For the ninth consecutive year, Triangle Bowhunters hosted the 1983 State Indoor Championship. The event was attended by more than 150 archers from all over the state and as usual, Triangle members put on a well run event.

Jim Gregory won his first Indoor Championship, posting perfect "300" rounds and winning the Freestyle division by defeating last year's State Champion Joe Herbert in a shoot-off.

Cathy Chilton captured the Women's Freestyle title after shooting an impressive two day total of 590.

Other winners were Kendall Woody, who won the Young Adult FS division by shooting two perfect rounds.

Men's CFSBH-UL remained very competitive again this year with Dennis Mills taking home top honors with a 596.

### VBA Meeting Highlights

VBA is proud to announce we have set a new record in '83. We have 1,212 members and 34 chartered clubs which represent a record quarter and we are still growing!!

At the March 26-27 meeting held in Charlottesville, 22 clubs had delegates present.

Field Vice President, Dickie Hall told us that in Women's CFSBH, 100 grain field points are allowed. He also explained that archers who shoot CFSBH and use a pin guard must remove two pins from their sights as the top and bottom of a pin guard can be used as sights. Those using the Fine-Line brand sight must remove two cross-hair pins. Bear in mind that in CFSBH, you may only have FIVE FIXED reference points.

The Conservation fund balance now stands at \$1,167.06, and your Conservation Vice President reminded clubs that this money is available to any VBA club that wishes to plant seedlings on their ranges or do other conservation work.

VBA Field Governor, Bill Taylor reminded clubs that the range inspection fee has been increased to \$10.00. PLEASE, CLUB SECRETARIES, remember this whenever your range inspection is due.

The only agenda items for vote at the June VBA meeting is as follows:

(Warwick Bowmen) Shooting styles designations at all VBA sanctioned events conform to the NFAA designations as shown on the 1983 NFAA handicap cards (FS, FSL, BB, BHFS, BHFS-L, AND BH). The motion is to amend the VBA Bylaws, Article 14, Sec. 3 to change the "Competitive FS Bowhunter" designation to "Bowhunter Freestyle".

We, the undersigned wish to recommend Denny Fry for consideration as a member of the Order of the Golden Feather.



### Colorado Bowhunt As Reported By 1983 Raffle Winner, George Winfield

I purchased my winning ticket for the VBA raffle bowhunt from John H. Jones.

It was the hunt of a lifetime, even though I did not fill my tags. Guide and outfitter, Rudy Steele, runs a first rate hunting camp.

We hunted the White River National Refuge in Western Colorado. The elevation was between 8,000 and 9,000 feet. I trained for the altitude by running up and down Mt. Trashmore, in Virginia Beach, early each morning.

The fare served by the camp cook was a gourmet's delight, in the rugged Colorado Rocky Fashion. He-man meals to carry the hunters through the day. Some of the hunters threatened to leave home and take up with the cook.

The day's hunt began at 3:30 a.m. A meeting was held after breakfast with Rudy Steele, all his guides plus the hunters.

About an hour before daylight the , guides drove us to the stand areas. All the stands were located in trees in prime game area. I expected to see elk or deer any second.

If the first hour I spent in the stand was any indication of the abundance of game, I was sure I would be able to pick my trophy. I was watching two bull elk at about 200 yards feeding towards me. At the same time, I caught movement about 20 yards from my stand. In another minute I had two spike mule bucks 10 yards from my stand. Now I was faced with a decision. Elk was my primary target, and they were within 150 yards now. My decision made, I returned my attention to the elk, now at 80 yards.

I lost sight of the elk and when I saw them again, they were headed down a ridge to the canyon floor. With no chance for a shot, I settled in to watch the views of this beautiful country and wait for more game.

As the week went by, I watched more game, but none were close enough for a shot. The week was productive for our camp, with two bull elk and one 8-point mule harvested, and many shirt tails forfeited.

In camp that week were 6 other hunters from Virginia. Memories of the camp, the country, and my opportunity to hunt elk for such a small donation to the VBA will be with me forever.

I am looking forward to the '83 raffle.
