



NATIONAL RECORD SET AT FOURTH ANNUAL OPEN HELD AT WYTHE RANGE

Wythe Bowhunters Range was the scene July 10 and 11 of the 4th Annual Open. James Thurman, Tennessee Free Style Champion, set a new national record when he shot a 556 Saturday and came back Sunday to shoot another 556. He dropped only two arrows from the five circle to the three circle shooting 556 out of a possible 560.

Women's Free Style winner was Pansey Brown, Maryland F/S Champion, with a 478 and a 492.

In the Bare Bow Division, Billy Umbarger won for the men with 491 and 498 while Virginia Dillow with 340 and 329 won it for the women.

The Bowhunter Division honors were taken by Frank and Dollie McPeak of Front Royal. Frank's scores were 454 and 475 and Dollie's were 301 and 283.

Youth Free Style was won after a 6 target shoot-off by Jeff Forlines of Bluefield, W. Va. who took first over Mike DuBrueler of Vienna, Va. Both youths had an aggregate score of 902.

Youth Bare Bow was won by Harry Derenger of Bluefield, Va. with 477 and 428.

Ninety-one shooters from six states competed for the trophies and championship places. Dr. Walter Dillow said, "The Wythe Bowhunters wants to thank those who worked every afternoon to prepare the range for the state event. Wytheville was honored to get the bid for this shoot since this is the first time it has been held in this part of the state."

TOUGH COMPETITION

At Cub Run's Annual Safari Shoot, after all the competitive smoke had cleared, Larry Houseman, Wendall Thweatt and Tom Hancock were tied with 552. Casual registration was used and your highest round was recorded. There was a sudden death shoot-off. Using the 80 yd. shot, they gradually backed up from 50 yards to 70 before anyone dropped an arrow out of the 20 ring (animal scoring used). Larry Houseman was declared winner.
