From the President

At our January meeting of the VBA Delegates there were several changes under consideration. I believe the Club Delegates made some very good decisions, and I would like to share some of those with you.

First, the Club Delegates considered the creation of a hunting award known as the Dave Proctor Southern Bowhunter Award. This award was created at Bowhunters of Rockingham by Dave, and has been in place several years. Starting this year, our Bowhunters can accumulate points for harvesting game. The point value will be published by our Bowhunting Committee, along with a template for keeping a record of the harvests. Bowhunters will be eligible for recognition through awards when they reach a designated value. Your Club Delegates can provide your Club with details on this new awards program.

Next, the Club Delegates decided to remove the one dollar fee that is sent to the VBA for each shooter at shoots advertised on our Shoot Card. The intent is to encourage our Clubs to put more events on the Shoot Card, so our Members have more visibility of shoots in their area. While this will make the task of deconflicting shoot dates more difficult for Clubs in the same zone, the Delegates believe it will result in greater awareness and turn outs at their local shoots.

The Club Delegates also approved the creation of a new award for VBA members entitled the Silver Arrow Award. This award is intended to recognize VBA members who have made exceptional contributions to Archery and Bowhunting programs at their Club and Regional level. The award does not require participation or contributions at the State or National level. This award will be voted on and approved by the Club Delegates. I know without question we have several outstanding members of our Archery/Bowhunting family who will meet the criteria, and I look forward to recognizing their commitment and support of our sport.

Club Delegates spend some time discussing ideas to improve our Indoor State Tournament, beginning in 2019. Several years ago a decision was made to hold the State Indoors at multiple locations. This removed the need for our members to travel to one site, and incur the cost of staying at a motel for the weekend event. The result was many more of our members were able to participate in the State Indoor tournament at one of the multiple locations. Rules for hosting the tournament were also standardized - to include on-site registration, shoot times, etc. After discussion, the Club Delegates believe that our members would be better served by allowing local host sites to conduct the tournament that best meets the needs of their local area. So while the actual tournament rules for shooting (e.g., classes, equipment, format, etc.) will remain standardized, hosting Clubs have discretion to decide the time for onsite registration, how many rounds per day will be offered. This information will be clearly stated in their flyer published in the Flight. So read the flyer carefully for the location where you want to shoot next year, during the 2019 State Indoor tournament!

These changes reflect the continued commitment of our Clubs to improve our Archery and Bowhunting programs across Virginia! You can help by attending your Club's meetings and sharing your ideas for further improvements!

From the Executive Vice President

Hope everyone had a great hunting season and winter and you got all of the new toys and gadgets you wanted at Christmas. It is now time to think about getting outside and playing with those new toys and gadgets. Indoor archery season is in full swing with local leagues and the state and national tournaments are starting to happen now so go out and burn up some indoor spots to help get you through the cold winter months and I know some clubs have already had some outdoor 3D tournaments so let the fun begin.

I was cruising through Virginia House of Representatives website the other day and I came across a proposed bill that caught my attention, it was HB1393 and it is about allowing Airbows to be used as hunting equipment during bow season. There is nothing about an Airbow that even looks like a bow and according to the definition of a bow it is not a bow. The VGDIF has stated to the VBA that a bow has to propel the arrow or bolt by use of a string and an Airbow does not meet that criteria. I would like everyone to flood the Representatives with emails and phone calls against this bill. The bill was introduced by Barry Knight as HB 1393; Airbow hunting; authorized to hunt deer and small game when hunter is licensed to hunt with bow and arrow. Also there is a Senate bill that pretty much mirrors the House bill, SB859,it was introduced by A. Benton Chafin. Let's do what we can to stop these bills from becoming law.



From the Publicity Director

Over the past two decades as your Publicity Director, I have seen many events that have transpired and some milestones achieved. The original VBA website was re-designed adding more futures, drop down menus and much more information; the original Access database, used to consolidate state tournaments, was re-de-signed and refined in an Excel spreadsheet with much more information to cover all the necessary data; VBA Offices come and go; many archers who have broken State Records or even their own; some members who have had health issues or passed away; the VBA After School Archery Program (ASAP) established; the VBA State Indoor Sectional Tournament from one to four locations; the participation at VBA State Tournaments and club shoots down; the VBA charter clubs down from 26 to the current 16 clubs; and the VBA membership that is down which has had an effect on our revenue.

We have had a busy couple of weeks with this year's general assembly underway in Richmond. The senate is trying to pass a bill that would allow Airbow hunting during Archery Season. I have already sent letters to the Bills sponsor and Co-sponsor asking them to retract the bill as it has no business being in Archery season. It is not a Bow period. The House of Delegates has a similar Bill I have sent them Emails as well. I have also contacted my Senator and Delegate and told them to oppose the Bills. I have also corresponded With Bob Duncan at the DGIF. He agrees with our opinion but it's not up to the game department at this point. I have written Letters to the editor in 12 different newspapers across the state with our opposition on this. So please contact your Senator and Delegate and tell them NO on House Bill 1393 and Senate Bill 859. Also there is a Bill House Bill 1414 that would decrease the Bear Tag from \$25.00 to \$10.00 as we are opposed to the Tag Fee. I believe they are coming around and realizing they screwed up. I have Emailed support for the Bill while maintaining our position against the fee. If you have any concerns or need the Hunting committee's assistance please feel free to contact me. AGENDA ITEMS

(1) Item tabled due to amendment added for April Agenda, refer to April Agenda Item 1.

