

From the President

First and foremost, I would like to thank all those archers who came out and participated in state shoots this past year. From the feedback I have gotten, most had a great time and enjoyed the shoots. I would also like to thank the Singers Glen, Sherwood, Belvoir, Kingsboro, and Northern Virginia Archers clubs for holding the state tournaments. I know a lot of time and effort goes into hosting these shoots and the clubs' efforts need to be recognized and praised. Again this year, participation at these shoots was not great, especially the State Open and Closed. With membership in the VBA at about 1500, I still do not understand why we can not get more than forty-some shooters at these tournaments! I sincerely hope with VBA membership on the rise this past year that we can encourage more members to attend state tournaments next year.

With hunting season in full swing by the time you are reading this, I want to remind our membership of the many VBA award programs in which you can participate. For the simple price of a postage stamp, you can submit an application and receive the Bill Bennet Award for all deer taken with a bow. The first time you submit an application, you will receive a very nice plaque, and you will receive a nice pin for each subsequent animal taken, with no limit. There are also awards for largest buck taken, by weight and rack, and largest doe by weight. Furthermore, there are the Double and Triple Crown awards for harvesting a deer, bear, and/or a turkey with a bow in the same year. Applications for these awards should be found in this issue and later issues of *FLIGHT*, so please take the time to submit them.

Now, on to a continuing topic that keeps coming up every so often - why should I join the Virginia Bowhunters Association, and what does it do for me? There have been many articles written about this in the past. An especially good one by Jerry Wenzel was recently published in *Flight*, about why you should join a state organization. There are also articles and fliers available, about what the VBA has done for bowhunting in working hard to get our current archery season scheduled, and the close ties it has with the Department of Game and Inland Fishery. And, of course, there are the state tournaments sponsored by the VBA every year. But, for discussion, let us start with - what is the VBA?

Simply put, you are the VBA. The Virginia Bowhunters Association is a collection of local archery clubs joined together to promote the sport of archery. As a member of your local club you are also a member of the VBA. The officers are not the VBA. We do not set policy or establish rules. This is done in a democratic manner by the representatives of the chartered clubs at the quarterly meetings. The officers volunteer their time to enforce the rules set by the local clubs and to keep the clubs informed on what is happening both within the association and outside, pertaining to archery and related matters. Many members seem to believe that the VBA is just an organization to stage and promote archery tournaments, and if you are not into tournament shooting, you do not need to be a member. The VBA is a state organization of local clubs that have banded together

From the NBEF/IBEP Director

One of the topics we cover in the IBEP course is title "Shot Placement". If you are an experienced bowhunter, this topic probably doesn't get you all that excited. Been there, done that, double lung 'em and they go down. But if you've ever had a high lung shot and then suffered the anguish when you couldn't find it, read on

I have to admit that I've always been a "center of mass" bowhunter. That is, I aim behind the shoulder, center of the deer's chest, and release. It works great – most of the time. And it has the advantage of giving you maximum room for error. If you shoot a bit low, no problem – generally it results in a heart shot, which is a quick, humane kill. But a high shot can – and often does - result in a lost deer.

For several years now I've read debates in various bowhunting magazines on what happens when an arrow is high in a deer's lung area, and why it isn't always fatal. There was one theory that there is a gap between a deer's lungs and the aorta that runs down the underside of the back. The thought was that if you hit that empty space, you could wind up with a non-lethal, very survivable pass through. There was also some discussion that if a deer was exhaling when the arrow passed through, the lungs were reduced in size, and the void space increased. The result would be the same. I've spoken to many experienced bowhunters who have unfortunately had this happen to them – that is, they had what they believed to be a lethal shot in the high lung area, only to be unsuccessful in recovering the deer. I'm convinced it is a real phenomenon.

