

Subject: VBA State Closed Tournament

To open, let me say that I am new to archery as a sport; I have only been actively involved since this spring. My wife and I have enjoyed the help and encouragement of members at the several clubs we have shot at this season.

We both participated in the state closed tournament recently for the challenge of where we sized up to shooters in our classes. We enjoyed ourselves immensely and look forward to next year's tournament.

Last weekend at our club's annual shoot, I met several shooters who mentioned to me that the VBA Regulations were not followed at the state tournament.

My question is this: If a shooter shoots a score above his class on the first day of the tournament, is his class re-evaluated for the second day?

If this is true, there was a great injustice done to the shooters in "BHFS-L'B", as far as I see it. I am not looking for a trophy; but if the VBA rules were not followed, I would like to see the scores and placings in "Flight" reflect the *true* winners in my class (as well as any others which weren't re-classified).

To sum up, let me say if we don't promote honesty and fair play in tournaments, how can we expect to encourage new shooters to participate?

I would appreciate a response by letter or phone as to the VBA rules to the question at hand.

Mr. Macheski:

I am very happy to hear that you are enjoying tournament archery in the state of Virginia. The sport needs more people with your level of interest.

I have, as of December 1, 1986 received a letter you sent to Nancy Lee Western. In this letter you mentioned that several shooters thought that VBA regulations were not followed. This is of great interest to me, as the Field Vice President of the VBA. There were a few questions raised and brought to my attention at the State Closed. These questions were answered by me or another VBA officer present.

All rules and regulations as stipulated in the NFAA handbook, the VBA Constitution and By-laws, and the State Closed contract were complied with. If there are other questions, they should be directed to my office.

The one specific question you raise in your letter concerning a shooter who shoots a score above his class on first day of the tournament: Is his class "Re-evaluated" for the second day? Answer: NO!

Archers will not be re-classified at the State Open or Closed Tournaments. This ruling came about through the regular June, 1986 meeting #119 of the VBA Directors from all clubs.

Your club's Director may or may not have voted on this, I have no way of knowing since I do not know what club you belong to. Your Director should have informed you through your club as to this change.

In the future, when you attend a State Shoot and you have questions, do not hesitate to bring them to my attention.

The scores and standings published in "Flight" do indeed reflect the true winners in all classes.

If you feel this ruling or others are in need of change, bring the change to the attention of your club and have your Director bring their recommendation in the form of a motion to the VBA meeting. It is my duty as the Field Vice President, as a tournament archer, and as an archer who loves his sport to promote honesty and fairplay. Without the influx of new archers, our sport suffers. As long as I am the Field Vice President, I will do my best to see that the rules and regulations set forth in the NFAA handbook, the VBA Constitution and By-laws, and the State contracts will be followed to the letter.

That means there are a lot of bowhunters taking to the field that are probably ill-equipped and under educated to the pitfalls and dangers of our sport. I must praise the outstanding work our Instructors have done over the past years. It has been exceptional, but our numbers are too few to tackle the task at hand. We need many more certified, willing, and competent Instructors to meet the demands of our fast growing sport.

If you are interested in becoming a Bowhunter Education Instructor we will be offering the Instructor training course on the Sat. of the March VBA meeting, that is Saturday, March 28, 1987 at the Mt. Vernon Motel Charlottesville, Va. There are some qualifications you must meet before becoming an instructor, they are:

- 1) Be 18 years of age.
- 2) Have a background which relates to bowhunting; with big game hunting experience.
- 3) Have completed high school or its equivalent.
- 4) Be free from criminal, fish, and wildlife law offenses.
- 5) Have completed the basic six hour bowhunter education course.

Pre-registration is mandatory so we may properly prepare for the course. If you are interested and willing to work hard without much thanks, at giving back to bowhunting some of what you have received, then you are the instructor we need. 
I would appreciate your vote so I can continue to promote target archery and bowhunting in our state by serving as Recording Secretary at the state level.







For You The Archer

This is the first installment of a column I hope to include in each Flight. I hope to make this column enjoyable and informative to all archers, and I plan to include tuning tips, safety tips, and any enjoyable tidbits I can find. My problem is that I am no expert or writer so as you can see I need your help to make this thing work. To make this column fresh and exciting I need your stories, questions, answers, comments, or tidbits sent to the address at the end of this article.

Tips to Tune By:

Probably the most important factor for good shooting and consistent accuracy is the selection of the proper arrow shaft for your shooting style and needs. In shaft selection one of the most important yet most misunderstood factors is arrow spine. For this writing we will only look at how to choose the right spined shaft for you.

