But there is a way we can get the best from both camps for example; Everyone is crying about the large number and different types of divisions, (f/s, b/b, b/h, etc.) well, Lets do away with all of the divisions. We can have score class, as we have now, but no divisions. Everyone shoots the bow the best way he can, the way he wants to, but with a POINT HANDICAP, not based on scores, but on each piece of EQUIPMENT used. This way, we are all shooting the same no matter how we do it. I know how it sounds, but just wait one minute and see how it might work, and work for everyones good, not just a few top dogs.

I know this system will not be liked by those archers who feel they have to have, or need an advantage over their fellow archers and thats the very reason that its needed to start off with.

First off, we can keep the same target and score system, as we now have, as none other will be needed. I do not think any one will shoot a 560 with a straight limb bow. I do not think Mr. Hill could even do that.

Now;

To reach your point handicap, deduct from your score, the number of points marked for each piece of equipment used;

	points
1. Any sight	60
2. Walking the string	50
3. Walking the face/multi-anchors	40
4. Any release other than fingers	40
5. Three fingers under the nock	30
6. Clickers (any type draw check)	20
7. Compound bow	20
8. String peep (any type or mark)	20
9. Recurve Bow	10
10. Stabilizer (any type - frt. or back)	5

For full score, you must use a straight limb bow and shoot with a split finger, with top finger at corner of mouth, one finger on top of arrow and two fingers under the arrow. After all that's how archery got started maybe we need to start there now.

Because some people think rules are made to be broken, we must insist that any infraction of these rules would bring a disqualification.

To help to speed up the game, a time limit should be set or invoked; A max. of one minute per arrow per archer per target, shooting in groups of two, four shooters per target, 8 minutes per group.

Next;

At each pin shoot, first 10 places in each class will receive points from your score, to be added together to form an aggregate score, to be taken to your state shoot and added to your state shoot score. Points will be governed by the first two numbers of your score, splitting at 5 on the third number;

534--would be 53 points

537-- would be - 54 points

These points the archer would keep with him, so the more he shoots the more points he would have to add to form his aggregate score (up to 10 of his highest scores). That way the people that support archery would have the best chance to win. With this system our State Championship would not be won or lost on a three round shoot. This system should also eliminate sand baggers. Our State Champions would be the two top archers in each class. These archers would be sent to the Nationals, to represent our State, and have a shot at the National Title. This would make the National Championship mean something. We may be able to get T/V Coverage, have a two week vacation trip or something as a prize, make it worthwhile.

Give the 10 top shooters arm patches, from 1 to 10, so everyone knows (whose, who) for the rest of the year. This would be for the top (A class) only. There would be no need to change the Sectionals, as this would add a dark horse to the National shoot.

This system would also eliminate the big problem of 1,000 archers, and what to do with them at the National Shoots.

It's time for a change, something must change, or we will lose our lifes blood, the week/end archer or bow hunter. We will never know if we could make it work, if we do not try, it may be a better way?