I've recently seen the magazines take up a common position – make yourself shoot low. Specifically , change your aiming point from "center of mass" to no more than 1/3 of the way up from the bottom of the deer's chest. If you use that as your aiming point, and shoot low, odds are it will be a clean miss. That's an outcome I would choose anytime over wounding and not recovering a deer. On the other hand, if your shot goes a bit high, the odds are that you will still get a double lung shot that will quickly, humanely put the deer down. This strategy will also work in your favor if the deer "jumps the string". As experienced bowhunters know, when this happens the deer is actually dropping down to spring away from the arrow. But if you used the lower 1/3 as your target, the odds are much better that you will get that quick, clean kill shot we all want.

Old habits are indeed hard to break; but if you are a "center of mass" bowhunters, this is one I would strongly encourage you to change.

Where has the year gone? First, we would like to 'thank' Belvoir, Kingsboro, Singers Glen & Sherwood who hosted the State Indoor Sectional; Singers Glen hosting the 3-D Spring Classic and State Open; NORVA hosting the 3-D Fall Classic and Sherwood hosting the State Closed. Although we all had expected the attendance to be up from the 'olden' days, we hope that participation at all shoots, both clubs and State Tournaments, will be better next year.

The clubs who will be hosting the 2014 State Tournaments are: Belvoir, Kingsboro and Sherwood the State Indoors; Sherwood the State Open; Manahoac the 3-D Spring Classic; Kingsboro the 3-D Fall Classic and Singers Glen for the State Closed. Also, there are two new tournament changes that will take place beginning next year: (1) the 3-D Spring Classic, on a trial beginning in 2014 thru 2016, archers will have an option to shoot one or two times and their highest score will count and (2) those that shoot at the Indoor Sectional they will have an option to shoot one or two times, their highest round and their last six ends inside out X's will count.

The clubs who submitted their 2014 shoots will be receiving a 'draft' of the VBA 2014 Schedule shoots from John Honyoust, Field Vice-President in December. We ask that you please make sure that what you submitted is correct and if you want to make any changes and/or additions to let John know prior to the schedules going to the printer.

I would like to 'thank' the Bowhunters of Rockingham who was at the Western Regional Big Game show and Singers Glen Bowbenders at a local County Fair representing the VBA and their clubs.

This year, the VBA had a very nice increase in membership, and we thank you! We continue to ask the clubs to keep getting the word out about the VBA, informing and explaining folks what the VBA does for archers, bowhunters, our archery and bowhunting classes, our bowhunting instructors, supporting and working with the VDGIF, and the benefit shoots you have. This information can be found on the VBA website!



Wally's Venison Roast

- 1- 5-6 lb. venison roast
- 1- tsp. seasoned salt
- 1- tsp. pepper
- 1 large onion, sliced
- 1/4 cup salt
- 1-tsp. garlic powder
- 1-tsp. soy sauce
- 2-TBSP flour
- 1-2 quarts water
- 1/4 cup butter or margarine

Put roast in dutch oven, cover with water, add salt. Cover and let soak for 2 hours. Drain and rinse. Combine seasoned salt, garlic powder and pepper and sprinkle on both sides . Sprinkle with soy sauce. Place onion on top of roast and sprinkle with flour . Put pats of butter on top of onion.

Wrap roast in two layers of foil. Place in roasting pan, add 1 qt. of water cover and bake at 350 degrees for 4-5 hours. Add water if necessary but do not open foil. Carefully open foil. Measure liquid, Combine 1 1/2 TBSP flour and 2 TBSP water for each cup of liquid, stir well. Stir in flour mixture, cook over medium heat, stirring constantly until thickened and bubbly. Serve gravy with roast.

