


Flight Deadline

From the Office of the NFAA Director 1992 State Closed

The 1992 State VBA Championships were held September 5 and 6 at Newport News, Virginia, at the home of the Warwick Bowmen. There were 185 total shooters. Twenty-two youth shooters and 3 pro shooters were present. Saturday's shoot went off without a hitch. Sunday's shoot just was not to be. The horn sounded at 9:00 a.m. on the button. The rain, thunder, and lightning started at 10:22 a.m. The entire field of shooters were ushered off the range, to await a decision by the tournament officials. A decision was made to wait until 11:30 a.m. to make a decision as to what course would be taken. When the time came to make a decision, the storm had not let up, so the TOURNA-MENT WAS CALLED. The scores from the first day's shoot would be used to decide the outcome of this year's tournament. There were no ties in any of the classes counting X's.

Kendall Woody outshot the field with an impressive 550, 61 X score

Saturday. Close behind were Ron Neville and Joe Herbert each with a 549 with only 2 X's separating them. Right on their heels was Michael Ware, a Cub freestyler who posted a score of 545, 64 X count. Well done! Watch out, fellows, this cub has claws.

A sad note to the good time had by all despite the bad weather on Sunday. We must say a temporary good-bye at least to Brad Marshall. Brad will be moving to England at the first of the year. Brad has been BB National Champion on at least 2 occasions since moving to Virginia from New York. He has been our State Closed BB Champion and State Open champion as well. His skill with a bow will long be remembered. But what I will miss most of all, will be Mr. Marshall's warm smile whenever your eye met his. A real "Southern Gentleman" even if he was transplanted from up north, Good luck, Brad. Hope to see you again on the ranges in Virginia wher you return. -John Street







Dear Fellow Archers,

I am writing this letter to the editor at the risk of being labeled a complainer but some things just can't be left unsaid if one is to sleep untroubled at night. I refer to the recent VBA State Closed Championship and the unsatisfactory conditions under which it was conducted. When I arrived on Friday afternoon to scout around and get in some practice, I was shocked when my first arrow, shot from a 50 pound bow, shot completely through the center of the 60 yd. bale and stuck in the bank behind it. I then moved to the 50 yd., 30 yd., and the 20 yd. targets with similar results! I then decided to shoot the range instead because surely they would be in good shape. I was wrong! Of the first 5 targets I shot, I had pass throughs on 3. The other two stopped at the fletching. This shoot was advertised as being held on a 5 star range. That means one of the best in the state, folks! Yes, I shoot carbon arrows; yes, they can be hard to stop from a heavy bow. I have been shooting the same arrows at more poundage for 8 years and have never had such problems. I have also been the Range Captain at Augusta Archers for over 6 years so I know what it takes to keep up a range properly.

After speaking to other archers, I was not alone in my opinion of conditions at the Warwick club. Several have told me that the same conditions existed last season when the Mid-Atlantic Championship was held there.

I think it's time to scrap the round robin arrangement and go back to bidding for the major shoots in our state. It seems that some clubs don't have any incentive to improve or even keep up their ranges when they know they will get shoots any way. Let us, the shooters, decide where we like to shoot and who will work to make our state shoots enjoyable.

I have been told that many of the participants will not attend the Mids next year because of the conditions at Warwick and that's sad!

I have one more gripe. This year our NFAA Director took it upon himself to address all of us at the State Closed with his personal views on having a separate 3D shoot card from the dot shoot card. During his speech he talked about protecting our clubs from the onslaught which would be brought upon by the addition of the 3D card.

He told each and every member to go home and defeat this proposition. It must be nice to have a forum to speak when you don't give anyone the opportunity to oppose your position! In my opinion, and I guess I'm still allowed to have one, his position should be to support what the membership wants, not to dictate his desires to us! The 3D game is here to stay, folks. We can try to ignore it but it won't go away. What will go away are good archery clubs from the "protection" of the VBA! If we legislate who can shoot and where, the public will go to non-VBA clubs to shoot 3D. Most people who want to shoot 3D will shoot them if they have to travel to do it or not. The dot shooters of us will travel for dot shoots and could care less about 3D. Let's face it, 3D shoots are money makers. What club in this state can afford to pass up the profits provided by the game? Several clubs have already left the VBA to hold only 3D shoots. Let's not let this happen!

I know I have said some unkind things in this letter and I am sorry if I have offended the many members of Warwick Bowmen who worked so hard on Labor Day weekend.

We must all work together if our sport is to be truly enjoyed by all Virginians and their children. Let's serve the interest of all of us and not those of a political few. Let's support archery in whatever way possible.

My comments here are purely my own but I believe they are felt by a great number of fellow archers.