Easton Archery define the spine (stiffness) of an arrow shaft as "the measured deflection, in inches of the shaft when depress by a 879.7 gram weight at its center." This means that arrows of different sizes have different stiffnesses or different spines, so depending on the bow weight being shot an arrow will bend differing amounts upon release. What we are looking for is an arrow that will bend the proper amount to absorb shock of the bow and counteract the various forces that come into play when an arrow is shot. When the proper spined arrow is found we will have a set up that is more forgiving, that is, proper spine will help eliminate wobble when the arrow leaves the bow giving you better accuracy.

Now that we think we know what spine is, and what it does, what factors must we take into consideration in determining the right shaft for us?

The most obvious factors are the type of bow used (compound, recurve, or cam) and the peak weight or holding weight of the bow. Another important factor is the length of your arrow shaft. You may be shooting a 30 inch shaft with good flight and accuracy and for some reason you decide to cut one inch off and all of a sudden you can't get the arrow to fly, the reason for this is that as you shorten an arrows length you increase the arrows spine (make it stiffer), even if you have not changed the arrow's size.

The next factor we are going to look at is arrow size. We will only be looking aluminum shafts since they are the most common shaft in use today. Most aluminum shafts are marked with their size, the size is a series of numbers located at

the top 1/3 of the shaft. A shaft marked 2018 means it has a diameter of 20/64 and a wall thickness of 18/1000 so a 2117 is 21/64 diameter and 17/1000 wall thickness and so on. Okay, what do these numbers have to do with spine? Wall thickness gives a shaft weight, and diameter gives it rigidity. Spine is more affected by length and diameter as a shaft than it is by its weight or wall thickness.

We now see we could have shafts of basically the same weight with different spines, or we could use diameter to keep spine consistent and shoot a lighter shaft for increased speed.

Now lets find the proper shaft for our needs. We first go to a spine chart or arrow selection chart, these charts can be found in most archery supply catalogs or your local archery shop, and locate the shaft recommended for our draw weight and arrow length. After locating the recommended shaft we should experiment with shafts of lighter and heavier spine to find the shaft that groups best for your set-up. I usually do this testing by taking 3 to 4 arrows of the 3 spines I want to experiment with and shoot them at 20, 40 and 60 yards. I then measure each 3 or 4 arrow groups of the same spine with a tape measure at each distance. When I do this test, I am not concerned about the arrows hitting the center of the target only how well they group. The reason I am not concerned about center shot is that arrows of lighter spine impact to the right of center and heavier spined arrows impact left.

After we have shot and measured a minimum of three sets we add the measurements for each spine together. Low score wins, the shaft with the smallest total measurement has grouped best over the three distances and will probably be the most forgiving over different distances and uses.

A few things to remember are:

- 1) A slightly heavier spine will usually group better and be more forgiving;
- 2) When you change points, inserts, or broadheads you will change the arrows spine and;
- 3) Don't be afraid to experiment to find the best shaft for your needs.

Safety Tips:

With the tournament season upon us, here are some safety tips reprinted from the "Field Archer's Safety Code" by Ken Simons:

1) Always call "timber" before starting to shoot as warning to others who may not have cleared the shooting line or target area.

2) Always leave one member of your party standing in front of the target while you are looking for lost arrows as warning to others following on the

course. If you are alone, leave your bow.

3) Never release an arrow when you cannot see where it will land; never "flight shoot" an arrow in the woods. Never shoot straight up.

4) Never shoot a broken arrow. Inspect each arrow carefully as you retrieve it.

5) Always have your arrows marked with your name and address.

6) Remember at all times a bow and arrow is a deadly weapon, as dangerous as a gun in the hands of an irresponsible person.

7) Never attempt to demonstrate your skill by using a person as a target, or permitting another to hold the object at which you shoot.

8) Never brace another's bow without his permission, and never draw it under any circumstances.

9) Protect your sport by being careful and sure when you shoot.

Bowhunter Safety:

With spring turkey season almost here remember more hunting accidents occur while turkey hunting than any other kind of hunting. Please be safe, if you use a decoy don't take it into the woods unless it is covered, hunters have been injured while carrying a decoy into the woods uncovered.

Another tip the game commission gave me, is to use florescent trail marking tape and tie it around some trees near your tree stand or ground blind to let other hunters know you are in the area.


