### FROM HUNTING V.P.

I received Forty Five Big Game applications for this past hunting season. I haven't received any information on the number of deer killed with the Bow, but I'm sure the number is much larger than Forty Five.

According to the applications 45% of the hunters used Bows of the 45 pound weight. This is plus or minus 2 pounds. The remaining hunters, 55% used Bows 50 pounds or heavier.

The average shot taken at deer was between 15 and 20 yards. The longest shot was 60 yards and the shortest 5 Yards. The average distance a deer traveled after being hit was approx. 75 yards. Although the Bear Razor Head was the most used broad head, there were many different types of heads used.

At the Game Commission meeting, we did get them to consider the post Bow season West of the Blue Ridge. The final decision will be made May 2, 1975.

The Carp Awards go to David Proctor, Bowhunters of Rockingham. David's Carp took first and weighed 23 pounds 40z. Bob Morton of the same Club took second. His carp weighed 19 pounds 80z.

## HOWARD HILL

Archers are indeed saddened about the loss of Howard Hill. Hill was truly the Babe Ruth of Archery. Most people think of Howard Hill for his greatness in hunting which he did bring to public attention through his great hunting exploits all over the world. But, it also should be noted that Howard Hill shot in some 190 odd Field Archery Tournaments and won them all. In these tournaments he shot a straight limbed 85 lb. bow with 11/32 wooden arrows and he averaged over 435 per 28 targets, instinctively, and this was probably 35 or 40 years ago. This would be quite a feat using the same tackle right now.


Howard Hill's short news reel type films about his hunting expeditions and his exhibition shooting, field archery skills have been seen throughout the world. This has been a tremendous help in the promotion of archery. I remember seeing these films as a kid and marveling at the ability of this man with the Bow and arrow, before I ever dreamed of becoming an archer myself.

Howard Hill was also noted for his great trick shooting in movies for such actors as Errol Flynn in "Robinhood" and others. Howard and Errol Flynn became great friends and they would go out on Errol Flynn's fishing boat and this is where some of his short subject films were made on shooting fish with the bow and arrow.

I have hit upon just a few of his accomplishments in this article. We all know he had many more. So, I say again, Archery has lost a fine man whether you think of him as a hunter or a field archer. ED.