(2) Art.22, pg 21, Standing Rules, add Rule 21 : The Association shall create a Bowhunting award known as the Dave Proctor Southern Bowhunting Award. It shall be based on Accumulative point system. The points and awards will be at the discretion of the Bowhunting Committee. Effective start date, January 2018, Passed 35-0

(3) VBA By-Laws, Art. 8, pg. 7: Request a pay raise for the Executive State Secretary and Treasure. \$1.00 more is recommended from \$4.00 to \$5.00 per member. Effective Date, January 2018. Passed 29-6

(4) Section 11.5, Family Membership, VBA dues breakdown: change 1st member from \$20.00 to \$22.00. Effective, January 2019, Passed 29-6

(5) Art 11, Dues, Section 11.1, pg. 9, Bowhunter Members: Dues for calendar year will be changed to \$20.00 . Effective, January 2018. Failed, 22-13, needed 2/3 vote.

(6) Sect. 15.1.10, Paragraph D, Registration Fees, pg. 13: Delete, pertains to \$1.00 per shooter for any sanctioned tournament. Effective, January, 2018 Passed 28-6

(7) Sect. 16.5, pg. 16: Order of the Golden Feather proposes the VBA adopt a new award entitled the Silver Arrow Award. Effective, January 2018, Passed 26-9

Agenda Items to be voted on at the April meeting

(1) Section 15.1.10, Registration fees, pg. 12: Add Sect. E: A 80% refund will be sent to preregistered shooters upon a written request submitted within 2 weeks of tournament. The host club may keep 20% of fee and send refund within 14 days to shooter. Effective, immediately.

Justification: Change wording in By-Laws as there is no section for refunds. Change pg. 11 to 12 to fit in new By-law printing

(2) Require the posting of all agenda items with submitting clubs name to the Flight issue, directly following the VBA quarterly meeting. Posting of voting results of agenda items to include the roll call votes for each item in the Flight magazine, following the votes. Effective immediately.

Justification: Many Members do not attend club meetings and deserve to know what changes are being proposed by clubs and the results of such. Also, this might spark interest in the VBA and encourage more members to attend club meetings to be able to discuss the changes and have their vote counted.

(3) Bowhunters of Rockingham would like the VBA to donate a 48"X48" block target to the Town of Shenandoah for their new range. Effective Immediately.

Justification: We believe this will help grow the sport of archery and promote the VBA. This may also help increase membership for BOR and Massanutten Archery Clubs.

Straight Talk About Archery Equipment

Let's get back to using straight talk about archery equipment. I heard last week that the crossbow was called that because it was a cross between a rifle and a bow. Newsflash; the crossbow was around long before gunpowder. Historically it is more accurate to say that combining the shoulder mount feature of the cross bow with the miniaturization of the canon resulted in the individual small arm we call the musket. Later, when we learned how to impart spin on the projectile, the rifle was developed.

So what is the defining feature of archery equipment? The bow is a device that uses bent limbs to impart energy to a projectile like a small spear that we call an arrow. Those bent limbs are springs. Archery limbs have been made out of wood, bone, animal composites, and in modern times, aluminum, fiberglass, carbon and laminations of some of those materials. But they all work the same – they store energy when bent and give up that energy to propel the arrow when released. Therefore it is logical to consider hand held devices that use bent springs – what Traditional Archers call "the bent stick" – to be archery equipment. That includes crossbows.

But now there is a new thing marketed by Crosman called the "Pioneer Air Bow". It is a device that propels an arrow with the release of compressed air. Let's think about that. A firearm – a gun – imparts energy to a projectile through the sudden release of compressed gases generated by an enclosed explosion. Air guns impart energy to a projectile through the sudden release of compressed air (a gas) or compressed carbon dioxide (a component of air). The only difference between an air gun and the "Air Bow" is the projectile. In fact the "Air Bow" most closely resembles a spear gun. Despite the projectile, the Crosman product is decidedly not an archery device and never should be considered a valid device for hunting during the archery season. Come to think of it, calling the Crosman device an "Air Bow" is like calling a slingshot an "elastic pistol".



Conservation Scholarship



The VBA Order of the Golden Feather was created to honor those persons who have given unselfishly of their time and talents toward the betterment of archery and archers. Recipients are persons who possess the virtues of sportsmanship, character, morals, integrity and friendship. As a reflection of the substance for membership, only 80 people have been elected to the Order in the past 71 years.

To be qualified, a candidate must be member in good standing of the VBA at the time of nomination, must have a minimum of ten successive years' membership in the VBA and must be sponsored by three VBA members of good standing or by a VBA Club.

This article is a reminder that candidates must be submitted to the Board of Directors at the March meeting for this year. Nominations must be in writing and be signed by sponsoring individuals or a Club officer. Successful nominees have always performed duties or had an impact outside their immediate club.
