

Sorry, Bob, that you and the others didn't get a chance to see my 'camping buddy'! It drew much interest from our visitors and I hope it did the same at the Fishersville show! I would like to thank Paul Vogle for displaying his deer mounts and the various videos we showed on Elk, Deer and Bear hunting which drew a lot of attention. Although the number of visitors we had at both shows was down, we still had folks interested in archery, what VBA is all about, the clubs in their area and who to contact for more information. Many were aware of the funds that were being cut from the Virginia Department of Game and Inland Fisheries, but not everyone knew that VBA played a major role in their support and what we do for all bowhunters. Some had heard of and inquired about the passing of David Horne, founder and Director of Virginia's Hunters for the Hungry program.

Since Bob Seltzer's article in the Winter 1998 issue of *Flight* regarding the increase in VBA membership we have seen membership slowly increasing. But, folks, let's not let up on our efforts in promoting VBA! We must continue to have booth shows, distribute the VBA pamphlets, and contact and work with our local schools, churches and other non-profit organizations. Conduct archery classes, participate in community events; and work with the VDGIF. We need to show and encourage folks what they have been missing in this archery sport and "What VBA Can Do For You!"

A big round of applause to Augusta Archers and their volunteers who hosted the Mid-Atlantic. Without those volunteers it wouldn't have worked as well as it did. From reports, we had 86 who participated at the VBA Indoor and approximately 60 at the Mids. Many

Prior to the booth shows, Paul Vogel, along with Bob Seltzer and Kevin Cobb, conducted the first National Field Archery Association (NFAA) Level I Certified Instructors course at Ft. Belvoir. Eleven proud participants received their certificates at the end of the course. Paul has arranged for Bernie Pellerite to hold an NFAA Shooter's School at Ft. Belvoir the weekend of June 28th. Thanks to Lloyd Overfelt, we now have a VBA e-mail/fax point of contact (POC) list. This will be very useful in keeping the club officers and delegates informed of important information, notices and events from the VBA officers or each other.







IN THE KITCHEN WITH WINNIE & WALLY

Ragout of Venison Catalan



5 lbs. venison forequarter, cut in
1½ inch cubes
1½ cups pitted prunes
1 cup Greek olives in brine, drained
1 (7 oz.) roasted red peppers, drained
and chopped
1/3 cup red wine vinegar
1/3 cup safflower oil
1 (3½ oz.) jar capers with liquid
3 Tbsp. garlic, minced
3 Tbsp. dried oregano, crumbled
1 Tbsp. pure ground hot chili powder

2 tomatoes, peeled and diced
1 cup dry white wine
1/2 cup dark brown sugar, firmly
packed
1/2 cup (or more) concentrated
beef broth
2 Tbsp. red wine vinegar
2 Tbsp. water
2 Tbsp. all-purpose flour
fresh cilantro or parsley, chopped
saffron rice

Mix first 10 ingredients in large non-aluminum bowl. Cover and refrigerate overnight, turning occasionally. Preheat oven to 325 degrees. Transfer venison mixture to large Dutch oven. Mix in tomatoes, wine, sugar and 1/2 cup broth. Bring to a boil over high heat. Cover and bake for 45 minutes, adding more broth if necessary to keep venison just covered. Uncover pan and cook until venison is tender, about 15 minutes. Cool to room temperature. Cover and refrigerate overnight. Lift grease from the top of the cold stew. Bring stew to a boil over medium heat. In a small bowl, gradually add 2 Tbsp. vinegar and 2 Tbsp. water to flour to form a paste. Gradually stir flour paste into stew. Reduce heat and simmer until sauce thickens slightly, stirring frequently, about 5 minutes. Top with cilantro or parsley and serve with saffron rice. Serves 12.




