASHINGTON

Reported by: Bob Cissel, VA NFAA Director

1) Budget Committee:

A proposed budget was passed of \$282,075. All NFAA accounts are payable within 30 days. NFAA owes the Pro Division \$6,000 which \$4,200 payback was budgeted in 1982, and the Bowhunter Defense Fund \$56,000 which \$5,000 was budgeted in 1982. This is keeping with our 10 year payback schedule which starts in 1982.

2) Administrative Committee:

The following items were passed:

a. Three newsletters will be sent to the membership—one in April, September, and December.

b. A resume will accompany all ballots

when voting on NFAA officers.
c. At each meeting coinciding with an election year, the agenda shall include provisions for accepting nominations from the floor for president and vice-president for the next term of office.

*d. Course approval has been raised to \$10. NOTE: Butch Herold was directed to see that all state directors and clubs received notification of course approval expira-

3) Rules General Committee:

- a. Each person will be responsible for keeping a current handicap in the proper place on the handicap card after each score is recorded by the tournament chairman of each tournament.
- b. Late registration will be at the discretion of the NFAA directors of that section for sectional and national tournaments to begin January 1983.
- *c. Age groups for youth will be 12 through 14 years of age and young adult will be 15 through 17 years of age.

 d. A bow with any amount of weight reduction or release load may now be used.

4) Rules Competitive Bowhunter Committee:

a. A sight with a maximum of 5 fixed reference points that must not be moved dur-

ing a round may be used.

b. The maximum sight extension measurement shall be 5" measured from the back of the bow at the center of attachment to the foremost part of the sight assembly, as measured on a horizontal plane. A diagram will be included in the new constitution and bylaws.

5) Special Projects Committee:

a. The NFAA will have a raffle for 1983 and will review the raffle at each annual meeting thereafter for future raffles. The same tickets will be used.

6) Bowhunter Committee:

- a. Non-NFAA members may shoot the National Bowhunters Jamboree in a Guest Flight.
- b. There will be a Bowhunter Jamboree at Baltimore Bowmen, Baltimore, Md. August 27-29.

7) Council Meeting Report:

a. An IBM Displaywriter is being installed at Headquarters. It should be programmed and ready by July.

b. A committee was formed to develop a

promotional program for the NFAA to be made available to NFAA affiliated

c. The following nominations have been received for the 1982 election:

For President-Bennie Moore *For Vice President-Paul Double of Maryland; Paul Davison of Ohio; and Frank Ellis of Nevada.

*(Note: VBA instructed our NFAA director to vote for Paul Double)

d. The 1982 Nationals will be dedicated to

Fred Bear for his 50 years of service to archery and his 80th birthday.

e. The 1983 National Indoor Tournament will be in Omaha, Nebraska on March 5-6, 1983. Adult fees \$30, all other age groups \$20.

8) Other Information:

- a. The 1983 Outdoor National will be held in Watkins Glen, New York the last full week in July.
- b. The contract with Bow & Arrow Magazine expires in December 1982, and at this time will not be renewed.
- c. Director's travel expenses totaled \$703.42. d. Virginia is 3rd in NFAA membership with 1067 members. New York has 1252 and California has 1804. We also picked

up 266 new members last year-the only state to sign more new members was California with 360.

e. I think we had a very good meeting with very few rule changes. All of the above by-laws will go into effect on April 20, 1982 unless otherwise noted.

NFAA FLIGHT SYSTEM

- 1. The NFAA Flight System will be used at National and Sectional tournaments.
- 2. Flights will be provided in each division and shooting style as follows: 1 to 15 shooters, one flight; 16 to 32 shooters, two flights; 33 to 45 shooters, three flights; 46-64 shooters, four flights; and 65 or more shooters, five flights, and so forth.
- 3. For outdoor nationals and sectionals, archers may be arranged in flights by average scores at the start of the tournament. Archers without established average scores may be placed into flights at the end of the field round(s) according to scores shot (or at the discretion of the tournament chairman).
- 4. For indoor nationals and sectionals, archers may be arranged in flights according to scores shot after the first round (or at the discretion of the tournament chairman).
- 5. Equal division of the number of archers in each flight will be maintained, except that the last flight will record a lesser number (for two flights) or an unequal number (for three or more flights) as may be required. When two or more tie scores appear at the flight break, the archers tied will be placed at the top of the lower flight, without disturbing the remaining flights as originally established.
- 6. The flight system does not apply to the Professional Division.

