From The NBEF Director

In just a few short weeks, many of us will be enjoying the sunrise from a treestand! I would like to encourage everyone to use a safety harness or belt when installing and hunting from stands. Last year the DGIF reported 12 incidents occurring while using stands. These figures are down from 22 the previous year.

A harness that supports both the legs and upper torso is the most effective. If you fall, you will remain in an upright position. Second best is an upper torso harness. Lastly, the safety belt. When using a belt system, be sure to position and tighten the belt under your arms. That's where it will end up at the time of a fall! Be sure to tie your harness or belt high up on the tree.

This will eliminate a lengthy fall and minimize the potential for injury.

When using steps and ladders to reach your platform stand, install the last step above the platform so as to allow you to step down on the stand. If you have to step up to the platform, you will push the stand away from the tree.

Safety should always be your first priority. Use the lineman's rope as you ascend or descend the tree. If you think these methods are a waste of time or are outright inconvenient, call me and I'll introduce you to some ex-treestand hunters who now utilize a wheelchair!

Have a safe hunting season! ⚡

From The Publicity Chairperson

The First Annual VBA Membership Competition has only three months before its conclusion.

Earlier this year, the VBA Delegates authorized two awards for an annual membership competition. One award is a Certificate that will be presented to any VBA club which exceeds its previous year's membership by 15 percent. The second award is a plaque that will be presented to the club with the highest percentage of membership increase for one year.

The current competition runs from January 1, 1999 to December 31, 1999. Each club's membership at the end of this year will be compared to the club's membership as of last year on December 31.

The club awards will be presented at the VBA banquet in March.

This competition is to encourage clubs to solicit membership. Small clubs do not need many new members to meet the goal, but they are challenged because there are not many current members to do the

actual recruiting. Large clubs face the obvious challenge that they need several new members to meet the goal. The good news is that with enthusiasm, innovation and effort, every club has a chance.

All clubs are encouraged to make a final effort to exceed the 15 percent minimum. Increased membership is a win-win situation - the club wins and the individual archer wins! ↗

Wanted - Bowhunters!

The VBA recently initiated a statewide campaign to dramatically increase the number of Bowhunter Memberships. A Bowhunter Membership is for archers who want to join the VBA but do not want to affiliate with a club. As the campaign continues, we ask *your* help.

The membership fee of \$20 entitles the individual to attend the annual banquet, participate in VBA hunting competitions (e. g. Bill Bennett, Big Buck, Largest Rack, Big Doe and Carp/Gar/Skate/Shark), receive the quarterly issues of *Flight*, receive a yearly schedule shoot card and participate in all local and state tournaments.

The primary vehicle to increase membership is a new brochure that describes the VBA, lists what the VBA has done for bowhunters and states why a bowhunter should join the organization. Copies of the brochure were provided to each club this summer. The clubs were asked to have them displayed in sporting goods and other businesses that cater to archers.

The membership effort addresses two critical elements. First, it could represent the future of the VBA. Membership has declined steadily during the past few years to approximately 1,200, which is a challenge to the VBA in terms of competitive events

and financial stability. At the same time, about 60,000 bowhunting licenses are sold each year in Virginia. In addition, 3-D archery is riding the crest of a wave in popularity. Through the new brochure, the VBA hopes to reach hunters who will support our efforts to represent their interests with the State Legislature and the Virginia Department of Game and Inland Fisheries (VDGIF). The brochure is also a way to reach archers interested in 3-D shoots.

Second, by joining the VBA with a Bowhunter Membership, the hunter helps himself and his sport. Through membership, the individual supports an organization that has successfully lobbied the Virginia Legislature to improve archery hunting and has vigorously involved itself in conservation efforts. The VBA also strongly supports and protects hunting rights against the anti-hunting movement and sponsors the International Bowhunters Education Program (IBEP) in the state. In addition, the VBA has developed various award and recognition programs to recognize successful hunters.

The current VBA membership knows their area and the hunters in it better than anyone else. Hopefully, each member will use the information

in this article or in the brochure to recruit one Bowhunter Member. This realistic goal, if attained, would double our membership by the end of the year. The benefits to the new individuals and the organization are obvious. Potential members include previous club members, individuals who have come to club meetings as guests, hunting friends and others. The list is limited only by imagination.

Anyone who wants to join as a Bowhunter Member needs to send Ann R. Boyd (see address on page 2) a \$20 check made payable to the VBA. Included must be the member's name, address (street, city, state and zip) and whether the member wants to be contacted by an archery club in his/her area. For additional information, call Ann toll-free at 888-922-9536.

The results of membership efforts will be reported at the January VBA meeting and awards will be presented at the VBA banquet in March. The success of this effort will be determined in the next couple of months as bowhunters focus on the archery season. Please, help *NOW!* ↗

Ready, Aim, Fish!

The VBA competition for the largest Carp, Gar, Skate and Shark is eagerly contested by many people in Virginia, but the Belvoir Bowhunters always go after it in a big way.

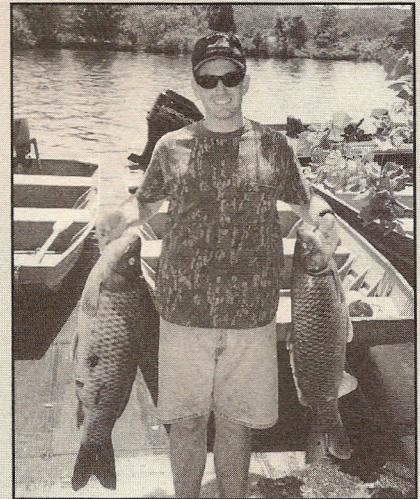
Each year the club sponsors a Carp/Gar shoot. This year the event was held June 6 on the Potomac River's Tompkins Basin near Ft. Belvoir. There were 14 boats and 35 bowfishers who toiled from 7 a.m. to 2 p.m. to see who could land the most and the largest of the species.