AGENDA ITEM VOTED ON AT SEPTEMBER MEETING; (6) By-laws, State Championship Awards, Sect. J., Pg. 8: Remove paragraph #3, eliminating the unit rule. Effective, Jan., 2014 . **Passed, 29-2.**

AGENDA ITEMS FOR JANUARY MEETING: (1) Shooting Styles, Divisions, Section A, Pg. 12, Change to read, Senior Division, 50 and older, Silver Senior Division, 60 and older, and Master Senior, 70 years and older. This breakdown is for state level shoots and archers can only compete in one division. Any archer may compete in any younger division, if they choose. Justification: As the membership gets older, Prince William would like to see VBA follow NFAA guide lines. This is adding 1 extra division. We have more shooters above 50 than younger. Effective, Jan., 2014. (2) Change the 3-D rules to follow IBO Shooting Rules. Effective, Jan. 1, 2014. Justification: By using the IBO rules for 3-D, we might increase our participation at the State 3-D s, because most 3-D shooters set up their equipment according to those rules. Most VBA clubs currently follow IBO rules for their 3-D shoots. (3) By-laws, Amend Art. 10, Sect. 1, c, pg. 3: VBA charter fees for Commercial/Pro Shops will be \$50.00 per year and a 50% reduction on the cost of Flight ads. Effective, Jan. 2014. Justification: Possibly get Pro Shops to join the VBA and allow them to get the ad size they want. (4) Constitution, Art. 4, Sect. 3, Pg. 2: Add the word adult to the sentence to read; The slate of candidates must be forwarded to each adult member of affiliated clubs. Justification To reduce administrative cost and time and to clarify rule. Effective, Jan., 2014.

TOP 10 “What’s New” Hunting Regs 2013-14

- **Hunter Education**-- As of July 1, 2013, there will no longer be a ten-hour Hunter Education Course in Virginia. There will be a self-study requirement for students, followed by six hours of classroom instruction. The new course should allow students more flexibility in scheduling and will focus on safety, hunting ethics and conservation.
- **Route 29 Line/Amherst County**-- The Route 29 “line” in Amherst County was redefined as: that area east or west of the “line” defined as Business U.S. 29 from the James River to its intersection with U.S. 29 just south of the town of Amherst continuing north on U.S. 29 to the Tye River
- **Bear--? Youth/Apprentice Bear Hunt Day**--? There is a new youth and apprentice bear hunting day. See Youth and Apprentice Bear Hunting Day.
Bear Firearms
 Bear firearms season has been extended by two weeks in the counties (or portions) of Buchanan, Dickenson, Lee, Russell (except on the Channels State Forest and Clinch Mountain WMA), Scott, Washington (northwest of I-81 and west of Route 19), and Wise.
 The 6-day open season in eastern and southside Virginia will open one week earlier.
 The bear firearms season in Augusta (North of US-250), Frederick, Roanoke, Rockingham, and Shenandoah will open on a Monday and not a Saturday
- Bear Hound Training**
 Two weeks of bear hound training season have been established in 30 counties in eastern and southside Virginia in November. See Bear Hound Training/Chase Season.
 Two weeks of bear hound training season have been established in the counties of Brunswick, Greenville, Lunenburg, and Mecklenburg in September. See Bear Hound Training/Chase Season.
- **Deer**
Youth/Apprentice Deer Hunt Day-- Apprentice license holders can deer hunt on the youth deer hunting day. See Youth and Apprentice Deer Hunting Day.
Deer Archery-- Created a late antlerless-only archery deer season in April in Arlington, Fairfax, Loudoun, and Prince William counties.
Deer Muzzleloader-- Reduced the number of late muzzleloader either-sex deer hunting days on private lands in Alleghany, Bath and Highland counties from 6 to 1 (last day).
Deer Firearms
 Established an early antlerless-only firearms deer season in Arlington, Fairfax, Loudoun, and Prince William counties in September. Note: local firearms ordinances prohibit the discharge of firearms in Arlington County and in Fairfax County a special landowner permit is required to firearms deer hunt on private lands. Contact the Div. of Animal Control, 4500 West Ox Road, Fairfax, VA 22030 for details. No special police permit is required for archery deer hunting on private lands in Fairfax County. Local firearms restrictions also apply in Loudoun and Prince William counties (see Local Firearm Ordinances).
 Established a uniform 7-week firearms deer season in Campbell County .
 Removed Fauquier County from the late antlerless-only firearms deer season.
 Reduced firearms either-sex deer hunting days in Accomack, Amelia, Bland (private), Caroline, Chesterfield, Cumberland, Essex, Gloucester, Grayson (public), Henry, King and Queen, King George, Northampton, Nottoway, Patrick, Powhatan, Russell (public), Smyth (public), Spotsylvania, Tazewell (public), and Washington (public).
 Established one firearms either-sex deer hunting day on Chickahominy WMA.
Deer Bag Limits- Established a two deer per day daily bag limit on private lands in Roanoke County.
Earn A Buck (EAB)
 Restricted EAB requirements to individual counties.
 Increased the number of antlerless deer required for EAB in Fairfax, Loudoun, and Prince William counties.
 Removed Franklin, Fauquier, Patrick, and Shenandoah counties from EAB.
Antler Point Restrictions (APR)-- Added Alleghany, Augusta, Bath, Highland, and Rockbridge counties to the APR regulation.