RULES COMPETITIVE COMMITTEE

Page 48, Article VI, Section I, change as follows: Paragraph 1, after the word end add the following; or as an alternate, 5 ends of 4 arrows

Paragraph 2, New sub para c) The NFAA Indoor Championship target may be used when shooting 4 arrows per end as allowed in para. I above.

Paragraph 4, Sub-para b) delete the entire para and insert new wording to read; The time limit shall be 5 minutes when shooting 5 arrows per end and 4 minutes when shooting 4 arrows per

Paragraph 5, New subpara i) to read:

i) When using the NFAA Indoor Championship

- 1) Scoring shall be 5 points for the combined 4cm X-ring and 8cm white ring and 4 points for the combined 12cm and 16cm blue rings.
- 2) One arrow shall be shot at each of the four targets during each end.
- 3) If more than I arrow is shot into a target, the arrow of higher scoring value is lost.

New Paragraph (D) When shooting the 4 arrow end the tournament director may allow the archer to use either target.

BOWHUNTER COMMITTEE

This bowhunter committee recommends the adoption of the Bowhunter Jamboree and Rendezvous Manual, as written by Larry Trumbull, Bill Wadsworth and Wayne Trimm, either in part or complete, in relation to the proposed National Bowhunter Jamboree and Championship.

The bowhunting committee proposes the following guidelines for an NFAA National Bowhunting Jamboree to be held on a two year

trial basis.

The Jamboree shall be a three (3) day tour-

nament held on a Friday, Saturday, Sunday, or Saturday, Sunday, Monday, at a date negotiable with the host club.

Twenty eight targets are to be shot per day. Targest are to be a silhouette or 3D free standing target. We recommend the distance to be shot would be a minimum of 25 yards and a maximum of 65 yards. There will be no marked yardage. Each target will be a two position target with one arrow shot from each

The tournament will be open to all bowhunters 16 years of age and older. All NFAA equipment rules shall apply. Broadheads will not be allowed.

On each target the archer with the highest total accumulative score will shoot first. All others on the same target will follow in numerical order so that the lowest score always shoots last. In case of tied scores the shooting order for the archers involved will not change. All scores will be on a scratch bassis.

Scoring or arrows will be as follows:

(A) 1st arrow kill - 4 points (B) 1st arrow wound - 3 points (C) 2nd arrow kill - 2 points (D) 2th arrow wound - 1 point

DIVISIONS:

There shall be two (2) divisions of competition; Championship and Guest. Each division having a different color score card.

SHOOTING STYLES:

There will be three styles of shooting recognized in both divisions:

(A) Competitive Bowhunter - Men and Women (B) Freestyle Limited Bowhunter - Men and

Women (C) Freestyle Bowhunter - Men and Women

FLIGHT SYSTEM:

- (1) Championship Division there shall be a maximum of three flights for each shooting style and sex. Flights will be divided equally as possible at the completion of the final day of shooting. If the number is unequal, the odd number will be in the third flight.
- (2) Guest Division there shall be one flight for each shooting style and sex.

AWARDS:

(1) An NFAA patch and chevron award will be given to all flight winners in the championship division.

Pre-registration fee shall be \$25.00 per person for this event, with a \$10.00 late registration fee.

Pre-registrants that do not attend will be refunded their registration fee if written application is made within 10 days after completion of tournament.

SPECIAL EVENTS:

There will be a minimum of three special events. Example:

(A) A Clout Shoot. (B) Pop-Up Targets.

(C) Smoker Round.
(D) Timed Silhouette Round.

In the afternoon or evening we recommend the following examples of events to be held.

(A) A Varmint Calling Contest.

(B) Big Game Measuring Seminar.(C) Wildlife Movies.

FINANCES:

The host club will receive 50% of all registration fees and 50% of all special round revenues. The host club will receive all proceeds from food and concessions.

BOWFISHING COMMITTEE REPORT

1. PATCH PROGRAM.

This program would consist of two different types of patches. One would be a regular shoulder patch denoting that you are a member of the NFAA Bowfisher Division. The second patch would be a bar type patch that would denote what types of fish you have taken.

