## From the President

### Thoughts From A Tree Stand

I truly enjoy (and feel honored) to serve as the President of the VBA. While I completely believe the purpose of the VBA is to server all of our archery community, I'm a bowhunter at heart, and the fall is my time! After months of waiting, opening day has arrived! While I didn't get a first day deer, I had a great time sitting up in a tree and watching the world go by. Of course, all that time gives a man time to think, so here are a couple of thoughts on the upcoming season.

**SAFETY**. This should be at the top of every bowhunter's list from the first day of the season until you put away your treestands and reminisce about the season! Every bowhunter should be wearing a modern fall restraint system that includes a suspension relief strap. The number one risk to you is falling out of your treestand, and it doesn't take much. Anyone who has taken my IBEP Class will tell you that I start out by reading an article about a bowhunter just like you and me, who fell 16 feet and died from his injuries. Even if you are wearing a fall restraint system, you must know how to properly use it, or you still risk injury or even death. Always keep and adjust the safety strap so that your hips never fall beneath your platform. That makes it easy to self-recover and get back up if you do slip. It also minimizes the force you will feel when the line pulls tight, as well as keeping you from slamming into the tree. Make it a point to watch the safety video that comes with your tree stand. The manufacturer wants you to be safe and has spent a lot of effort to make their video easy to understand. The bottom line is that we owe it to ourselves, our friends and our families to come out of the woods safe every night, so it's foolish (and irresponsible) not to take advantage of every safety feature you can while hunting. If you own an old one, spend the money to upgrade – it's the best bowhunting investment you will make all season.

**ETHICS**. The definition I teach in my classes is that Ethics is what you do when no one is around. Like when a nice buck comes by 5 minutes after legal shooting time. Or the big one you have been chasing finally appears, but the only shot he presents is outside of the distance you feel comfortable shooting. Or you climb out of your treestand and go to your downed doe only to find it has small antlers you didn't see, and you have to use your last buck tag to make it a legal harvest. In each of these situations, and many more that can occur during a season, you will define your ethics by the choices you make. I truly hope you make the right choices. No matter how difficult they seem at the time, they will be ones that you can live with, and think back on without guilt or regret. I hope every bowhunter develops a deep respect and admiration for what is truly one of the most elusive game animals in the world – a mature whitetail deer. If you do, then taking one by anything other than fair chase just won't be an option, and that will be how you define your ethics as a bowhunter.

**FELLOWSHIP**. While I love my time alone, my best hunts are always with my hunting partners, who have the same passion that I do. It *Continued on page 3*

If you look at the application for the big game awards you will see that instead of taking your doe to a check station you can now use this system to also gauge the weight of your trophy.

Since the summer issue came out the VBA has been rather busy with Fall 3D championship and the State Closed championship and taking the VBA display to several fairs and the Virginia Outdoor Sports Show, I personally helped with Shenandoah County Fair and had a great time meeting new people and handing out information about the VBA and the local clubs here in the Shenandoah valley, I handed out packets and membership applications to a lot of people.





Wally wants to dedicate this issue's recipe to Dave Burpee since he has a fresh Antelope in the freezer, so this is for you Dave.

### Seared Antelope with Tomato Salsa

This quick recipe can be prepared as an appetizer or as a main course. The antelope backstrap is seared to a medium rare in melted butter and sautéed garlic and pairs well when served with a fresh tomato salsa and grilled flatbread.



- 10 antelope backstrap steaks, 1/4" thick
- 2 tablespoons butter
- 5 tomatoes diced, roughly 4 cups
- 2 garlic cloves chopped
- 2 tablespoons basil chopped
- 1 jalapeno chopped (don't rub your eyes after chopping)
- 1 tablespoon olive oil

Grilled flat bread

Kosher salt and pepper

#### Directions

Generously season both sides of the backstrap steaks with Kosher salt and pepper. Set aside to bring to room temp before cooking. Chop tomatoes, 1 garlic clove, basil and jalapeno and place in a bowl .Add olive oil and a pinch of salt and pepper. Stir together and let marinade until you are ready to serve. Heat a seasoned cast iron skillet over medium heat. Add butter and remaining garlic clove. Place antelope steaks in butter and garlic and sear about 2-3 minutes, turn and continue to sear on the other side about 2-3 minutes. Remove steaks from skillet and place on a plate. Let rest 5 minutes. Slice and serve with tomato salsa and flat bread.

## AGENDA ITEMS

(1) Sect. 15.1.10 Registration Fees, pg. 11, Add section E: A 80% refund will be sent to shooters that prepay, but do not make the shoot. The host club is to keep 20% and send refund within 14 days of shoot to the shooter. Effective Jan. 1018.

