

## INTERNATIONAL ROUND

On March 23 the Manahoac Bowmen held their tenth annual Totem Pole Tournament consisting of 14 field, 14 hunter and 20 national targets.

This was the first time such a combination of rounds could legally be held. The field unit and hunter unit were legalized this February at the N.F.A.A. meeting in Kansas City.

The International round was adapted last year by N.F.A.A. and has become very popular in the Mid-West and North West section of the country. In some sections it has replaced the field round as the standard competitive round.

The International Round consists of two 10 target units. There are no targets placed on the rabbit, 15, 45 walk-up or the 80 yd. walk-up butts. The 20, 25, and 30 yard field targets are replaced with 14 inch targets. The 35, 40, 45 and 50 yard targets are replaced with 22 inch targets. The 55, 60 and 65 yard targets are replaced with 30 inch targets.

The scoring is slightly different in that there are three scoring rings of 5, 4, and 3 point value and only three arrows are shot per target. The faces are black with white aiming spot and appear to be very similar to hunter round faces.

The round was handicapped by using 50% of the field round handicap added to the raw score. This method was easy to work with and turned out to be very fair.

The tournament winners were those archers who's combined morning and afternoon rounds, plus their normal handicap for the morning round, plus 50% of the morning's handicap, to handicap the afternoon round.

All adult archers who registered were eligible for both handicap and scratch awards. The method was to simply take the highest bare bow and free style archers out of the handicap list and award them trophies as scratch winners.

The remaining archers were handicapped into four flights and the winners of each flight awarded trophies.

After the tournament many archers commented to the tournament officials that the new combination of rounds were the best yet and were both enjoyable and competitive.

### (EDITOR'S NOTE)

At the last V.B.A. meeting, a motion was put on the floor to have the International Round at the next Va. State Shoot instead of the Animal Round. There has not, as of this writing, been a fair way to score the Animal Round where the handicap system is used.

The next V.B.A. meeting will be held at Richmond. At nights after the Mid-Atlantic Tournament, be there with your Directors.

# 1ST VA. AM. CHAMP. & INTL. & OLYMPIC TRYOUT TOURNAMENT

MAY 10 & 11, 1969

...In the color, form and movement of wild birds, animals and fish, nature provides one of her most beautiful creations.

The first Virginia Amateur Championship and International and Olympic Tryouts Tournament will be held May 10 and 11 at Cub Run Archers, Centreville, Va. The opening ceremonies will begin at 10 A.M. followed by the FITA round. On Saturday, men will shoot 90 meters (98 yd. 1 ft. 3 in.) and 70 meters (76 yd. 1 ft. 8 in.). Women will shoot 70 meters (76 yd. 1 ft. 8 in.) and 60 meters (65 yd. 1 ft. 10 in.). This is at a 48 inch diameter face. On Sunday, both men and women will shoot 50 (54 yd. 2 ft. 1 in.) and 30 meters (32 yd. 2 ft. 5 in.). This is at a 31.5 inch diameter face. Archers will shoot 36 arrows each at these distances for a total of 144 arrows, scoring rings valued from ten down to one. 1440 is a perfect score. A score of 1175 is considered excellent.

### BAREBOW

There will be no attachments at all except for arrow rest and knocking point. Due to limited space, we have listed the main rules that will apply to this type of tournament.

### AWARDS

1. Special award to top man and top woman archer in the tournament.
2. Three (3) places for each of the following classes:  
Men and Women - Barebow  
Men and Women - Freestyle  
Junior Boys and Girls - Barebow
3. Medallions will be awarded to all archers shooting minimum score qualifications in the tryouts.

### REGISTRATION

Advance registration is requested, but due to the time element, registration will be held open until Friday, May 9th at 9:00 P.M. The tournament fee is \$4.00 adults and \$2.00 juniors. Advance registration can be sent to Frank M. Lee, 1201 Tuckahoe St., Falls Church, Va. Make checks payable to the Cub Run Archers. Proceeds from the tournament will go into a travel fund.

### DIRECTIONS

Cub Run Archers is located at the Arlington-Fairfax Chapter of the Izaak Walton League in Centreville, Va., between Rt. 28 and Interstate 66. It can be reached by taking Int. 66 to the Centreville and Dulles Airport exit and turning South on Rt. 28. Go approximately 4 miles and follow signs.

### RULES governing the tournament.

1. The tournament will be held under International rules.
2. You **DO NOT** have to be an N.A.A. member.
3. You must be a V.B.A. member.
4. All archers must sign an amateur pledge.
5. All archers must wear white.
6. Club names and emblems are allowed, but there will be **NO** advertising.
7. Registration closes at 9:00 P.M. on May 9th.

### EQUIPMENT

#### FREE STYLE

1. You are only allowed one string attachment, not to exceed one centimeter, in addition to your knocking point.
2. There will be no prisms or optic sights.
3. There will be no string peeps.
4. Stabilizers are allowed but must not exceed the length of the archer's arrow.





Registration will be open until 9 A.M. Silver Trophies will be awarded in all flights with the number of places determined to some extent by the number of participants.