Charlie Shupienus, the Club's Activity Director, said more than 100 fish were boated and the average weight was more than 20 pounds. It doesn't take a calculator to figure that at the end of the day more than a ton of smelly, slimy, ugly fish were on the beach.

The winning boat had 30 fish, while the second place landed 25 fish and third place 18 fish. Champions were picked based on the length of the fish. Bob Zebell arrowed the longest carp at 38 $\frac{1}{2}$ " and Robbie Bowe had the longest gar at 41". When last seen, they (and others) were headed for a local shop to weigh the fish so they could be entered in the VBA contest. Others were seen headed to homeless shelters to donate their efforts. It takes some creative work, but there *are* ways to cook these fish!

Carp and gar are not considered game fish so there is no limit on their harvest. In fact, anglers are encouraged to take as many as possible since a large number of "trash" fish in rivers makes life difficult for bass and other game fish.

Entries in the various bowfishing categories of the VBA competition can be forwarded to Ann Boyd (see address on page 2). They must be received within 90 days of harvest. Fish taken after November 15, 1999 must have the form returned before February 15, 2000 in order to have time to prepare plaques. Winners will be presented with their plaques at the VBA banquet in March. Entry forms are available from each VBA club secretary or from Ann Boyd. ✦



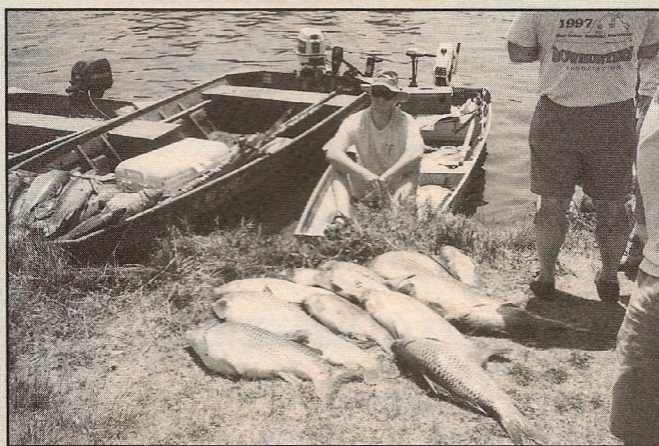

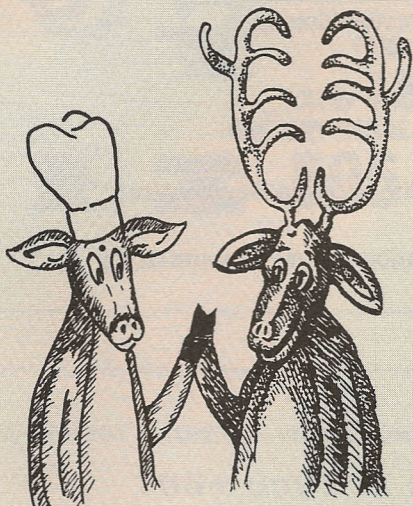

Spiced Indian Venison Stew With Yogurt

3/4 tsp. ground cardomom

1/8 tsp. cloves

1/8 tsp. nutmeg

2 Tbsp. lemon juice

1 1/2 cups plain yogurt

2 1/2 lbs. venison, trimmed of fat and
cut in 1" pieces

1 Tbsp. whipped butter

2 cups onion, finely chopped

1 Tbsp. ginger, peeled and grated

2 large garlic cloves, pressed

1 tsp. ground coriander

1 tsp. ground cumin

1/4 tsp. turmeric

3/4 tsp. salt

pepper to taste

1 cup plain yogurt, stirred until
smooth

fresh cilantro, chopped

Mix cardamom, cloves, nutmeg and lemon juice with one cup yogurt in a large bowl. Dry venison cubes and add to spiced yogurt. Cover and refrigerate overnight. Melt butter in a skillet over medium-low heat. Add onion, ginger and garlic and cook until onion is just tender, stirring frequently. Set aside. Mix coriander, cumin and turmeric into meat mixture. Combine meat mixture with onion mixture. Add salt and pepper. Cover and cook two hours over very low heat, stirring frequently. Uncover and cook until venison is tender, about 30 minutes, adding up to one-half cup of yogurt if mixture becomes dry. Divide venison among warmed serving plates. Drizzle one cup stirred yogurt over servings and sprinkle with cilantro. Serves 6 to 8.

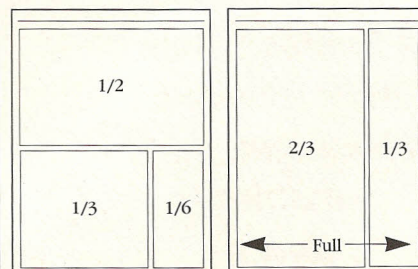

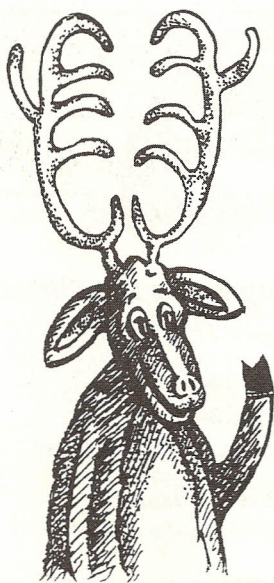
