The possible highlight of the quarterly meeting of the VBA held the weekend of June 23-24, was the installment of new officers. Parliamentarian Clint Western read each new officer his or her duties and obligations as stated in our VBA Constitution and Bylaws and then reminded each that their decisions and opinions must always be for the VBA membership as a whole and not based on personal feelings. I am personally looking forward to working closely along with the other officers, and all delegates and clubs during this term and will be open to any suggestions on improving Flight and making it more enjoyable for you.

Our NFAA director, Bob Cissel, will be attending the Mid-Atlantic section meeting in York, Pa., in August. One adgenda item that will go before this meeting from Virginia is a proposal to reduce the NFAA Field and Hunter rounds from 28 targets to 20 targets and adjust the scoring accordingly. This measure would eliminate the bunny, 15 yd., 45 yd. walk-up, and the 80 yd. walk-up and the general purpose of the change would be to speed up the time it takes to shoot a tournament. The VBA Field Governor asked to remind clubs once again to mail inspection forms directly to him and NOT to the NFAA director. Checks should be made out to NFAA. The September VBA meeting is a most important one because mainly of the scheduled meeting which will start at 7 p.m. on Saturday, September 15. All clubs need to have their delegates there to schedule their shoots for the 1980 season keeping in mind the dates of state tournaments. Proposed dates for 1980 state tournaments and VBA meetings were listed incorrectly in the last issue of Flight. So here they are again.

Delegates were advised to inform clubs that a Youth can shoot CFSBH but they must compete with the adults, they CANNOT go back to youth or club divisions, they must remain shooting as an adult.

For entertainment, there will be door prizes given away and on Saturday night, there will be a FREE Barbecued chicken and Bakedbean roast for all registered shooters. All guest (not registered in the tournament) will be charged \$1.00 per person for the chicken roast.



Virginia Bow And Arrow Deer Harvest

Following are selected bow and arrow harvest statistics provided by the Virginia Commission of Game and Inland Fisheries.

The 1978 statistics indicate some definite geographic patterns that should help a bowhunter select an area that would offer a good chance of success.

The two top producing counties in 1978 were also the most productive in 1977. Only the top twenty counties are listed below.

Of the total 1,153 deer taken state wide, 630 or 55% were taken west of west of the Blue Ridge. There were 671 bucks harvested compared to 482 doe.

National Bowhunter Rendezvous To Be At Land Between The Lakes

The 1979 National Bowhunter Rendezvous will be at Land Between the Lakes (LBL), October 6-13, 1979. The rendezvous will be sponsored by the Tennessee Valley Authority and the Bowhunting and Conservation Division of the National Field Archery Association (NFAA).

LBL is a 170,000-acre public demonstration area in western Kentucky and Tennessee that borders Lake Barkley on the east and Kentucky Lake on the west. This noted bowhunting area has an abundance of game including whitetail and fallow deer, wild turkeys, and a variety of small game.

The rendezvous will begin on Saturday, October 6, at 8 p.m. with a one-hour orientation program to acquaint participants with the facilities in LBL and the rendezvous program. People who wish to participate in the rendezvous and do not preregister will be given an opportunity to register between 2 and 8 p.m. on October 6th at LBL.

On October 7th, 8th, and 9th a variety of activities are available for participants to enjoy. Plans include a wildlife program, a social, a liars contest, scouting for hunting, archery equipment exhibits by manufacturers, a turkey shoot, a novelty shoot, a 14 target NFAA animal shoot (field points only), a practice deer hunt (broadheads only), and a presentation of both the instructors course and the regular course of the National Bowhunter Education Program. With the exception of the turkey shoot, the shooting will be non-competitive.


LBL will be open to hunting for rendezvous participants all day on October 10th, 11th, and 12th; and half a day (daylight to noon) on Saturday, October 13th. whitetail deer, fallow deer, and turkey gobblers will be legal. Depending on where one chooses to hunt, the appropriate Kentucky or Tennessee hunting licenses are required.

The closing ceremony and distribution of prizes will be Saturday, October 13th at 1 p.m. Door prizes will be given away based on participation in activities, not on achievement.

LBL is an excellent place to host a rendezvous. Plenty of camping space is available on a first-come-first-served basis. Fees are \$2.00 per day without electricity or \$2.50 per day with electricity.

Preregistration for the rendezvous is \$15.00 per person if received by September 24th, or \$20.00 per person after that date. Each person preregistering will be mailed a packet of information on both the rendezvous and LBL. Preregistration forms and detailed information on the rendezvous may be obtained by writing National Bow-

hunter Rendezvous, Land Between The Lakes, Tennessee Valley Authority, Golden Pond, Kentucky, 42231. Make plans to attend now.