2. NFAA BOWFISHER OF THE YEAR.

This program would have two winners. These winners would be the ones who shot the largest fish in either of two species. These species would be carp and gar. The awards would be plaques and would preferably be awarded at one of his state functions. Rules are as follows:

Must be member of NFAA.

2. There will be two awards. One for gar and

3. There will be no charge for entering a fish.
4. Entry deadline will be October 1.
5. The entrant will furnish NFAA with a picture of the fish next to a measurable object and a signed affidavit by two witnesses stating that they were present at the time of the weighing.

6. All entries will be inspected by the NFAA

Bowfisher committee to determine the winner. The winners will then be notified by mail.

7. The winners will receive an engraved plaque.

3. NFAA BOWFISHER RECORDS.

This is a program whereby the NFAA Bow-fisher Division keeps records of who holds the distinction of having taken the biggest fish of any certain species by means of bow and arrow. Rules are as follows:

1. Must be member of NFAA.
2. There will be no charge for entering a fish.

3. These records will stand for one year at which time the NFAA Bowfisher committee will review all entries and make all necessary changes to update the records list. If no records are beaten, they remain on the list for the next year. These changes will be done by the com-mittee at the annual NFAA board of directors meeting.

4. Entry deadline will be December 31

5. The entrant must furnish NFAA with a picture of the fish next to a measurable object, a signed affidavit by two witnesses stating that they were present at the time of the weighing.

4. \$2,000.00 NFAA CHAMPIONSHIP BOWFISHING TOURNAMENT.

A. Any club or organization with five or more members can host two tournaments.

B. These will be two-man team tournaments starting May 1 and ending July 10.

C. Each club will be responsible for its own advertising and tournament scheduling.

D. Each tournament will have a twelve hour

E. Participants do not have to be members of NFAA and are eligible to win either or both divisions. Divisions being carp and gar. F. Winners will be determined by the total

weight of fish taken during a single tournament. G. Entry fees will be \$10.00 per person per tournament. Fifty percent of this will be returned to NFAA to be used as prize money and fifty percent will be retained by the tournament host.

H. A list of the weight of fish taken by each team, their names and addresses and all monies due NFAA shall be sent to: NFAA, Rt. 2, Box 514, Redlands, CA 92373, and are to be post-marked no later than July 15.

VBA MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

With 18 voting delegates and 11 guests in attendance, the quarterly meeting of the Virginia Bowhunters was held on March 27 and 28 in Charlottesville.

The Bowhunter Education Program course was held on Saturday with 36 attending and was deemed a great success.

The Kingsboro Bowmen of Suffolk were welcomed into the VBA as a new club.

Due to the increased cost of postage and price of paper it was decided that in the future such things as letters to the VBA, audit reports, etc. will be placed on file with the Corresponding secretary's office rather than be included in the minutes. Anyone may review these items upon request.

Hunting Vice-President Dave Proctor reported that at the recent Game Commission meeting, two proposals were introduced that would directly affect us:

1. Proposal to "case" all weapons while travelling on National hunting

lands. (Dave was instructed by the delegates to support the Game Commission position to "case" bows on certain lands.)

2. Proposal to add second deer of either sex during the bow season west

of the Blue Ridge.

Virginia Field Governor Bill Taylor asked that if your clubs needs to be inspected, make sure that the inspector assigned to your area does the inspecting and signs the forms.

The delegates voted to accept Agenda item stating that a 5 year moratorium be placed on any proposed changes to the number and type of rounds shot at the State Open and Closed.

The following are agenda items to be voted on at the June meeting. Please note that it is at the June meeting that the bids are tendered for the 1983 State Shoots.

1. (Manahoac) Host clubs for State Closed and Open have a minimum of three ranges.

2. (Manahoac) Host club for these

above tournaments be able to accommodate 200 archers.

3. (Manahoac) No shoots of any kind, club or otherwise, on the days of State Shoots.

4. (Norva) That starting with the 1983 VBA sanctioned tournament schedule, all VBA pin shoots have all participants grouped as closely as possible to their division and class, assigned to a target and started at the same time.