Justification: The contracts state refunds to be given according to By-Laws. The current By-Laws have no section for this.

(2) Article 22, pg. 21, Standing Rules, Add Rule 21: The Association shall create a hunting award known as the Dave Proctor Southern Bowhunter Award. It shall be based on an accumulative point system committee. Effective start date, January 2018.

(3) VBA By-Laws, Article 8, pg. 7: Request a pay raise for the Executive State Secretary and Treasurer. \$1.00 more is recommended from \$4.00 to \$5.00 per member. Effective, January 2018.

Justification: To compensate in a small token of appreciation for all the extra duties she performs above and beyond the requirements of her office.

(4) Section 11.5 Family Membership. VBA Dues Breakdown: Change 1st member from \$20.00 to \$22.00. Effective January 2019.

Justification: Increase dues to compensate for loss of dollar shooting fee and increase in salary for secretary.

(5) Article 11. Dues, Section 11.1, pg. 9, Bowhunter Members: Dues for calendar year will be changed to \$20.00. Effective January 2018.

Justification: To increase Bowhunter Membership.


(6) Section 15.1.10, Paragraph D, Registration Fees, Pg. 13, Delete: Pertains to one dollar per shooter for any sanctioned tournament. Effective, January 2018.

Justification: Many clubs do not like this fee, so they do not schedule more shoots.

(7) Section 16.5, pg. 16: Order of the Golden Feather: The Order of the Golden Feather proposes the VBA adopt a new award entitled the Silver Arrow Award. Effective, January 2018.

Justification: There have been instances where OGF nominees have done excellent work over an extended period of time at the Club and Region level, but for various reasons, primarily a lack of service at the State or National level, have not been accepted into the Order. The OGF membership feels that these individuals should be eligible for an appropriate award that recognizes their accomplishments and service to the VBA.

# **ANTELOPE HOLE IN ONE?**



I went on an antelope hunt and a golf game broke out.

Sounds too weird to be true and of course it isn't, but the truth is not far removed. First, the details. Three friends (Bob Seltzer, John Peeler and Jack Denbow) and I have fallen into the wonderful habit of hunting antelope in Wyoming every odd year. The others have been on several trips, this was only my fourth. I had been fortunate to harvest antelopes on my previous three trips and looked forward to another opportunity. My earlier encounters were all good animals with one scoring close to Pope and Young, but so far "the big one" had eluded me.

The night before the hunt we drew blinds (all of which were situated near water holes) out of a hat and I drew one named West Solar. Arriving at the blind just past sunup, I discovered the blind was aptly named for the nearby solar panel that powered a well pump. About 30 minutes after settling in the blind, the parade of antelopes began. Over the next 2 hours six NICE bucks came to water. And, naturally, each time fate intervened. Fate included: three antelopes in the first group sent the smallest (still NICE) to water first and he spotted me so they all ambled off, a fourth antelope watered head-on, another watered quartering towards, and the sixth (the smallest of all the animals) presented a broadside shot, but I was not up to the task and missed.

I was using a Great Northern Ghost recurve with wooden arrows, but no excuses. I must have found the panic button and mashed it because the arrow went right over the vitals area and cleared the animal's back. My only consolation is that it was a clean miss.....

More than a dozen does watered in the next few hours and about 3PM I was still bemoaning my fate and kicking my butt when I glanced out the shooting window and saw a NICE buck about 100 yards away. By now

I had determined the modis operandi at the watering hole was for the animal to stand about 100 yards away on the high ground and extensively survey the waterhole over an extended period of time. I had made the mistake earlier of watching the animal move to water and then taking up a shooting position and naturally was spotted as I moved.

This time I immediately moved to a back corner to where I could only see the water's edge. I knew that from this location the buck could not see me and I would be able to see his legs when he started to drink, at which time I could take one step and come to full draw. It took about 20 minutes – 20 VERY LONG minutes -- in that corner not knowing if he had left but finally I spotted his legs moving to water. Unfortunately, at the same time, a doe moved to water and was looking directly into the blind through the other shooting hole. If I moved quickly, she was sure to spot me.

I debated whether to pass the shot but decided to take a slow step and draw. If the doe did not alert, I was good to go. If she did alert, I would not shoot but wait for another opportunity. Just as I completed my move and draw, I could sense her movement from the water but the buck had not moved so I released what turned out to be an 11-yard shot. The J&M Traditions arrow with a 145-grain eclipse broadhead flew true and looked solid on the quartering-away buck. He ran off and I last saw him go over a small rise about 200 yards away. I did not see him come up the far side and began to worry. It was possible he had not been hit as hard as I thought and had turned left or right and kept on going out of sight.