Deer Feeding

Made the feeding of deer and elk illegal year-round in Buchanan, Dickenson, and Wise counties.

Made it illegal to feed deer or elk in any county, city, or town during any deer or elk hunting season.

Established a requirement that all feed be removed from any deer feeding site prior to September 1st.

Established a regulation that makes any area where deer feed has been distributed a “baited” area for 10 days following the complete removal of the food.

Chronic Wasting Disease/Deer Carcass Importation

Prohibited the importation of a deer carcass or part (except boned-out meat, quarters, clean skulls, etc.) from any enclosure in North America intended to confine deer or elk.

Allowed the importation of cleaned skulls, with or without antlers.

• Small Game

The gray and red squirrel season has been lengthened by 1 month. It now runs from the first Saturday in September through the last day of February.

It is now legal to train dogs on squirrels on private lands year-round during daylight hours.

It is now legal to train dogs on rabbits year-round on private lands from ½ hour before sunrise until midnight.

• Turkey

Youth/Apprentice Turkey Hunt Days-- Apprentice license holders can turkey hunt on the youth spring and fall turkey hunting days. See [Youth and Apprentice Fall Turkey Hunting Day](#) and [Youth and Apprentice Spring Turkey Hunting Day](#).

• Furbearers Hunting & Trapping

Otter-- The season limit for otters trapped west of the Blue Ridge Mountains increased from 2 to 4 otters per trapper per year.

• **Trapping**-- It is now unlawful to intentionally set traps within 50 feet of animal carcasses or parts unless the carcasses or parts are completely covered when the trap is set or visited. Completely covered is defined as not being visible from above.

• Public Lands

Doe Creek is the newest wildlife management area. It is 447 acres located bayside in Accomack County. The area has an excellent waterfowl impoundment system and hunting opportunities will be provided through the quota hunt program for waterfowl, archery deer, muzzleloader deer, and spring turkey hunting. Managed hunt opportunities will include: squirrel and woodcock. As the area is further developed, wildlife viewing opportunities will be improved.

Two hundred and sixty acres in James City County has been added to the PALS (Public Access Lands for Sportsmen) program

Elk Restoration Update

ONE YEAR AGO... Elk Release in Buchanan County Made History when Virginia Department of Game & Inland Fisheries (VDGIF) biologists brought 11 elk to Virginia from southeastern Kentucky on May 18, 2012. They returned to Kentucky and brought another 7 elk to Virginia on May 24th placing them near Vansant in Buchanan County. Once in Virginia, the elk were placed in an acclimation corral before being soft released into their new habitat. All adult elk wore new GPS telemetry collars so that biologists could monitor their movements following release. The Elk Restoration Project is the result of a long term partnership between VDGIF, Rocky Mountain Elk Foundation, Kentucky Department and Fish and Wildlife Resources, and Buchanan County.

June 2013 Update: Allen Boynton, VDGIF Terrestrial Wildlife Biologist Manager for Region 3 - Southwest notes that, “The transport and release of ten elk - 8 yearling bulls and two pregnant cows was successful with the elk being released from the acclimation corral June 6th. The elk already released in May of 2012 are all alive and within 3-miles of the release site in Buchanan County.

