

Field Vice President's Report

Probably most of you have heard that Augusta declines to hold the State Closed, which is on Labor Day weekend. At the January meeting I will accept bids to host this tournament. Buggs Island has discussed, with me, letting VBA use their 28 target range and 14 target practice area for the Closed. Considering the size of the last 4 state championships, including the 3-D's, I think that a club with a single 28 target range and a 14 target practice range may host our Championships. Only one 28 target 3-D range is required to host the two VBA STATE 3-D Championships. Parking, camping and clubhouse facilities are the most restrictive requirements. Plan on being at the next VBA meeting to discuss important issues. The Tournament Committee held on Saturday is a good place to start a creative discussion on tournaments, range requirements, host sites and most anything concerning the competitive aspect of ARCHERY.

I am working on the 1994 schedule and have received some changes from clubs, have you reviewed your 1994 schedule? I plan on making a final copy of the schedule in early December.

Sherwood and Augusta are hosting the Spring and Fall 3-D tournaments and I hope they have their Tournament Committees working on publicity and advertisement, NOW. Advertisement to non-VBA clubs, dealers, archery shops and the media should be sent out in January and followed up every month.

Wythe Bowhunters 1993-94 Indoor Practice Night Schedule



From the Office of the Corresponding Secretary

The end of 1993 is quickly creeping upon us and that means it's time to begin collecting dues for the upcoming year. All club charters and VBA membership dues expire December 31. Lend a hand to your secretary by sending your dues in early. Club officers' dues must be sent in with the charter before the deadline of January 28, 1994.

NFAA will mail the charter renewal forms to the clubs. All the other necessary papers to re-charter will be mailed to the club secretaries by this office on or before December 5. All papers, plus your club constitution and by-laws, if they have changed, must be received before I can process your club's re-charter application, so PLEASE return all papers at one time. Remember, there is a dues increase beginning 1-1-94 of \$1.00 for head of households only. If you no longer hold this office, please forward

way as they were sent in the year before. Print or write names and addresses so they can be read. New members should be sent in with first name, middle initial and last name. Social security numbers should be sent in for all members, since this is the only positive ID we have. Include VBA ID numbers, if possible, as these are used for tournament reports. Do not send in a member without the complete address or youth without the birthdate (month, day and year). NFAA will not accept a member without complete information.

All VBA memberships expire December 31 of each year. All club members must belong to VBA. Members who are not planning to shoot in



competition may join VBA only, however, if they shoot in competition for awards, it is mandatory that they have a valid handicap card. To receive this card, they have to join NFAA.

Hunting Vice President's Report

"ramblin' round"

Over the past four years I have written a column for my local club newsletter. The title of that column was and still is "ramblin' round." Now I want to move that same column to FLIGHT but first I must explain the title. It is really quite simple and straightforward, as your hunting vicepresident I want to discuss those things which are important to all of us as bowhunters but I will likely ramble from one subject to another, hence the title. I also want to make sure I'm writing about things of interest to you and to that end I ask that you let me know what your concerns are. My address and phone numbers are located elsewhere in FLIGHT.

Last issue of FLIGHT contained a letter from Owen Shifflett primarily concerning the addition of another week to the muzzleloader season. Owen raised two other issues that go well beyond the extended muzzleloader season. First, when our hunting privileges are threatened we cannot leave it to anyone else to protect them. We, as individuals and as an organization, must make sure our concerns are known, our votes are counted so-to-speak. If we don't let our representatives who make and change laws know how we feel personally on an issue then we must hold ourselves responsible as we lose privileges and rights we have previously enjoyed. Second, Owen is right, there is stagnation in the growth of the VBA. In fact the number of members has not only stopped growing it has decreased. There are over 60,000 archers in Virginia, at least there were more than that number of resident archery licenses sold last year. The VBA currently has fewer 2,000 members . . . there is something decidedly wrong with that picture. Owen said that the first question many bowhunters ask is "what does the VBA do for us?" I have a couple of questions for Owen and you. What do you think the VBA, specifically the hunting v.p., should be doing for you and what should we (that means you and I) be doing to get more of those 60,000 bowhunters into the VBA??? Remember there is strength in numbers and 60,000 is a politically significant number. I know I will hear from Owen as soon as he reads this and I hope to hear from you too.

To ramble on. How many of you have been fortunate enough to harvest a deer this year? If you have and intend to submit it for a Bill Bennett Award, remember it must be submitted 90 days from date of harvest to the VBA Corresponding Secretary, Ann Boyd, not to yours truly. Ann will send them to me. How many of you have been fortunate enough to harvest more than one deer, have you considered sharing that good fortune with the Hunters for The Hungry organization? It may be something your club would be interested in doing. If you are interested let me know and I will send you more information. This seems to be a worthwhile endeavor and one that deserves consideration.

Enough rambling this time around. I hope to hear from many of you and have the opportunity to meet you during the next year.