It is important to note at this point in the story that all our trips are to the same location – the Werner Ranch about 45 minutes north of Douglas. JJ and Connie are terrific hosts, Connie is a great cook and JJ spares no efforts to put you on antelope. He and his brother-in-law Mark Woolard, who helps him each hunting season, are terrific guides.

I called JJ and Mark and over the next 90 minutes they scoured with binos the area around the small rise as well as any other paths the buck may have taken. Finally, Mark took his vehicle to very near the last spot I saw the buck and got out to walk the ground. He had not gone far when he found my animal dead – and this is where the golf analogy comes into play. He had died on his feet at a full run and slid into a three-foot hole where he was invisible to any view except from directly above. Yes, I had done it. An antelope hole in one.

The buck scored 69 3/8 that evening so there is a good chance the final dried score will exceed the Pope and Young minimum of 67. If not, no worries. I wanted an antelope and the fact it was a NICE one was only icing on the cake.

I should add that the hunters also included Pierre Malko and his wife Dani (one of Bob's daughters). They brought their three youngest daughters along to enjoy the ranch experience and see some historic sights going to and coming from the hunt. Pierre and Dani had both harvested antelopes on previous hunts and this time they took turns each day with one going to the blind and the other staying in camp to entertain/watch/corral the enthusiastic youngsters.

The final hunt tally was hunters six, antelope zero. We packed all the antelope into two large coolers and Dani/Pierre and the girls flew home while the four guys drove to complete the 3,800-mile round trip.

A side benefit of this trip was that the ranch was located in the zone that included a full eclipse of the sun. Fabulous to watch the process while sitting on the porch with a glass of Crown Royal.

The next trip is August 2019 and I am already anticipating a great journey with friends.

# From The VGDIF WebSite Nine New CWD Positives Confirmed in Frederick County

Nine new cases of **Chronic Wasting Disease (CWD)** were detected in Frederick County during the 2016 deer hunting season. Seven were deer harvested by hunters and two were killed by vehicles. All of the new cases were detected in the same general areas as previous cases. In total, 22 CWD-positive deer have been detected in Virginia since CWD was first discovered in western Frederick County in fall 2009.

In 2015, the Virginia CWD Containment Area was expanded to include all of Frederick, Clarke, Warren, and Shenandoah counties. Approximately 1,500 deer from these counties were tested for CWD during the 2016 hunting season. The Virginia CWD Containment area borders are expected to remain the same for the fall 2017 hunting season. The Virginia Department of Game and Inland Fisheries (VDGIF) plans to collect CWD samples from the Containment Area on the first two Saturdays of the 2017 firearms deer season.


VDGIF appreciates the assistance of deer hunters in Frederick, Clarke, Warren, and Shenandoah counties for the excellent cooperation during CWD sample collection this past fall. VDGIF would also like to thank the cooperating road-kill contractor and deer processors for their assistance and looks forward to continuing these partnerships in 2017.

CWD has been detected in 24 states and three Canadian provinces. The disease is a slow, progressive neurologic (brain and nervous system) disease found in deer, elk, and moose in North America which ultimately results in death of the animal. It is spread through urine, feces, saliva, and other body fluids. Symptoms do not appear for several years and include staggering, abnormal posture, lowered head, drooling, confusion, and marked weight loss. There is no evidence that CWD can be naturally transmitted to humans, livestock, or pets, but the Centers for Disease Control advises against eating meat from CWD-positive animals as research continues. Regulations pertaining to CWD, maps of impacted states, and more information about the disease and what VDGIF is doing about it can be found on the **VDGIF website**.







# **Conservation Scholarship**



The VBA Order of the Golden Feather was created to honor those persons who have given unselfishly of their time and talents toward the betterment of archery and archers. Recipients are persons who possess the virtues of sportsmanship, character, morals, integrity and friendship. As a reflection of the substance for membership, only 80 people have been elected to the Order in the past 71 years.

To be qualified, a candidate must be member in good standing of the VBA at the time of nomination, must have a minimum of ten successive years' membership in the VBA and must be sponsored by three VBA members of good standing or by a VBA Club.

This article is a reminder that candidates must be submitted to the Board of Directors at the March meeting for this year. Nominations must be in writing and be signed by sponsoring individuals or a Club officer. Successful nominees have always performed duties or had an impact outside their immediate club.