August 2013 Update: Elk project staff and volunteers report that all elk released this year remain nearby the release site and have comingled with the elk released in 2012. A minimum of 10 calves born this year have brought the herd to at least 44 elk. The bulls are losing velvet at the end of August and the rut will soon begin

in early September. Volunteers with the Southwest Virginia Coalfields Chapter of the Rocky Mountain Elk Foundation have completed about 145-acres of habitat enhancements. These food plots are a critical part of the restoration project because they help to hold elk on the area and promote successful reproduction

VDGIF NAME CHANGE

The Department of Game and Inland Fisheries is currently considering the development of legislation for the 2014 General Assembly. As a part of the legislative development process, we wish to receive feedback from a sample of our constituents and potentially affected stakeholders on potential bills. Receiving feedback does not mean that a legislative proposal necessarily will be advanced; however, it is helpful to us in determining which proposals to advance for consideration. Attached you will find draft legislation related to a change to the Department's name. As currently constructed, this proposal would rename the Department as the "Department of Wildlife Resources". This would more closely align the agency with other similar agencies across the country and hopefully promote greater name recognition among the public across the state. Many of Virginia's citizens today are confused by the agency's current name and do not readily recognize its responsibilities from it. This proposal would seek to avoid that confusion. Again, this is simply a concept that we are interested in receiving feedback on at this time. Whether this change will be formally proposed is a decision that will be made in the future based on many factors, including input that we receive. We would appreciate any feedback that your organization would like to provide on this proposal. To ensure timely consideration, we would request any response that you might have by next Thursday, September 5. Of course, if this or any other potential legislation is to advance in the future, there will also be many opportunities for continued discussion. Another Way to Say "Thank You"

The VBA has a special award – the Order of the Golden Feather (OGF) – that recognizes significant contribution to the VBA over an extended period at the state and national level. However, there are many individuals in clubs who have given unselfishly of their time and talents toward the betterment of archery at the local club or VBA region level. Their contributions may not rise to the level for recognition by the OGF, but they certainly need to be acknowledged. What can be done to honor those individuals?

As you might suspect, some clubs have developed their own awards to pay homage to those who have excelled in the local area. This article outlines some of the awards without naming the club because the point is to encourage other clubs to develop similar recognition and perhaps even have each VBA Region establish an award that would be given to individuals who helped multiple clubs in a region.

An obvious step in establishing an award is to give it a name. The name can be something generic, e.g. Lifetime Achievement Award, Excellence Award or Meritorious Service Award. It can also be something with a more targeted name, e.g. Straight Arrow Award, Order of the Longbow Award, Range Rover Award or Silver Quiver Award. The key point is that it have a name that is meaningful to the club or region that is presenting the award.

After selecting a name, the next step is to establish criteria that someone must meet to be eligible for the award. The criteria are up to the awarding group, but it should include requirements that ensure the recipient is recognized as having provided service above and beyond what can be expected.

For example, the award could include all or some of the topics mentioned below in addition to other topics deemed important. There is also nothing wrong with the establishment of two awards using these and other requirements!

Possess the virtues of sportsmanship, character, morals, integrity and friendship.

Render outstanding services to archery and/or to Club XYZ or VBA Region X.

Be a member in good standing of the VBA and a VBA club when recommended.

Have a minimum of five consecutive years of VBA club membership prior to recommendation.

Be recommended by a member (or specific number of members) in good standing with a VBA club.

Naturally there will also need to be developed rules regarding nomination (for example be submitted by a specific date, be submitted to a specific person and be in a certain format that might have required elements – such as details about accomplishments). In a like manner, there will need to be rules regarding the approval process (who is on the approval committee, how many votes are required, etc).

Finally, there is the award itself. It can take the form a patch, pin, certificate, plaque, name on a plaque that hangs on a wall or any combination of these and other possibilities.

Saying "THANK YOU" to individuals who contribute to the VBA is always a good thing. Creating a formal way to recognize achievement is just another way to express our appreciation to those who go the extra mile.




